The orientation was conducted to support the members of the Local Task Force – Criss Communications Cluster in enhancing their communication preparedness and response capacity to discourse vaccine safety concerns. The PDRRM Officer attended the orientation via video teleconference.

Conventionally, PAG-ASA DOST, Climate Meteorologist Mr. Ramil B. Tuppil discussed the weather outlook for next few months and Engr. Carlo C. Ablan, Division Manager, NIA-MARIIS Dam and Reservoir Division presented the Magat Dam Reservior updates. Medical Incident at Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Isabela responded by the DART 831 last May 25, 2021. The patient experienced difficulty of breathing and chest pain with history of heart problem. After the patient needs was addressed by DART 831 Rescuers, the patient was endorsed to GFNDy Sr. Memorial Hospital.



Team responded to a Medical Incident at Centro, Cabagan, Isabela last May 30, 2021. The Emergency Care Assistants assessed that the patient was weak in appearance, unable to move left arm and left leg, has slurred speech and hypogastric pain with tenderness and with history of Diabetes Melitus and Stroke. After immediate intervention, the patient was brought to Cagayan United Doctors Medical Center for proper disposition.





Team responded to a Trauma Incident (Vehicular Incident) at Malalam, City of Ilagan, Isabela last May 10, 2021 involving a motorcycle self-accident. The patient was unconscious, had a racoon eye and blood in the ear and suffered a laceration at the head and abrasion at the right arm and leg and happened to be under the influence of alcohol. After immediate intervention, the patient was brought to GFNDy Sr. Memorial Hospital.





Team responded to a Trauma Incident (Hacking Incident) last May 29, 2021 at Linglingay, Gamu, Isabela. The patient had a severe bleeding, had multiple laceration and had possible fracture at the left arm. After the Emergency Care Assistants (ECA) interventions, the patient was immediately brought to Isabela GFNDy Sr. Memorial Hospital for proper disposition.





Provided Medical Evacuation (MEDEVAC) to a child patient with Brain Tumor last May 28, 2021. The patient was later transferred from St. Paul Hospital, Tuguegarao City, Cagayan to Baguio General Hospital and Medical Center in Baguio City.









The Office continuously conducts daily disinfection and thorough cleaning of work places, most especially ambulances and other office vehicles as well as the rescuers themselves after an emergency response to prevent the spread of the virus.









In compliance with Memorandum No. 77 of the Provincial Governor, the PDRRMO personnel are religiously conducting daily disinfection to all offices within the Capitol building and compound as preventive measure against COVID-19.


