B. Hybridization & Plant Now Pay Later (PNPL) Program

DA-PLGU collaborative program. Provision of hybrid seed assistance to farmers organization/association under a Grant Recovery Roll-over scheme

Issued withdrawal slip of hybrid seeds for the dry cropping season in twenty municipalities with 39,542 hectares area involved. Also monitored the distribution of seeds by the organization to its farmer members.

C. Seed Production

DA collaborative seed production project for buffer seed stocking

A total of 81,524.5 bags of certified seeds were harvested from the 1,087.89 hectares planted to registered seeds wherein the 49,723 bags were submitted for analysis and certification . A total of 4,237bags of registered seeds were produced from 67.69 hectares planted to foundation where 2,434 bags were submitted to Bureau of Plant Industry (BPI) for analysis

D. Organic Fertilizer Production (Community Based Composting Facility)

DA-BSWM collaborative project involving the promotion of organic fertilizer production through the provision of composting facility to qualified farmers organization/association at the village level

Under this program, the office provided technical assistance to 4 farmer organizations and 72 individuals who were able to produced 1,242 bags organic fertilizer.
