ANNUAL ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT 2018

I. INTRODUCTION :

Lingap Center for street children is a residential facility owned and managed by the Provincial Government of Isabela. It is continuously reaching out children who are neglected, abandoned, maltreated, victims of child labor and street children. It has been serving its target clientele for 18 years now since its devolution to the Provincial Government of Isabela in year 2000 serving the disadvantaged children of Isabela.

The center provides programs and services geared towards the total development of the children meeting their basic rights for survival, development, protection and participation. The center may not be a replacement of the family but it is still the best alternative placement for the child for the mean time that the family is crisis situation.

To be able to fast track rehabilitation of cases, a proper case management is being done with regular conduct of case conferences, meetings, home visits and collateral inter views in partnership with the referring Local Government units and other partner agencies.

To improve delivery of programs and services, the Provincial Government of Isabela allows and send staff for trainings and developmental activities as a way of capacitating staff of the center for an upgrading and improved service delivery.

II. STAFF COMPLIMENTS :

The lingap center is smoothly operating with 14 staff compliment doing their respective duties and responsibilities to be able to meet its vision, mission and objective and to effectively and efficiently serve its clientele group. Out of the 14 staff, there are 12 staff holding permanent positions and 3 contractual staff; 1 social worker, and 2 administrative staff doing clerical work, maintaining the stocks of the center and liaison officer.

For 2018, the center has a Social Worker (contractual) helping in the case management.

The staff do not only do their respective task in the center but acts as a mother and father figure to the children imparting values on diligence and hard work to the children and likewise teach them do household chores.

III. ACCOMPLISHMENT :

The data above shows that the center has served a total of 34 children for the year. Neglected children has the highest number served which is 20 followed by streetchildren,7, maltreated 6 and victim of child labor which is one (1) . There are more male children served numbering to 23 than female children which is only 11.

The data above shows that the center has served 34 children for the year 2018. That out of the 34 children 23 children are carried over from previous year while 11 children are admitted for the year. Out of the 34 children served 12 children were discharged from the center, 7 children were returned back to their families, 3 were discharged to their relatives who were found capable of taking care of them after conducting proper assessment while 2 were transferred to an institution who will continue providing them with the programs and services they needs as their family is not yet ready to take them back. At present there are 22 children who are still in the center and will be carried over cases for 2019 continuously providing them with the programs and services the center provides.

PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

1. HOMELIFE SERVICES /GROUP LIVING SERVICES

The center is a residential facility which is considered a temporary home for Children who are neglected, abandoned, victims of child labor, maltreated and street children. It operates on 24/7 basis providing the children with their basic needs for food, shelter and clothing. The center is managed by the staff who are looked up by children as their parents who not only provide their needs but likewise provide the tender loving care they most need as growing children.

The children were guided to act and behave appropriately and deal with co-children and staff with respect. Children are treated well with love, respect and without discrimination to have that feeling of belongingness. They are taught on how to do household chores to learn the value of hard work and diligence. The children are grouped and assigned task to do led by their older boys and girls who act as big brother or sister.

Meals of children are planned based on a monthly menu prepared by a nutritionist based on the food group of go, grow and glow. Weighing is done every end of the month for proper documentation and monitoring for rehabilitation. Based on the latest weighing, almost all the children have improved in weight except for two (2) children who are still underweight. One child is included in the feeding program in school to combat malnutrition.

The children are given new clothes and shoes twice a year, every school opening and December for their Christmas attire. Toiletries are distributed every Friday afternoon as well as laundry soap for the bigger boys and girls who can manage to wash their own clothes.

2. EDUCATIONAL SERVICES :

For the children who are presently in the center, all of them are in school, one (1) in Grade VII, 18 children in Elementary level, one (1) in the kindergarten and 2 children in the Early learning Center for the Day Care services. Out of these 22 children, 5 children have honors and are actively involved in extracurricular activities in school. They are representing the school in District contest for poster and slogan making. They too are participants in MTAP and other activities for performing pupils.

Last March, 2018, there were 2 children who graduated in Grade VI! And 5 children graduated in the Early Learning Center. All of the children were promoted to the next grade and attended their Recognition Day.

Every opening of the school year, the children are provided with their school uniforms, shoes, school bags and their school supplies. They were often advised to take care of their things.

The Houseparent's provide tutorial sessions to the children helping them in their school assignment and school project after going to bed. Every summer vacation, the Houseparent's continuously conduct tutorial sessions on reading, writing and mathematics for them to enhance their academic performance as well as prepare the children for the coming school year. The houseparent's and the Manpower

Development Officer also conduct skills training on bead flower making and rugs making to teach them make use of their time productively and learn other talents on painting, drawing and others skills based on their interest.

3. MEDICAL/DENTAL SERVICES :

Last summer vacation 2018, all the children had dental check-up conducted by the Dental Unit of the FNDy Memorial Hospital. They had tooth extraction and prophylaxis to maintain dental hygiene. They were given lectures on proper way of brushing their teeth three times a day to avoid tooth decay.

The TESDA students also conducted lectures on proper hand washing as well as maintaining personal hygiene to the children. This activities will help the children maintain cleanliness and be away from other infectious diseases.

