



b. Cassava		The province obtained for the CY 2022 a total volume of production of <u>19,088.92</u> metric tons with an average yield of <u>13.51</u> MT per hectare with a total area of <u>1,412.94</u> <u>ha.</u> composed of 12 municipalities in the province.

B. Monitoring of Price of Corn	Average Prevailing Market Price per kilogram of corn in the province commercial trading centers.	The office continuously monitored the buying price per kilo of corn from various trading centers in the province. For this year, report gathered showed Php 18.80 (dry) average buying price per kilo of corn compared to CY 2021 of Php 15.20 a difference of Php 3.05 or greater by 20.06 % . The gradual increase of price started from (September , 2022 - 19.17) and onwards (November 2022 - 20.25) although on December 2022 price was slightly down at Php19.96 per kilo of corn. Generally historic rises in the price of corn were due to short production caused by calamities during Wet Cropping Season 2022 and high costs of farm inputs.

		In San Guillermo, Isabela, during the 2021 Wet Cropping Season, an estimated total harvest of 7,456 kg/ha applied with Natural fertilizer (AMO) while 3,256 kg/ha was under Farmer's Practice (w/o AMO). For San Mariano, Isabela in the same season, 4,754 kg/ha was the estimated total harvest applied with AMO although for Farmer's Practice was 4,125 kg/ha .
		Dry Crop Season 2021-2022, SCoPSA site in San Guillermo, Isabela gathered total estimated harvest based on crop cut was 6,769 kg/ha applied with Natural Fertilizer (AMO) while only 5,078 kg/ha for none AMO application. During this season, San Mariano, Isabela had total estimated harvest of 8,981 kg/ha applied with AMO although for Farmer's Practice had only estimated harvest gathered of 7,969 kg/ha .
		It is worth to consider said result, application of Natural Fertilizer (AMO) or a Yield Booster increase yield and eventually can help contribute additional income, this assessment has proven its yield increase performances using natural fertilizer to crops.

b. Demonstration on High Innovative Technology (HIT)	Technology Demonstration showcasing Double Row Planting Method, using Jabber Planter, BCAs, BIO-N and Package of Technology on Corn Production.	<image/>
		 During Wet Season 2022 under Season I project implementation of the Technology Demonstration on High Innovative Technology (HIT) on corn production was established at Brgy. Limbauan, San Pablo, Isabela. About 9,840 kg/ha estimated total harvest was obtained based on crop cut for a hectare of HIT Demo, while 6,600 kg/ha gathered harvest for Farmer's Practice. The HIT project performed an increase of 3,240 kg/ha or 49.09% yield increased against the Farmer's Practice. Some factors contributed the increase was the population density provided by the double row planting technique which attained range from 80,000 to 85,000 hills per hectare and among other innovative technologies being introduced in the project.
c. Seasonlong on- site Farmers Field School (FFS)	The Farmers Field School or FFS approach is an innovative, participatory and interactive learning approach that	

	emphasizes problem solving and discovery based learning. It is also a time bound activity (generally one agricultural production cycle or a year), involving a group of farmers facilitated by extension workers.	<image/>
		The Farmers Field School (FFS) Season 3 project was able to graduate 60 corn farmer- participants during the culminating activity on November 4, 9 and 11, 2022 in Brgys. Limbauan, San Pablo, San Francisco Norte, San Guillermo and San Pedro, San Mariano, Isabela, respectively. Attended by LGU officials, OPA Corn Staffs led by PAgri Marites E. Frogoso, DA-CVRC/Soils Lab, OMA staffs, Seed Company (Syngenta), Brgy. Officials, FCAs Officers and farmer-members and invited corn farmers from hilly areas. The farmer-graduates were trained to conduct weekly AESA monitoring, through this basic scientific approaches in care and management of the corn plants where their decision making skills after thorough analysis of the whole ecosystem and its components were enhanced and made them become farmer-expert.

In the BFP strategies, one important component is the rejuvenation technique that was applied to the trees. The technology has revived even the 22-year old citrus trees and are now producing again some 500 to 800 fruits per tree in one fruiting season
