2021 was another busy year for the Public Safety Office. Events involving public safety came one after another.

#### A. DOH Resbakuna Drive

It was the peak of the COVID-19 pandemic. PSO personnel worked with the Provincial Information Office, the Isabela Provincial Health Office, the Isabela Police Provincial Office, as well as C/MLGUs in providing necessary information thru IEC distribution and intensifying multimedia educational campaign with the use of available social media platforms. PSO Personnel produced thousands of flyers about the COVID-19 vaccination drive, minimum public health standards and instructional materials on how to properly deal with the Pandemic. The IEC materials were introduced to the public with the help of Local Chief Executives and the Department Of Education - Isabela Division Office.

#### B. iSMART COVID-19 Monitoring

The Isabela Special Motorcycle Action and Response Team (iSMART) riders of the Isabela Police Provincial Office played a major

role in ensuring that quarantine guidelines issued by the IATF were complied with in the whole province while they continued to perform their regular functions. Riders submitted reports to the PSO for consolidation and daily submission to the Provincial Governor to keep him informed.

#### C. Isabela COVID-19 Task Force Hotline

THE Isabela Provincial COVID-19 Task Force Hotline caters to constituents who have queries regarding current health protocols; and travel requirements for those coming into the Province during any Alert Level. Dedicated PSO personnel Francis David G. Gangan and Evangeline C. Antonio accept and respond to all queries thru calls and text messages and compiles a monthly report for the information of the Governor and the Provincial Task Force on COVID-19. This initiative was implemented immediately

# THE PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICE

The **Isabela Public Safety Office** traces its humble beginnings to February 21, 2012, when Ordinance No. 001 Series of 2012, entitled “AN ORDINANCE CREATING AND ESTABLISHING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY IN THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT OF ISABELA AND PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR” authored by Sangguniang Panlalawigan Member Hon. Rolando L. Tugade, Chairman of the Committee on Public Security and Order, was enacted.

It was later amended by Ordinance No. 002, Series of 2014, entitled “ORDINANCE CREATING AND ESTABLISHING THE PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICE THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT OF ISABELA AND PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR”, authored by Sangguniang Panlalawigan Member Hon. Karen G. Abuan, Chairman, Committee on Laws, Rules and Regulations.

## **The functions of the Office:**

(a) To enforce provisions of Ordinance No. 0002-2001 otherwise known as the Provincial Administrative Code, particularly Chapter IV, Provincial Gov-

ernment Services: Article 1 – Peace, Order, and Security; Article 2 – Public Order; Article 3 – Safety on Public Roads; and Article 4 – Safety on Fire Hazards;

(b) To enforce provisions of Presidential Decree No. 1566 governing the creation of Provincial Disaster Coordinating Council in the Province of Isabela now called the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (PDRRMC) under R.A. 10121;

(c) To enforce all other laws and ordinances relative to the protection of lives and properties, and those pertaining but not limited to the maintenance of public safety, peace and order especially during mad-made or natural calamities, and the promotion of general welfare;

(d) To ensure and provide quick response and coordinative efforts for any call or need of the public for police, fire marshals, rescue or medical assistance;

(e) Exercise the duty to make citizen’s arrest pursuant to the Rules of Court; and