For this year, there were five (5) children who were brought to the FNDy Memorial Hospital for check-up and vaccination due to cough, allergy and cat bite. They were given free medicines and vaccination.

4. SPIRITUAL ENHANCEMENT AND VALUES INCULCATION :

All children regularly attend Sunday bible study and fellowship at the Ilagan Bible Baptist Church. They too have bible study at the center conducted by active volunteer, Sister Cristeta Beronia from the Ilagan Baptist Church. The children also have group praying every night before going to bed led by co-children in rotation basis. The children have already imbibe in them the importance of praying as a way of thanking the Lord for his goodness. They memorize memory verses in the bible and have oral recitation during their activities.

Last summer vacation, the children have modular bible study conducted by one of the houseparent's, Pastor Mario Valdez. All the children can already lead prayers in programs in the center.

During the Lenten season, the Lingap staff and children went to the prayer mountain at Sta Victoria, City of Ilagan for the Stations of the Cross. The children joined in the activity giving them the chance to have their penitential activity as they join in prayer.

5. RECREATIONAL SERVICES :

Recreation Services in one of the programs in the center most enjoyed by all the children. It is one way in inculcating in them physical development, sportsmanship and mental development as well. The children are given time to play during their free day at the center like playing chess, and volleyball. The center has also its playground facilities of swing, slides and other.

In the conduct of celebration and festivals at the Sky park, the children are accompanied by staff on duty to witness the many activities. Other activities attended by the Lingap children follows:

1. **Bambati Festival**, 2018, the children went to the Ale-Ale Restaurant for an outing and attended lecture on how to take care of our natural habitat. They went around the different booth and have a glimpse of the products of the different municipalities.

2. **PEDYA Kamp-** 10 Lingap center children attended the PEDYA Kamp at Pagbilao, Quezon Province Last April 27- May 5, 2018. This activity provide opportunity for the children to see other places and get involved in activities of the differently abled persons.
3. **SWIMMING & PICNIC** - The Lingap center children had swimming and picnic at Villa Mercedes Resort (May 3, 2018) and at Rainbow Resort (May 29, 2018) for bonding and relaxation of staff and children.
4. **BIRTHDAY OF GOV. DY** with children August 31, 2018- The Lingap center children attended the birthday celebration of Gov. Boogie Dy for the children at Isabela Skypark.

November 26, 2018-The Lingap center children attended the Batang Isabeleno day at the Amphi Theater and actively participated in the games conducted and were able to get prizes and candies.

The children have actively participated in the above mentioned activities enhancing their talent in dancing singing and have develop their ability to deal with co-children and other children they meet as well.

6. PSYCHOLOGICAL EVALUATION :

All the 11 newly admitted children had undergone the psychological evaluation conducted by Dr. Kathleen Joson. The evaluation result and the action plan prepared help the Social Worker and houseparent's in dealing with the children. It would also be a guild to help the child overcome their problems, weaknesses and help enhance their strength.

7. CASE MANAGEMENT

The case management is the lifeblood of the center. The Social Workers in the center help each other in the management of cases with the partner agencies and LGUs through home visit, collateral visit and interview and conferences. This is to fast track the rehabilitation of cases. Folders are regularly updated and all activities were conducted with proper documentation.

IV. STAFF DEVELOPMENT :

To equipped the center staffs with needed knowledge, Attitude and skills, the Provincial Government send staffs for tranings. These will help the staff improve their KAS for effective implementation of programs and services that would redound to the betterment and rehabilitation of the clients.

For this year, the following staffs have attended the following training:

V. TEAM BUILDING AND MID YEAR PROGRAM REVIEW FOR STAFF :

The center staff had their 2 day team building AND Midyear Program Review at Kangaroo Beach Resort at Gonzaga Cagayan last June 12-13, 2018. This is a venue for the staff to assess their accomplishment and activities for the first semester and plan for the next semester on strategies to improve program delivery. It is also a time for staff to unwind and refresh with their heavy workload to have renewed vigor to attend to their work.

VI. OTHER ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED :

1. In celebration of Fire Prevention Month, the Bureau of Fire Protection conducted Fire Drill and lectures on Fire prevention to the Lingap Center staff and children.
2. The Lingap Center staff particularly the designated Safety officers conduct quarterly earthquake drill and lecture on Waste Management and Environmental Protection
3. The Lingap Center children joined in the clean -up drive to eliminate mosquitos in the surroundings "TODAS DENGUE"(Aug. 15, 2018)
4. The Center celebrated "Family Day" inviting all parents of the children for a lunch together and training on rug making and flower beads making to equipped them with livelihood skills to earn additional income for the family.
5. Celebrated Universal Children's Month last November 29, 2018 with a search for Teen Miss Lingap Center and Little Miss Lingap Center.
6. The center (Social Laboratory) accommodates Senior High School students (2 batches) from the Gamu Rural High School for their OJT

VII. IMPROVEMENTS IN THE CENTER :

For this year, the center has made some repairs/improvement for a homier atmosphere as follows:
