The patient was suffering from Epigastric Pain and pale in appearance. After the patient's needs were attended, the patient was brought to GFNDy Memorial Hospital.



Team responded to a Medical Incident happened at District 1, Gamu, Isabela last August 11, 2020. Upon the aider's assessments, it was found out that the patient recently undergone prostrate operation and complaining the pain in the affected area. Upon immediate interventions, the patient was brought to GFNDy Memorial Hospital.



Team responded to a Trauma Incident (Vehicular Incident) happened at Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Isabela involving a Tricycle and a sedan car last August 5, 2020. The patient suffered a laceration at the right part of the forehand. After immediate interventions the patient was brought to GFNDy Memorial Hospital.



Team responded to a Trauma Incident (Vehicular Incident) happened at Mabini, Gamu, Isabela involving a single motorcycle last August 22, 2020. The patient happened to be driving under the influence of alcohol (DUI) and suffered swelling from the chest, possible detached clavicular notch and abrasion at the right knee. After the Aiders interventions the patient was brought to GFNDy Memorial Hospital.






