Psycho-Social Care Services	<ul> <li>Provision of therapeutic activities/psychological wellness accorded by the Mental Health Practitioners.</li> <li>One (1) newly admitted client have referred for psychological assessment while 3 clients have undergone psychological therapy session to registered Psychologist.</li> <li>Mental Health Practitioners have conducted group dynamics to 16 residents. Social Workers/Mental Health Practitioners have rendered small talk/counseling to clients</li> </ul>	

	with PTSD and psychological distress.	
III. Educational Services	<ul> <li>Fifteen (15) residents have provided with school allowances, supplies, uniforms, and other school needs and projects.</li> <li>Assisted one (1) minor for tertiary admission test at Isabela State University, Jones Campus.</li> <li>Fifteen (15) clients are officially enrolled in public school and college, five (5) of whom are elementary graders, six (6) are in Junior High School, one (1) enrolled in Alternative Learning System (ALS), two (2) are in Senior High School and one (1) is currently enrolled in college.</li> <li>House Parents have assisted six (6) Junior High School students with the submission of the answered learning modules and projects to their respective class advisers.</li> </ul>

Health Services	<ul> <li>Provision of food supplement/vitamins have provided to all residents and two (2) babies.</li> <li>Assisted two (2) residents for their first booster of Covid-19 vaccine at IPHO.</li> <li>Continuation of immunization of two (2) babies (BCG, Hepa. B, DPT-Hepa. B-HiB, OPV, IPV, PCV, and MMR) and continuous intake of vitamins.</li> <li>Monthly physical check-up including checking of height and weight to all residents for health monitoring.</li> <li>Brought one (1) minor to GFNDY for medical check-up.</li> </ul>	
V. Legal Services	<ul> <li>Assisted one (1) minor for the execution of sworn statement.</li> <li>Requested a copy of Information, Resolution and other legal documents (for new clients) at the office of the Provincial Prosecutor.</li> <li>Four (4) court hearings have attended by the Social Workers, at RTC Br. 21, 23 and 24.</li> <li>Registered Psychologist testified in court.</li> </ul>	
VI. Spiritual Services and Value Inculcation	<ul> <li>All staff and residents have undergone recollection activities for Spiritual growth and values formation.</li> <li>All residents have their group daily prayer and devotion(evening and morning).</li> <li>House Parents have facilitated the Bible sharing together with the residents every weekend.</li> </ul>
