**THE PROVINCIAL BOARDS
OF ISABELA**

In 1570, the *encomienda* was introduced in the Philippines when *adelantado* Miguel Lopez de Legaspi, in compliance with the decree issued by King Philip II in 1558, distributed lands in Cebu to loyal Spanish subjects who helped conquer the Philippine archipelago. The *encomienda* was not actually a land grant but was a favor from the king under which the Spaniard receiving his favor was given the right to collect *tributo* or taxes from the inhabitants of the area assigned to him. The man who received this favor was called an *encomendero*. The *encomienda* was, therefore, a public office. Later on areas which were organized and given the designation of *provincia* (province) were led by an appointed *alcalde mayor* who performed judicial, fiscal and executive functions. This system of government lasted for almost three hundred years until 1886 when a *gobernador* (governor) was first appointed in each of the eighteen existing provinces including Isabela, relegating the *alcalde* to carry out only judicial functions.

American rule brought radical changes to the system of local government in the country. In 1901 the Philippine Commission enacted Act No. 83, known as the Provincial Government Act, which outlined the powers, responsibilities and composition of the provincial government. Each regularly organized province was provided a Provincial Board composed of three provincial officials: the governor, the treasurer, and a "third member" (*tercero vocal*) who in most cases was known as the supervisor. The first governor of Isabela upon the institutionalization of the American civil government was the Hon. William H. Johnston.

The governor, in regularly organized provinces under civilian control, were initially elected by municipal vice-presidents and councilors within the province through a convention held in the provincial capital every even-numbered year. As civil government took hold, the governorship was made elective. The first governor to be elected is the Hon. Francisco Dichoso of Ilagan.

In 1912, the composition of provincial boards were also modified with the treasurer and "third member" taken out and replaced by two members elected by popular vote. Hon. Manuel Perez and Hon. Gabriel Maramag were the first two members elected during the second term of Governor Thomas Gollayan.

During the Japanese Occupation of the Philippines (1942-1945), the provincial board was appointed by the Japanese Military Administration. After Liberation, Presidents Sergio Osmeña and Manuel Roxas appointed the provincial boards of the country which included the governor until the regular local elections were held in 1947.

The passage of Republic Act No. 2264 (Local Autonomy Act) on June 19, 1959 not only granted greater autonomy to local governments, but also expanded the composition of the Provincial Board by creating a new elective office, the vice-governorship, as well as providing for provinces of the first, second and third income class to have one additional elected board member. Isabela's first vice governor was the Hon. Rodolfo B. Albano, Jr.

On November 14, 1975, by virtue of Presidential Decree No. 826 issued by President Ferdinand Marcos, all existing governing boards and councils in each province, city and municipality were renamed "Sangguniang Bayan". The province-level Sangguniang Bayan, later given the name Sangguniang Panlalawigan, commonly abbreviated to SP, consisted of all the incumbent provincial board members (including the governor and vice-governor), plus a representative from each municipality within the province, and the

provincial president of the Katipunan ng mga Kabataang Barangay or Association of Barangay Youth. The first KB President in the SP was the Hon. Rodolfo T. Albano III.

On December 22, 1979, Batas Pambansa Bilang 5, standardized the composition of all provincial legislatures by reducing the membership of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan. All provinces were entitled to six elective SP members, unless they had more than one million residents (8 members) or less than 100,000 residents (4 members). Direct municipal representation was eliminated, and in its place was indirect "grassroots" representation through the president of the provincial association of barangay chairmen (later known as ABC, then Filipinized to LNB – Liga ng mga Barangay) who was appointed by the President, who also happened to be the Prime Minister. The first ABC President was the Hon. Wilfrido T. Dayrit of Cabatuan. Other members of the new Sanggunian were the governor and the vice governor, both elected by popular vote, and the president of the provincial federation of the Kabataang Barangay which was appointed by the President/Prime Minister.

The Sangguniang Panlalawigan was retained as the legislative branch of all provincial governments under the 1987 Constitution and the Local Government Code of 1991. However, unlike the old Provincial Boards or the pre-1992 Sanggunian, which included in their memberships provincial executives, under current laws the governor is not considered as a Sanggunian member (although he or she retains the power to veto SP legislation, which can still be overridden by a two-thirds vote of all voting members), and the vice-governor, who has now become the presiding officer, only participates in breaking ties in voting. Since 1992, SP members were elected from districts to ensure geographical representation, and the size of the province's Sanggunian was dependent on its income classification rather than population.

Furthermore, Section 508 of the Code also provides: "The duly elected president of the provincial federation of sanggunian members of component cities and municipalities shall be an ex-officio member of the sanggunian panlalawigan concerned..." The first Philippine Councilors League (PCL) federation president of Isabela was the Hon. Cecilio L. Bartolome of Cauayan.

Moreover, Section 41 (c) also provides: "In addition thereto, there shall be one sectoral representative from the women, one from the workers, and one from any of the following sectors: the urban poor, indigenous cultural communities, disabled persons, or any other sector as may be determined by the sanggunian concerned within ninety days prior to the holding of the next local elections, as may be provided for by law." The first sectoral for women was the Hon. Vilinda J. Bernardo of Cabatuan; for agriculture was the Hon. Jonathan Jose C. Calderon of Roxas; and for indigenous cultural communities was the Hon. Marcelino I. Espiritu of San Mariano.

On May 5, 1994, by virtue of Republic Act 7720 signed by President Fidel V. Ramos, the Municipality of Santiago was pronounced as an independent component city. In the local elections of 1995, Santiago did not vote for the first time for provincial-level positions.