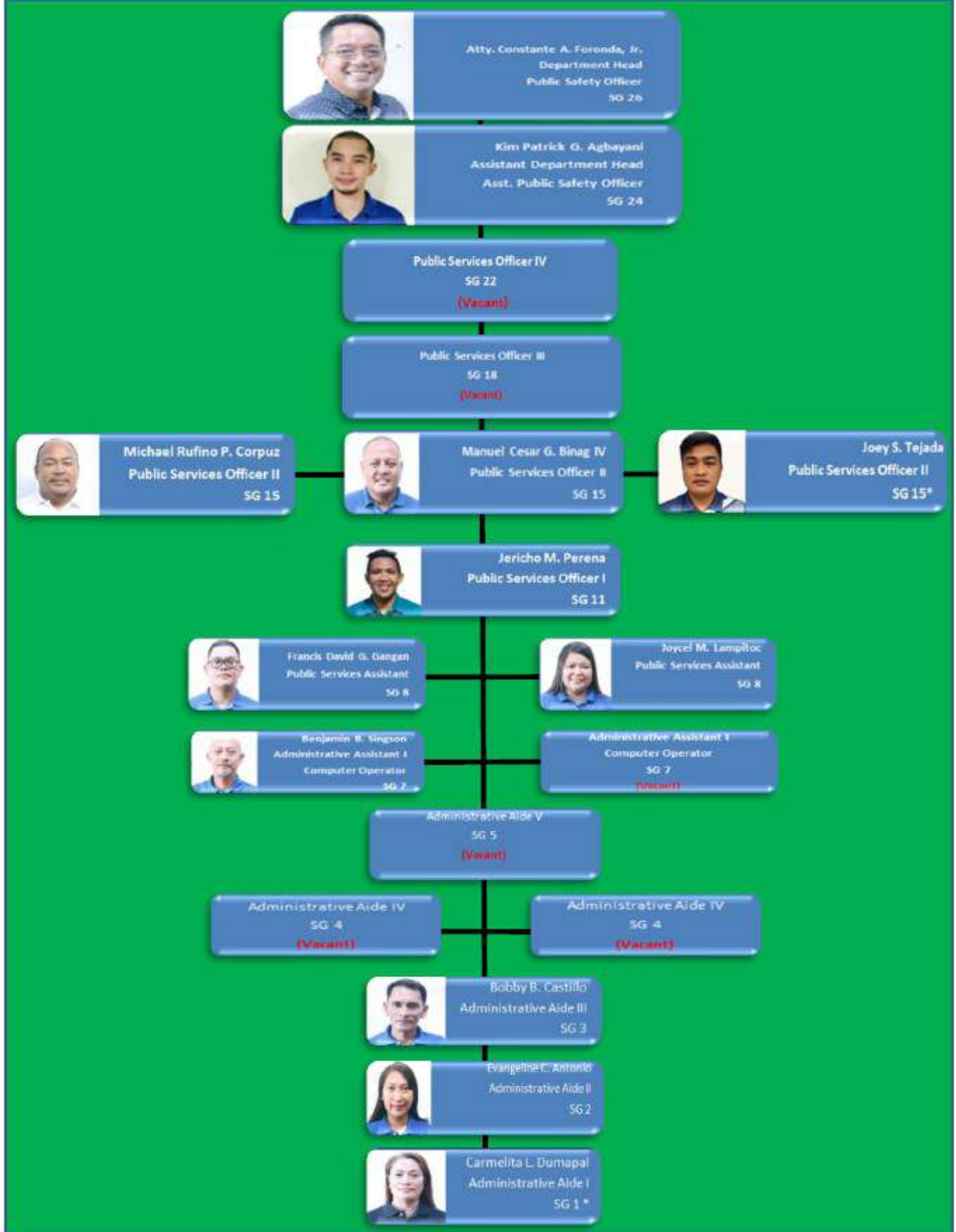
(f) Perform such other duties and functions as may be provided by law or ordinance. (Section 5, Ordinance No. 01-2014)

The Office was initially manned by Atty. Constanse A. Foronda, Jr. as the Department Head, PBGEN. Jimmy U. Rivera, Sr., (Ret.) the former Provincial Director of Isabela Police Provincial Office (IPPO) as Assistant Department Head and Mr. Jose Armand G. Araneta.

Seven (7) years since its creation on January 21, 2014, Public Safety Office has evolved into what it is now. It initially shared office space with the Office of the Governor, until the District Office of then 1st District Representative Hon. Rodolfo “Rodito” T. Albano III (Incumbent Governor of Isabela) was graciously offered to be its temporary office, prior to being transferred to the former office of the Provincial Cooperatives Development Office (PCDO) at the rear ground floor of the Isabela Provincial Capitol from 2017 to 2019 before transferring to its current location at 2nd floor of the newly constructed PSO-PSWDO Building, Provincial Capitol Grounds, Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Isabela on December 2019.

# THE PSO SHIELD

The PSO Shield was designed to formally establish the identity and purpose of the Public Safety Office which was created by virtue of Sangguniang Panlalawigan Ordinance No. 002 series of 2014 on January 21, 2014.



**THE SHIELD** The shield signifies protection from danger, risk, or any unpleasant experience.

**Black Color of the Shield** Signifies power, unity and strength.

**Map of Isabela** The Map is in green color indicating the province's status as one of the top corn and rice producers of the country. It is presented with demarcation lines indicating 34 towns and 2 component cities which makes it the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest province of the Philippines. It was initially called *Isabela de Luzon* to differentiate from other places within the Country bearing the name of Isabela. The province was named after Queen Isabela II of Spain.

**The Official Seal** The Official Seal of Isabela is super imposed on top of the Malta Cross and Star of Life to signify the province's readiness to respond in all types of emergencies.

**The Maltese Cross** Symbolizes the good traits of a safety officer as being observant, tactful, resourceful, dexterous, explicit, discriminating, perseverant and sympathetic.

**Star of Life** is a blue, six-pointed star, outlined with a white border which features the rod of Asclepius in the center. Traditionally, the logo was used as a stamp of authentication or certification for ambulances, paramedics or other EMS personnel. Internationally, it represents emergency medical services units and personnel.

**The Four Connected Hands** is a symbol of togetherness and participation. It signifies the unity of various units within the government working hand in hand to ensure the safety and well-being of its residents.

**The People** A group of 36 persons, representing the 34 towns and 2 component cities of the Province of Isabela linking together, to provide a full and unified front against all adversities and elements that may compromise the safety and well-being of its residents.



## PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICE ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR THE YEAR

*Although the Public Safety Office responds to safety and/or order events with the coordination with police, fire, rescue, medical, and social welfare groups, it prides itself in taking a proactive stance that focuses on providing solutions to problems before they even arise. This is done through recommendations by Public Safety Officer Atty. Constante A. Foronda, Jr. to the proper agencies on matters pertaining to the personal safety and security of Isabeleños in times of calamities and disasters, crime waves, terrorism and other forms of security threats.*



The Office have several accomplishments in the promotion of public safety in 2021. They are the following:

### Safety Lectures

Invited as guest lecturer in the PGI employees’ seminar entitled: “NEW CONVENTIONS IN THE WORKPLACE: UNDERSTANDING PROTOCOLS AND SURVIVING COVID-19 TOGETHER” held at F.N. DY Hall, Public Safety Officer Atty. Constante A. Foronda, Jr., on “covidiquette” as well as novel health and safety protocols that have to be observed during

the COVID-19 pandemic.

### S-PaSS (Safe Swift and Smart Passage) Travel System

The Public Safety Office, thru Department Head Atty. Constante A. Foronda, Jr. as focal person and Asst. Dept. Head Kim Patrick G. Agbayani worked with the DOTr on the province-wide implementation of the S-PaSS travel management system endorsed by the DILG for use of all LGUs. The system allows travelers to secure permission from destination and pass-thru locales by providing LGU requirements prior to actual travel, thereby allowing LGUs the means to monitor and screen all travel entries in light of the COVID-19 alert level system guidelines. The

authority of the PGI to process travel permits was devolved to city and municipal governments. The PGI, however, retained the authority to post travel advisories and restriction on the s-pass.ph website.

### Staysafe.ph and Healthguard.ph digital logbook/contact tracing app

Public Safety Officer Atty. Constante A. Foronda, Jr. and Asst. Public Safety Officer Kim Patrick G. Agbayani were designated focal people in the integration and implementation of the StaySafe and HealthGuard contract tracing apps. They also spearheaded the awareness campaign, training and actual application of both contact tracing apps with the cooperation of various national and local agencies.

### DILG Safety Seal Certification

Upon receiving the Department of the Interior and Local Government directive to implement the Safety Seal Certification in the Province, this Office went ahead and coordinated with all PGI offices regarding the same. In preparation for certification inspection, PSO personnel made sure that the PGI will not only meet but will exceed Safety Seal requirements.

### Safety Officer Roles and Responsibilities in light of the COVID-19 situation

The Public Safety Officer, Atty. Constante A. Foronda, Jr., provided a new set of roles and responsibilities for all active PGI Safety Officers per department to ensure adaptability to the current COVID-19 situation in the workplace. A seminar / Workshop was held on September 18, 2021 to fully discuss the new Safety Officer Protocols as well as provide the Safety Officer checklist of things to do when someone in their department shows COVID-19 symptoms. With this, intructions to the Provincial Security Group on how to effectively manage the contact tracing applications were also provided thru email and workshop.

