#### **INTRODUCTION**

2018 is a new milestone for the PSWD Office in continuously adopting new challenges in the implementation of Social Welfare and Development programs and services specifically to the core social protection programs, projects and services of the office to the poor, and disadvantaged and vulnerable individuals and groups towards an improved quality of life.

The Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office continue to perform its responsibility with focus and dedication guided by its mandate, vision, mission and goal stated below:

#### **MANDATE**

Pursuant to RA 7160, Section 17, the provision of Basic Social Welfare Services is vital in uplifting the living conditions and improving the quality of life of the poorest sector of the population to enable them to become self-reliant and contribute to national development. Hence the state is committed to the care, protection, and rehabilitation of that segment of the country's population (individual, family and community) that has the least in life in terms of physical, mental, and social well-being as well as social welfare assistance and social work intervention, to restore normal functioning and participation in community development.

#### **VISION**

Empowered individuals, families, and communities with improved quality of life and performing their expected roles, and able to mobilize resources to meet their basic needs.

#### **MISSION**

Provide a balanced approach to welfare and development whereby the needs and interest of the population are addressed not only at the outbreak of crisis but more importantly at the stage which leads to such crisis.

To provide every Isabeleño access to world-class social services and social protection by the year 2030.

Child and Youth Welfare

1. Capacity Building and Bench Marking Activity

Twenty eight years after the signing of the un- CRC, and a good nine months after the conduct of the 1<sup>st</sup> Provincial Child Rights Summit, the Provincial Council for the Protection of Children launches its most important project to date – Project: **UBING** or Ugnayan ng Batang Isabeleño at ng Nagbabantay na Gobyerno, The province official child protection hotline.

To build a safe, more decent and child – friendlier communities, the provincial leadership has given its marching orders to all concerned to explore the breadth and depths of the national landscape in search for measures, strategies and good practices that may be replicated, in order to strengthen our child rights program and policy.

2. Livelihood Skills Training for Children in WCPC

Other than the regular programs and services provided for children in WCPC and Lingap Center, training is also one important strategy in helping there wards forget their painful experiences in the past.

The PSWDO in coordination with the TESDA provided a Five-day training on meat processing, massage therapy, beads making, rug making, haircut and other basic skill trainings.



3. Day Care Workers Week Celebration

The celebration of Day Care Workers Week was conducted in two days to accommodate the 1,200 members of the Isabela Federation of Child Development Workers in the province. The participants were divided into two batches. It was held at the FND Hall in two- separate day June 29, 2018 for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> district and July 13, 2018 for 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> district.

The lecture provided to the participants focused on how to manage young children in times of disaster; proper attitude/etiquette towards the use of social media and proper tooth brushing and managing healthy and strong teeth.

6. “BOJIE” Para sa mga Batang Isabeleño

Isabela has been declared a child-friendly province. As such, it is the policy of the Provincial Government that the right of children for Survival, Protection, Participation and Development of their potentials must be given priority. Consistent herewith, the Provincial enjoins all the efforts of both the public and private sectors to achieve the goals of Protection, Participation and Development of Batang Isabeleño.

The Provincial Council for the Protection of Children is the institutional mechanism of the Province that advocates child rights, plans and initiates, recommends interventions and monitors children’s programs and projects. One of the planned activities is the conduct of Palarong Pamabata, entitled “BOJIE” Para sa mga Batang Isabeleño, in order to inculcate in the tender minds and hearts of Batang Isabeleño that they belong to a significant sector of the society.



7. Procurement of Medicines and Vitamins for Children

With the aim to promote optional health and well-being of newborns and children in the province of Isabela, the IPHO proposed for augmentation in the procurement of basic medicines and vitamins through the LCPC Fund. The IPHO was granted with the following:

1. Nutrition Program	Procurement of essential drugs (Vit. A and Ferrous Sulfate)
2. TB Program	Procurement of vials Protein Purified Deravactius Test
3. Oral Health Program	Procurement of Varnish Flourish Sachet Toothbrushes and Toothpaste

8. Conduct of Slogan Contest

Pursuant to Presidential Proclamation No. 647, “Declaring the Month of October of Every Year as the National Statistics Month, “the nsm is annually observed nationwide. The Provincial Government of Isabela in coordination with the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), joins the celebration of 29<sup>th</sup> National Statistics Month (NSM) with the theme “Exploring Philippine Wonders in Number: Statistics towards Sustainable Tourism Development”. Aside from hanging of streamers, a Slogan Contest was conducted tied-up with the Provincial Youth Development office who looks into the potentials of youth focusing on their capabilities of sharing and bringing out their talents.

9. Children’s Month Celebration

In recognition of the imperative role of children in Nation building, Republic Act No. 10661 Declares the month of November of every year as national Children’s Month. The declaration seeks to instill its significance in the Filipino consciousness. The theme for 2018 was “ **Isulong: Tamang Pag-aaruga para sa lahat ng bata!**”.

The Provincial Government of Isabela through the Provincial Council for the Protection of children. Conducted the celebration of children’s month with the different activities for Batang Isabeleño from all walks of life, with the localized theme: **Dito sa Isabela, Isinusulong Tamang pag-aaruga at Oportunidad para sa mga bata**”.

