Conducted validation of the reported crop damages due to Rice Blast and Brown Plant Hoppers (BPH). There were 13 municipalities that reported and a total of 771 ha affected with 5-10% infestation as validated.





Conducted orientation of the installation and delivery of light traps in the different municipalities of the six congressional Districts of Isabela. **92 sets of Light Traps** were delivered with good condition. This project was initiated by the Provincial Government of Isabela and implemented by the Office of the Provincial Agriculturist (OPA). These implements were used to determine the presence and collection of insect pests such as Rice Black Bug (RBB) to control the spreading and infestation.

For this year, report gathered showed Php18.80 (dry) average buying price per kilo of corn compared to CY 2021 of Php15.20 a difference of Php3.05 or greater by 20.06 % . The gradual increase of price started from (September, 2022 - 19.17) and onwards (November 2022 - 20.25) although on December 2022 price was slightly down at Php19.96 per kilo of corn.
