The Province of Isabela was able to produce a total of (50) KATROPA fifty Trainors – 4 from IPHO and 46 from the 14 LGUs.

Disaster Risk Reduction and Management in Health Program

Basic Life Support and Standard First Aid Training

To capacitate the health workers of Saint Mathias Medical Center (SMMC) being at the forefront of any emergencies and disasters by providing $\quad \text{and} \quad$ efficient effective delivery of health services to affected individual and population through mobilization of Health Emergency Response Teams (HERTs).

The DRRM-H Team of IPHO-FHS along with other facilitator from Cauayan District Hospital (CDH), Milagros Albano District Hospital (MADH), City of Ilagan Medical Center (CIMC), and Rural Health Unit Naguillan facilitated the BLS SFAT of SMMC medical staff.

Participants were able to meet the criteria on both didactics, skills demonstration through a Simulation activity. Hence, thirty (30) Certificates of Completion and twelve (12) Certificates of Paticipation on Basic Life Support and Standard First Aid Training were awarded to participants.
