



## 2020 ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT

### I. Executive Summary

The year 2020 is a challenging year. The COVID-19 pandemic has redefined the set-up of operations and its implications is far reaching affecting institutions, organizations, and individuals. This pandemic has given birth to what we now call the “new normal” and it influenced alterations on how we proceed with our practices.

Despite the disruption of operations and the halting of activities of businesses, institutions, organizations around the world, governments have been prompt to provide the most needed services to assist individuals cope up with the new normal.

The province of Isabela, through the leadership of Hon. Governor Rodito T. Albano III and Hon. Vice Governor Faustino G. Dy III, has initiated programs that would address the situation. Particularly, through the Provincial Cooperatives Development Office (PCDO), among other offices and agencies, the provincial government provided support to the most affected sectors in individuals whose livelihood were forced to lay-low or ceased to operate, business establishments, cooperatives, associations, enterprises, transport group, among others.

The PCDO, as the provincial government’s premier technical and social services support arm, implemented and facilitated several programs that coincides with the policy thrust and directions of the Albano-Dy Administration, one of which is to INVEST IN PEOPLE.

Exemplifying the value of “cooperativism” especially in times of pandemic, the PGI partnered with the Department of Labor and Employment, Department of Trade and Industry, Department of Agriculture, among other agencies and stakeholders, in mitigating the effects of the pandemic to the people and the local economy.

Our major accomplishments include, among others, the following: 1) rice distribution to local government units, front-liners, and other affected individuals; 2) Isabela Recovery Initiatives to Support Enterprises (I-RISE); 3) Tulong Panghanapbuhay sa Ating Disadvantaged/ Displaced Workers (TUPAD); 4) Youth Development, and; 5) Trainings.

This year, the PCDO continued to adopt the Balance Scorecard (BSC) format for target setting, monitoring, and reporting to get a more holistic picture of the PCDO operations beyond financial aspect.

### II. High Priority Performance Goals

Having set the PCDO’s direction in collaboration, consultation, and coordination among stakeholders, harmonized and paved the way to its 2020 highlights of accomplishments:

#### 1. RICE DISTRIBUTION

*Objective:* (a) To provide rice assistance to every households in the province during the community quarantines



- (b) To assist in the implementation of rice subsidy program of the PGI for the PGI employees and other agencies

**Overview:** The Rice distribution program of the Provincial Government Isabela was the initial assistance provided for every households in the province who were caught off guard in the implementation of a Luzon-wide community quarantine brought upon by the COVID-19 pandemic.

**Accomplishments:**

- Distributed 17,107 bags @ 50 kilos of rice to 427,673 households in the entire province.
- In charged in the distribution of rice assistance to 18,652 teaching and non-teaching staff of the Department of Education, 2,512 personnel of the Philippine National Police, 456 personnel of the Bureau of Fire Protection, and 229 personnel of the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology.
- In charged in the distribution of rice subsidy for PGI employees from January to December 2020.
- In charged in the distribution of rice subsidy for the 6,791 barangay frontlines, including the Barangay Health Worker, Barangay Nutrition Scholars, and Barangay Day Care Workers in the entire province.

## **2. I-RISE**

**Objective:** To provide financial assistance to cooperatives, associations, and the informal sectors who were greatly affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

**Overview:** The Isabela Recovery Initiatives to Support Enterprises (I-RISE) Program aims to provide financial assistance to cooperatives, associations, micro- entrepreneurs, the informal sectors, and the members of the Tricycle Operators and Drivers' Associations who were greatly affected by the COVID-19 pandemic.

**Accomplishments:**

- Forged a Memorandum of Agreement for the establishment of Isabela Recovery Initiatives to Support Enterprises (I-RISE) between the Provincial Government of Isabela, Department of Trade & Industry – R02, LPG Marketers Association and Small Business Corporation – North Luzon Group.
- 11 cooperatives and 3 Associations were able to access loan from the Isabela Recovery Initiatives to support Enterprises (I-RISE) program of the Provincial Government of Isabela.
- 6,780 Tricycle Operators and Drivers Association & Informal Sectors in the province were able to access financial/grants assistance from the Provincial Government of Isabela.
- Conducted I-RISE Orientation to 14 Municipalities for a total participant of 6,780.
- In charged in the I-RISE program distribution of rice and payout of financial assistance to TODA and Informal Sector to the Municipalities of Echague, San Isidro, Alicia, Sto. Tomas, Quirino, Dinapigue, Gamu, Naguilian, Ramon, Luna, Reina Mercedes, Delfin Albano, Tumauni, Isabela.



### 3. TUPAD

**Objective:** To provide emergency employment to disadvantaged/displaced workers.

**Overview:** The TUPAD Program, initiated by the Department of Labor and Employment and in coordination with Provincial Government of Isabela, is a community-based package assistance that provides emergency employment to displaced workers, underemployed, and seasonal workers.

**Accomplishments:**

- In charged in the coordination to the local government units.
- In charged in the validation of beneficiaries during the pay-out proper.
- In charged in the distribution of rice assistance to 24,728 recipients of TUPAD.

### 4. YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

**Objective:** To provide the youth the platform to develop ideas and skills in entrepreneurship.

**Overview:** Putting premium to the development of competencies and skills of the youth, the Natatanging Kabataan Award, was introduced this year with the Search for Best Youth Project/Business Proposal.

**Accomplishments:**

- Established the Natatanging Kabataan Award during the celebration of the Cooperative Month.
- Forged a Memorandum of Agreement between the Provincial Government of Isabela, Department of Trade & Industry, Department of Science and Technology, and Department of Labor and Employment for the facilitation of assistance to youth organizations in the province.

### 5. TRAININGS

**Objective:** To equip cooperative officers and members the necessary skills and know-how.

**Overview:** As an accredited training provider, the PCDO conducts mandatory / specialized/ advance trainings to officers and members of every micro and small cooperatives in the province. In order to ensure the sustainability and stability of cooperatives and micro-small entrepreneurs, the PCDO use prescribed curricula through a series of competency-based training development workshops.

**Accomplishments:**

- Conducted Pre membership Education Seminar to 2,216 TUPAD Beneficiaries in the Municipalities of Cabatuan, San Mateo, Cordon, Ramon, Burgos, Roxas, Isabela.
- Conducted Business Expense and Savings Training (BEST) Seminars for in partnership with the Department of Trade & Industry to 36 Tricycle Operators and Drivers Association in the province.

- Conducted 2 Mandatory Trainings 250 cooperatives, 5 Series of Webinar 223 cooperatives
