The high unmet need for Family planning (FP) affects virtually all segments of the Isabela populace, regardless of their socio economic level, employment status, or rural-urban residences. Such high unmet needs represent a tremendous opportunity to bring FP education and services to women and men in the places they frequent to.

The month of August of every year has been designated as the *National Family Planning Month*, a celebration that centers on the attainment of a better quality of life for the mother, the father and the family as a whole, with the theme: **"Serbisyong Pangkalahatan, tungo sa Planadong Kinabukasan"** which catered to Indigenous People (IP) Women of Reproductive age this year.

To commemorate the event, the municipality of Sto. Tomas, initiated the conduct of the Family Planning Celebration last November 29, 2019 at the Rural Health Unit. A Total of sixty-two (62) women of reproductive age (WRA) who are Indigenous people, 5 RHU staff and 5 representatives from IPHO after the preliminary program lectured on Family Planning Informed Choice and volunteerism, the Different Family Planning methods and FP services provision after counseling.

The **PURPLE RIBBON AWARD** recognizes local government units (LGUs) as well as Civil Society Organizations for their exemplary practices, accomplishments and innovations in the implementation of Reproductive Health and Family Planning Program.

The Province of Isabela conferred three (3) municipalities as an entry to the Search for Purple Ribbon Award in the Region namely: Ramon, San Mariano and Luna. The Mentioned municipalities were re-assessed and provided technical assistance using the Purple ribbon Awards Self-Assessment and Validation tool. Governance, Health Service Delivery, Health Regulation and Health Financing are among the factors considered in picking the finalists focusing on the following Key Result Areas: Policy/guidelines issued, Capacity Building, Logistics Management, Best Practices (empowerment and Sustainability), Demand Generation Activities, Service Provision, Licensing and Regulation and philhealth Regulation.
