VALIDATION OF SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS FOR 1 ST SEMESTER OF AY 2021- 2022	BRO for Education closed the scholarship application for the 1st Semester of Academic Year 2021-2022 on September 30 and started with the validation process on the month of October. With the two-way process, applications submitted to the respective Local Youth Development Officers were also collected by BRO-Ed staff while some were directly submitted to the BRO-Ed Office to undergo validation.	By the end of the application period, a total of 28,286 online applications were received by the BRO for Education. The validation process is still ongoing and an estimate of 8,000 applications are already validated by the BRO-Ed team.

TEEN CENTER VALIDATION SANTIAGO CITY, ISABELA

(November 8-10, 2021)

In its fourth year of implementation, the City Government of Santiago held its 2021 Search for the Most Innovative and Sustainable Teen Center (Community-based) in the city.

The Search aims to provide a "safe place for the Santiagueno adolescents/youth [for them to] access right information and services what will [foster] a holistic development."

During this year's Search, OIC-PYDO was invited to be one of the members of the Board of Judges where they visited 37 Community-based Teen Centers located in various barangays.

Along with Mr. Resposo as members of the Board of Judges are:

Tierra, Pediatrician/Medical Specialist from the Southern Isabela Medical Center

During the three-day activity, Mr. Resposo, along with other members of the Board of Judges, visited the 37 barangays for their Community-based Teen Centers to conduct their on-site validation.

The validation process involves scrutiny of the functionality of the facility, its accessibility and sustainability, and the innovative services it provides for the adolescent and youth within the community.

The Awarding Ceremony of the Search was held on the November 19, 2021 which was also attended by the members of the Board of Judges.

NATIONAL YOUTH COMMISSION SANA ALL NO MORE WAVE 2 REGION 2

(November 10, 2021)

Through a DILG Memorandum reiterating the request of the National Youth Commission North Luzon Cluster, all Sangguniang Kabataan Officials, all Local Youth Development Officers, all Local Youth Development Council Members. Peer Educators. KKDAT and KK Members were enjoined to attend the "Sana All No More Wave 2" Webinar for Region 2 which was held via Zoom conference.

Sana All No More is a Webinar series for all SKs. LYDOs and LYDC members which tackles mainly updates from the National Youth Commission and issues concerning the youth in general.

LYDOs, led by the OIC-PYDO, Mr. Resposo, attended the Sana All No More Wave 2 of the National Youth Commission along with SK Officials and Federation Presidents, led by the SK Provincial Federation President, Hon. Dax Paolo C. Binag.

As a second installment of the Webinar Series, Sana All No More Wave 2 focused on briefing the participants on "the pressing problems of the youth todav."

ORAS NG KABATAAN (OK) ISABLEÑO PILOT SESSION: A **VIRTUAL LEARNING SESSION FOR SKs AND**

(November 12 – 13, 2021)

With the PYDO's thrust to provide technical assistance to Sangguniang Kabataan Officials and Local Youth Development Officers on the fulfillment of their roles and responsibilities, the Office organized the OK Isabeleño's Pilot Session which is a Virtual Learning Session for SK Federation Presidents, SK Chairpersons, and Local Youth Development Officers on DILG and NYC Monitoring and Evaluation Forms as prescribed on DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2020-138.

Also discussed during the Learning Session are the forms required by DILG MC No. 2020-113 and DILG MC 2021-113 which are SK, LYDC, and LYDO Directories, and the Registration to NYC's SK Web Portal.

The OK Isabeleño Pilot Session is a 2day Learning Session solely for SK President, SK Chairpersons, and Local Youth Development Officers.

Day 1 (November 12, Friday) of the Session was allotted to participants from Districts 1, 2, and 3 while Day 2 (November 13, Saturday) was for participants from Districts 4. 5, and 6.