Different Fun-Filled and informative activities for children was conducted through a three-day activity.

Towards this and, the state shall adopt policy ensuring the rehabilitation, self-development and self-reliance of Persons with Disabilities. It shall develop their skills and potentials to enable them to compete favorably for available opportunities.

They also have the same rights as other people to take their proper place in society, likewise be able to live freely and independently as possible.

3. Income Generating Ortho Shop



The Isabela Federation of PWDs is provided with the opportunity to earn additional source of income through the Orthopedic Shop it is recognized as the only ortho shop in the region. It is funded by the Provincial Government of Isabela with a starting capital of P 1M. The program now serves as Livelihood Source of IFPWD's and its members.



4. Provision of Basic Skills Training for PWDs



Elderly Welfare



The establishment of the Provincial Model Senior Citizen Center is in accordance with Republic Act 7876 otherwise known as Senior Citizens Act. It was completed under the administration and leadership of the former Provincial Governor Hon. Benjamin G. Dy on March 13, 1998. The Model Senior Citizen Center is a place where senior citizens of Isabela particularly all thirty six (36) FSCAP Presidents and OSCA Heads from the different cities/municipalities get together to discuss common interests, issues and concerns. It also provides a venue for socio-recreational and other needs of elderly. It has two (2) rooms that serve as an office space, a conference hall that can accommodate sixty (60) to eighty(80) senior citizens, living room, infirmary, kitchen & dining area and two(2) restrooms with handrails and buzzers in case of emergency. Its entrance is installed with a SC/PWD ramp plus a landscaped garden that provides beauty, convenience and comfort whoever visits the Center.

**1. Awarding of Cash Assistance to Centenarians**



The Provincial Government of Isabela (PGI) gives recognition/honor to senior-citizens(SC) in the province who are 100 years old or older. Centennial Awarding is being conducted during the annual Elderly Filipino Week Celebration every October of the year. An Isabeleno -Centennial Awardee receives a one-time cash award of P 10,000, a gift/token and a wheelchair/cane. This breakthrough program of the PGI aims to recognize contribution of SC in the history and development of Isabela and to honor them for reaching the milestone and historic age of hundred years.

**2. Provision of Assistive Devices**



It is a priority of the PGI to provide assistive devices such as wheelchairs, canes and walkers to help senior citizens with their mobility and safety.

**3. Availment of Livelihood Assistance**

Every Senior Citizens Association from the different municipalities/cities of Isabela are entitled to receive an amount of P100,000 capital loan through the Provincial Cooperative Development Office(PCDO) as livelihood assistance that will benefit all SC members of their organization in their respective locality. This refers to the provision of opportunities of senior citizens to become productive and share their expertise to all members.

**4. Provision of Transportation Allowance**



Recognizing the importance of elderly in the province, the Provincial Government of Isabela provides travel allowance to every FSCAP President and OSCA Head and provincial officer amounting to P1,000 per quarter who comes to attend for the provincial regular meeting. This is one way to ease their burden from spending for their fare and one way to encourage them to join in the meeting so as to benefit from the association and be updated in senior citizen related activities.

**5. Annual Celebration of Elderly Filipino Week**



The Provincial Government thru the PSWD Office and FSCAP- Isabela Chapter annually conducts Elderly Filipino Week(EFW) every 1<sup>st</sup> week of October. This activity is one way of re-affirming the traditional high regard for the elderly and to pay tribute to our older persons’ sector for their valuable efforts in the province. Annually, 1,000 senior citizens from the different municipalities/cities gather together to show-off their talents and creativity, mingle with other senior citizens, share their wealth of experiences, wisdom, somehow bringing back their self-esteem during the celebration.

**6. Attendance to seminars/trainings related to Senior Citizen concerns**



Isabela Senior Citizens officers are given opp related to elderly concerns in order to gain insights other older persons in their respective munici Implementation, Centenary Acts of 2016, Anti-Age were extensively disseminated.



**7. Educational Field Trip cum Info Drive on Senior Citizen related laws**

Officers of the Isabela Senior Citizen Organization (ISCO) conducted an Educational Field Trip to Three (3) coastal areas of Isabela namely: Palanan, Divilacan and Maconacon on May 26 – 29, 2018. The group conducted an Information Drive among Senior Citizens particularly on SC related laws and programs services of the Provincial Government of Isabela. The Activity was a productive one because not only the Local Chief Executives (LCES) welcomed the group but also their respective Office of the Senior Citizens Association of the Philippines (ISCAP) Presidents and their officials. It was also a venue for all senior citizen participants to know the different programs from national to local that will benefit them.

Administrative Code of 1991 mandates the DSWD to provide a balanced approach to welfare whereby the needs and interest of the population are addressed not only at the outbreak of crisis but more importantly at the stage that would inexorably lead to such crisis. The Provincial Government of Isabela thru the Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office, as the welfare arm of the government, provide immediate and appropriate interventions to help individuals and families cope with social, psychological, physical and economic problems arising from crisis situations.