No. 8 in the DILG inspection checklist requires the:

- "8 Availability of personnel-in-charge for monitoring and maintaining social distancing and ensuring the compliances of clients/visitors/ employees to health protocols and areas in the establishment where people gather (e.g. queue)"

**DESIGNATION AS HEALTH PROTOCOL MONITORS**

**A. Secondary Safety Officers**

All SO-2s are hereby designated as personnel-in-charge for monitoring and maintaining social distancing within the interior and immediate exterior of your respective departments including areas where lines form at your transaction windows and areas with seats for your clients and visitors.

**B. The Provincial Security Group**

The PSG is hereby designated as personnel-in-charge for monitoring and maintaining social distancing in common areas within the Capitol Compound including but not limited to roadways, parking areas, food courts, open spaces, lobbies, stairways, corridors, public comfort rooms, and areas outside the responsibility of department SO-2s.

**MATTERS OF CONCERN**

- 1. **Desk placement.** - The desks within departments should be situated such that those seated at desks are at least 1 meter apart from one another and at least 1 meter from those seated at the nearest desks. Correct wrong placements yourselves. If you cannot do the correction, refer the matter to the office that can.

2. **Protected interaction.** - Every interaction should be protected. All people within the Capitol Compound should wear face shields and 2 layers of facemasks at all times.

3. **Hand sanitation.** - All departments should be equipped with alcohol sprayers or dispensers at their doorways. The palms and backs of hands should be sanitized. Soap dispensers at handwashing stations should be topped up before start of office hours.

4. **Queues.** - All transaction windows, cashiers, ATMs, handwashing stations, scanning areas, time in/time out stations, and other facilities where lines form should have floor markers where people lining up should stand. Replace worn floor markers. If there are no sufficient lines for those falling in line, those not standing on floor markers should be at least 1 meter from the last marker and from each other.

5. **Seats.** - Those on gang chairs should be one seat apart. Single chairs should be at least 1 meter apart.

5. **Disinfection.** - Make sure that your area of responsibility is disinfected by the PDRMO and/or the GSO daily.

Let us all keep safe.

**CHECKLIST OF THINGS TO DO WHEN SOMEONE IN YOUR DEPARTMENT SHOWS COVID-19 SYMPTOMS**

- Keep the symptomatic person away from others.

  - Ask the symptomatic person the date when any COVID-19 symptom first showed.

  - Arrange for the temporary isolation of the symptomatic person at any of the isolation areas in the Capitol Compound with the One Isabela COVID-19 Command Center (09162812091 or 09685339913).
  - Arrange with the DART Rescue 831 (09158193187 or 09215852341), for the transportation of the symptomatic person to the isolation area.
  - Report the matter to the Barangay Health Emergency Response Team of Alibagu (Hotline: 09956480224).
  - Conduct an investigation as to where the symptomatic person had been within the period of two (2) days before any symptom showed and within fourteen (14) days after any symptom showed.
  - Contact trace by determining those PGI employees with whom the symptomatic person had, within the period of two (2) days before any symptom showed and within fourteen (14) days after such symptom showed.
    - face-to-face interaction within 1 meter for more than 15 minutes; and/or
    - direct physical contact
    - any unprotected interaction
- Use the Contact Tracing Report form to enumerate names, addresses, and contact numbers.
- Determine through the BHERT-Alibagu if the quarantined person has undergone RT-PCR testing.

- If RT-PCR negative, your work is done.
  - If RT-PCR positive, proceed to the next item.
  - Advise your department head and other department heads concerned that, according to protocol, all employees in the Contact Tracing Report should undergo a 14-day home quarantine.
  - Immediately submit the accomplished Contact Tracing Report to the Provincial Epidemiology Surveillance Unit of the Isabela Provincial Health Office.
  - Advise those who have to be quarantined to inform the BHERT of the place where they intend to be quarantined that they will undergo quarantine.
  - Give each employee who has to go on quarantine a copy of the Home Quarantine Pointers.
  - If the symptomatic person who tested COVID-19 positive is a guest in your department, go to the last item. If he or she is an employee from another department, endorse everything to your counterpart in that other department and then go to the last item. If he or she is from your department, proceed to the next item.
- NOTE:** If your co-department personnel became symptomatic while at another department and his or her case was endorsed to you, start from this point.
- Where was the symptomatic employee brought for isolation?

