This is a basic course to better understand the concepts of demography and serves as a prelude of the 2- day International Conference which tackles on demographic processes and population issues and studies as well as its relation to health, education and labor force.

Current pressing issues population affecting concepts and presentation of research works was conducted by different sectors coming from the United Nations Fund for **Population** Activities (UNFPA), **UP-Population** Institute Academe, economists engineers, demographers, population officers and statisticians.

The research presentations definitely contributed to the enhancement of my knowledge in conducting research which is essential in health care delivery.
