Significant Accomplishments of Field Health Services

Enhanced Private-Public Partnership (PPP) in Tuberculosis (TB) Control Program March12-14, 2014

Provincial Health Office, Ilagan City, Isabela - As stipulated in the National Objectives for Health 2011-2016 which underscores the overall goal that morbidity and mortality from tuberculosis be reduced, the Provincial Health Office (PHO) – National Tuberculosis Control Program (NTP) Core team ardently worked with United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and Philippine Business for Social Progress (PBSP), to help the gigantic vision become a reality through a project called *Innovations and Multisectoral Partnerships To Achieve Control of TB* (IMPACT). Miss Analyn Teodoro of IMPACT project joined the PHO to conduct monitoring in the different RHU's in Isabela specifically Cordon, Echague, Aurora, San Manuel, Roxas, Mallig and Quezon.

The purpose of the of this undertaking is to monitor and evaluate health system performance as to program implementation covering the areas of service delivery which includes inventory of TB drugs, reagents and supplies, installation of sputum collection and smearing areas, recording and reporting as to NTP Registry and Laboratory Registry; and adequacy of competent workforce to deliver quality TB services.

Ideal Feeding Practices for Infants and Young Children

March 17-21, 2014

Provincial Capitol Foodcourt, Ilagan City, Isabela – It was in 2002 when the WHO and UNICEF adopted the *Global Strategy for Infant and Young Child Feeding* (IYCF). DOH and its line agency-the National Nutrition Council-Region 02 realized this through capability-building of health workers. This venture was made possible with the active cooperation of local government units.

It is widely believed that adequate nutrition during infancy and early childhood is essential to ensure the growth, health, and development of children to their full potential. Steered by this premise, the Provincial Health Office of Isabela untiringly conducts the 5th batch of training entitled, *"Promotion of Good Nutrition and Infant & Young Child Feeding"* to the different municipalities of Quirino, Burgos, Roxas and San Isidro wherein a total of 62 participants composed of barangay health workers, barangay nutrition scholars and parent leaders joined. The five-day training focuses on the provision of essential competencies that every health service provider must be equipped of to carry out the crucial role of protecting, promoting and supporting optimal feeding practices in accordance to the principles of the *Global Strategy* which are exclusive breastfeeding and adequate/safe complementary feeding starting from the age of 6 months with continued breastfeeding up to 2 years of age or beyond. This follows other critical components of teaching suitable nutrition for children such as increasing consumption of egg and vegetables.

The completion of the course is expected to raise community-based awareness among local folks on ways to improve the nutritional status of young children in the entire province.

PHO looks forward to Malaria-Free Isabela

Punta Amelita Resort, Cordon, Isabela - The Philippines is on the course of eliminating malaria in the Philippines by 2020. Guided by this attainable vision, Global Consolidated Malaria Grant in the province of Isabela, the Philippines Shell Foundation Inc., in consultation with the Isabela Provincial Health Office (IPHO) and the Center for Health Development- Cagayan Valley converged a *"Provincial Malaria Control Program Implementation Review(PIR)"* and orientation on malaria updates last March 19-20, 2014.

The activity aims to share municipal successes and challenges in malaria elimination and preparation of workable plans and sustainable solutions that will focus on regional cooperation, advocacy, knowledge exchange and capacity-building attended by rural health units and chief of hospitals. Such valuable results shall be made as bases for the consolidated Provincial Plan of Action.

Through the concerted efforts and mix of key interventions to all malaria risk populations from the different municipalities and development partners, the Province of Isabela is relentlessly working towards the elimination of malaria as a public health threat in the entire province as cases consistently decline from 129 in 2010 to 28 in 2012.