**MEMORANDUM**

We are vying for a Safety Seal certification and we have to pass all the 14 items on the DILG inspection checklist. No. 13 on the list requires that there should be an available designated Safety Officer with the following functions:

**"a) coordinate with the appropriate bodies for support and referral to community-based isolation facilities for confirmed cases with mild symptoms, and to health facilities for severe and critical care;"**

a.1. If there is someone (the "symptomatic person") in your department premises, whether an officemate or a visitor, who exhibits COVID-19 symptoms (fever, dry cough, shortness of breath, loss of taste or smell, flu-like respiratory and digestive problems, muscle aches and fatigue), immediately separate such symptomatic person from others and arrange for his or her temporary isolation in any of the Capitol Compound isolation areas by phoning the One Isabela COVID-19 Command Center:

a.2. Arrange with the DART Rescue 831 for the transportation of the symptomatic person from your office to a temporary isolation area:

Globe 09158193187  
Smart 09215852341

a.3. Know the name, address, and telephone number of the symptomatic person and the day when the symptoms first became apparent.

**"b) undertake contact tracing or coordinate the conduct thereof;"**

b.1. Ask the Provincial Security Group to refer to the PGI Admin Account in the StaySafe System to determine the period within which the symptomatic person was in the Capitol premises. The critical period is from two (2) days before the date the symptoms started to show to fourteen (14) days after the symptoms started to show.

b.2. Conduct an investigation as to where the symptomatic person had been in your department premises. Determine those whom said symptomatic person:

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b.2.a. was face-to-face within 1 meter for more than 15 minutes;

b.2.b. was in direct physical contact; or

b.2.c. was in any unprotected interaction.

Accomplish a Contact Tracing Report with the names, addresses, and phone numbers of the close contacts.

b.3. Submit the Contact Tracing Report to the Provincial Epidemiology Surveillance Unit (the "PESU").

b.4. Enforce strict physical distancing within your department:

b.4.a. everyone should wear facemasks and face shields;

b.4.b. no face-to-face contact with anyone within 1 meter; and

b.4.c. no direct physical contact.

"c) monitor status of employees quarantined or isolated;

Note: The symptomatic employee will have to undergo RT-PCR testing through the coordination with a Barangay Health Worker ("BHW") who may be reached through the Barangay Health Emergency Response Team (BHERT) of Alibagu. Its hotline number is 09956480224 which should be saved in your phone contacts.

If the symptomatic person is from your department, then proceed to c.1. If the symptomatic person is an employee from another department, endorse him to your counterpart in that department and your work is done. If the symptomatic person is a visitor or client, he or she should be endorsed to the BHERT-Alibagu.

c.1. Monitor the status of the symptomatic person through the BHW:

c.1.a. whether or not the symptomatic person has undergone RT-PCR testing;

c.1.b. if yes, whether the symptomatic persons tested positive or negative.

c.1.c. if positive, proceed to c.2; if negative, then your work is done.

c.2. Advise your department head that all employees in the Contact Tracing Report should undergo a 14-day quarantine.

c.3. Determine which isolation facility your COVID-19 positive co-employee was taken to and monitor his or her condition during isolation.

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c.4. Before the recovered employee may return to work he or she must submit a Certificate of Quarantine Completion issued by the local government where said employee was isolated.

To make sure that you do not miss a step, please reproduce and follow the attached "Checklist of Things To Do When Someone In Your Department Shows COVID-19 Symptoms".

**ISABELA PROVINCIAL TASK FORCE ON COVID-19****HOME QUARANTINE POINTERS**

(Source: Department of Health COVID-19 FAQs as of May 2021 and the New COVID-19 Protocols of the Isabela Provincial Task Force on COVID-19)

**Close contact** - You are a close contact if you were exposed to a suspect, probable, or confirmed COVID-19 case two (2) days before or within fourteen (14) days after the onset of symptoms of such case by:

- face-to-face interaction within one (1) meter for more than 15 minutes with facemask;
- direct physical interaction with facemask; or
- any interaction without protection.

