The 8<sup>th</sup> Farmers Congress held at Alicia Community Center, Alicia, Isabelalast April 30, 2014 of the Provincial Government in Collaboration with Isabela Provincial Health Office Medical Team headed by **Dr. Rosa Rita B. Mariano** PHO II and **Dr. Arlene M. Lazaro**, PHO I. In this activity, the team was composed of government doctors, dentist, nurses and midwives from Isabela Provincial Health Office andAlicia Rural Health Unit delivered an efficient public service in the cure and prevention of health for the 505 patients in Medical, 93 patients in Dental seen and 6 units of blood collected. This activity aimed to offer free health care services for the less fortunate Isabeleños in the barangay.

As an evidence of its continuous support for the health sector, another group of Farmer's Congress was organized at San Mateo Isabela which celebrated their Balatong Festival together with farmers Congress aim Medical/Dental mission last May 13, 2014 at the San Mateo Community Center. This Activity was highlighted with circumcision of 126 male children ages 8-12 with 199 medical cases and 30 dental clients. 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## "Direct Sputum Smear Microscopy Training for Isabela Medical Technologists" May 5-9, 2014

Manila, Philippines - The IMPACT Project funded the Training on Basic Course on Direct Sputum Smear Microscopy (DSSM) held at National Tuberculosis Reference Laboratory (NTRL) on May 5-9, 2014. The 5-day intensive training was participated by the medical technologists from the different RHU'S and public / private hospitals in Isabela. The first 2 days of the training were intended for lectures on the important topics about Tuberculosis Program, DOTS Strategy and basic knowledge on microscope: maintenance and its proper handling. The lecturers from the NTRL stressed the importance of proper collection of specimen transport and storage, safety precautions and proper disposal, causes and sources of errors in microscopy, recording and reporting and the roles and functions of medical technologists / microscopists. The remaining 3 days were for the performance and developing the medical technologist's skills on smearing, staining and microscopy.

The purpose of the training is to enhance the capability of the medical technologist/ microscopist in performing DSSM to achieve high accuracy and reliability of TB diagnosis for the successful implementation of the National Tuberculosis Program (NTP). The medical technologist of every DOTS facility, who will perform the DSSM must be competent and equipped with necessary knowledge on TB control.

At the end of the training, the participants who successfully attended and complied with the requirements of the course were issued a *Certificate of Training*. The grateful participants appreciative of the additional learning's are expected to apply the skills they acquired in performing quality DSSM in their respective work areas.

The National Tuberculosis Program of every country, specifically those with high burden Tuberculosis aims to control the disease through early detection and treatment of infectious cases in the community. Sputum Smear Examination is the primary diagnostic tool to identify TB cases. It is the simplest, most reliable and cost effective tool for diagnosing Tuberculosis. This procedure is also used to monitor patient's response to chemotherapy.
