	Care Services	conducted two (2) group dynamics to all the residents except the two (2) babies.  One (1) newly admitted client was referred to Doc. Kathreen Joson for Psychological Testing, Assessment and Evaluation. One (1) client has also undergone re-assessment.  Three (3) residents participated in group counseling of Doc. Charibel Matalang.  Four (4) residents have undergone individual counseling conducted by the two resident Psychometricians.  Nine (9) residents accompanied by HP on Duty attended the recognition day in Alibagu National High School to receive their awards.  Asynchronous class was implemented by the Department of Education for the elementary pupils. They attended only eight (8) face to face classes for the month of April 2024.  Provision of daily school needs including other expenses for projects are provided to all seventeen (17) learners enrolled in formal education & Alternative Learning System.  Eleven (11) residents have undergone pap smear at RHU-II, City of Ilagan, Isabela while two (2) have undergone urinalysis at GFNDY hospital. There were also two (2) residents who availed tooth extraction at the GFNDY.  One (1) baby was brought to the hospital due to skin allergy.  A resident was brought to the EENT due to a lump below her chin. It was diagnosed as a boil.  One (1) of the residents was brought to GFNDY because of sleepless nights but she was instead referred for a Psychiatric Evaluation.