**Quarantine** - the period to monitor your well-being after being in close contact with a suspect, probable, or confirmed COVID-19 case. While it is being determined whether or not you are COVID-19 positive, you are being quarantined to prevent you from infecting others just in case you are COVID-19 positive.

1. Inasmuch as you are not sure if you are contagious, keep people away from you until you are sure that you are not infected with COVID-19 or any other contagious disease. Stay in a well-ventilated room that will separate you from other people. No one should enter your quarantine room during the period of your quarantine.

2. You should have your own bathroom/comfort room, preferably inside your quarantine room. If you have to share a bathroom/comfort room with others, disinfect it with 0.5% bleach solution before anyone else can use it.

3. Senior members of your household as well as those with co-morbidity should stay with relatives during your quarantine period.

4. Wear a facemask and a face shield at all times.

5. Wash your hands often, especially before you touch anything outside your quarantine room.

6. Eat right, drink lots of fluids, and take the medicines prescribed by your doctor.

7. Have anything you wish to touch or hold properly disinfected. Disinfect the thing you touched or held before anyone else can touch or hold it.

8. Require everyone who has to interact with you to wear a facemask and a face shield during interaction.

9. Do not let others use personal belongings that you use during your quarantine such as towels, bed sheets, plates, and eating utensils.

10. You may end your quarantine if the person you had close contact with does not test RT-PCR positive.

11. If the person you had close contact with tests RT-PCR positive, then your quarantine period shall be:

- fourteen (14) days from exposure if you are not fully vaccinated; or
- seven (7) days from exposure if you are fully vaccinated.

12. Monitor your oxygen saturation level with an oximeter. It is available at most Watson's, Mercury Drug, or large drugstores. Advise your BHERT if your oxygen saturation reading falls below 95. Do the same if you experience breathing difficulties or any severe symptom.

13. You should take a confirmatory RT-PCR test if any COVID-19 symptom (fever, dry cough, shortness of breath, loss of taste or smell, flu-like respiratory and digestive problems, muscle aches and fatigue) shows during your quarantine. Contact your BHERT or your department head so that arrangements for a test could be made. The test cost is chargeable to your PhilHealth.

14. You may take an RT-PCR test even if no COVID-19 symptoms show, but it should be after at least five (5) days from your first exposure.

15. If you test RT-PCR negative, you may return to work after completing the quarantine period in No. 11 and after being issued a Certificate of Quarantine Completion by the LGU where you were quarantined.

16. Report a positive RT-PCR test to your BHERT, to your department head or to your Safety Officer 01.

17. Stay calm if ever you test positive, especially if you have been fully vaccinated. Your department head and your whole PGI family will take care of you.

18. Contact the One Isabela COVID-19 Command Center (09162812091 or 09685339913) so that arrangements can be made to transfer you to a temporary treatment facility or to a hospital, whichever is appropriate. DART Rescue 831 (09158193187 or 09215852341) will transport you to the isolation facility. Your Safety Officer 01 is tasked to monitor your condition daily during your isolation.

19. You may return to work when you shall have recovered and shall have been issued a Certificate of Quarantine Completion by the LGU where you were isolated.

Kailangan sumailalim sa health screening at deklarar ang inyong kumpletong health history upang matukoy kung dapat ka bang mabakunahan o hindi. Kung hindi ka sumailalim sa screening, hindi ka maaaring i-schedule para sa pagbabakuna.

**7. ANO ANG KAILANGANG GAWIN SA ARAW NG PAGBABAKUNA?**

Pumunta sa vaccination site kung saan ka nakalista.

- Magsuot ng face mask at face shield. Isagawa ang mga minimum public health standards tulad ng pagmamaintain ng isang metrong iyo sa iba at paghuhugas/pag-sanitize ng kamay.
- Kailangan pumirma ng isang INFORMED CONSENT bago mabakunahan. Ito ay isang patunay na boluntaryo kang magpapabakuna at alam mo ang mga benepisyo at mga posibleng side-effects nito.
