VALIDATION OF SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS FOR 1ST SEMESTER OF AY 2021-2022	<p>BRO for Education closed the scholarship application for the 1st Semester of Academic Year 2021-2022 on September 30 and started with the validation process on the month of October.</p> <p>With the two-way process, applications submitted to the respective Local Youth Development Officers were also collected by BRO-Ed staff while some were directly submitted to the BRO-Ed Office to undergo validation.</p>	<p>By the end of the application period, a total of 28,286 online applications were received by the BRO for Education.</p> <p>The validation process is still ongoing and an estimate of 5,000 applications are already validated by the BRO-Ed team.</p>



Organizations need to renew their registration every three years and shall submit an accomplishment report annually.</p>	<p>As of July 2021, there are fifteen (15) Youth and Youth-Serving Organizations registered under the Provincial and NYC Youth Organization Registration Program.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. 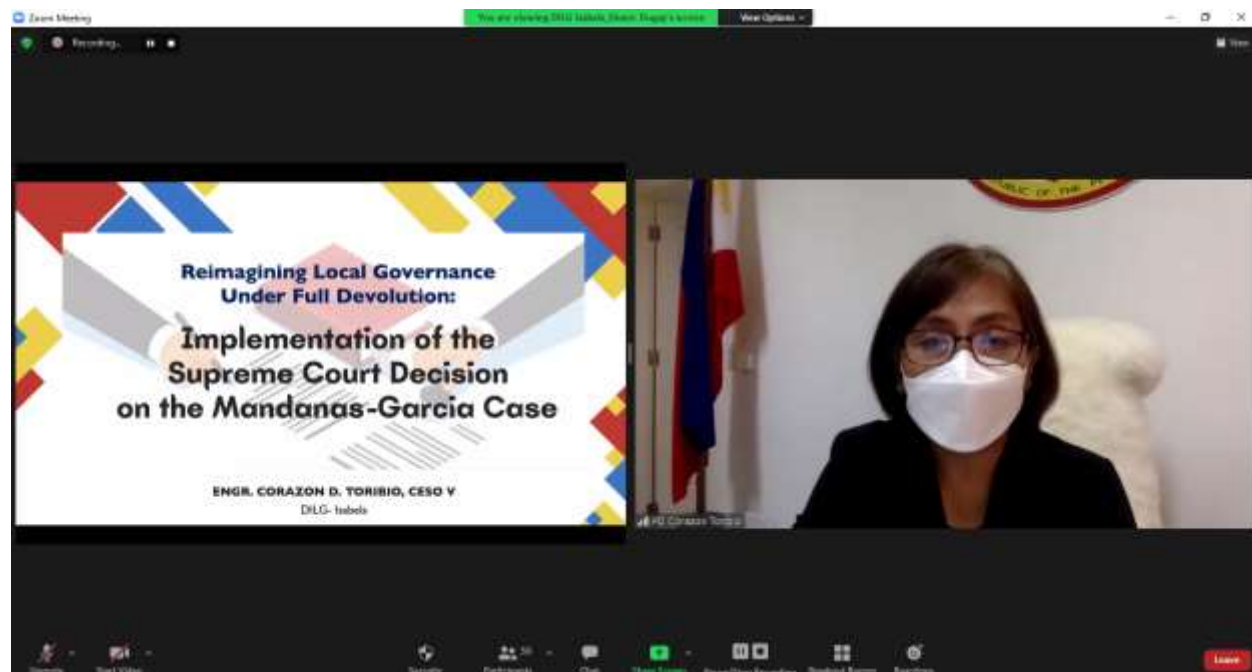

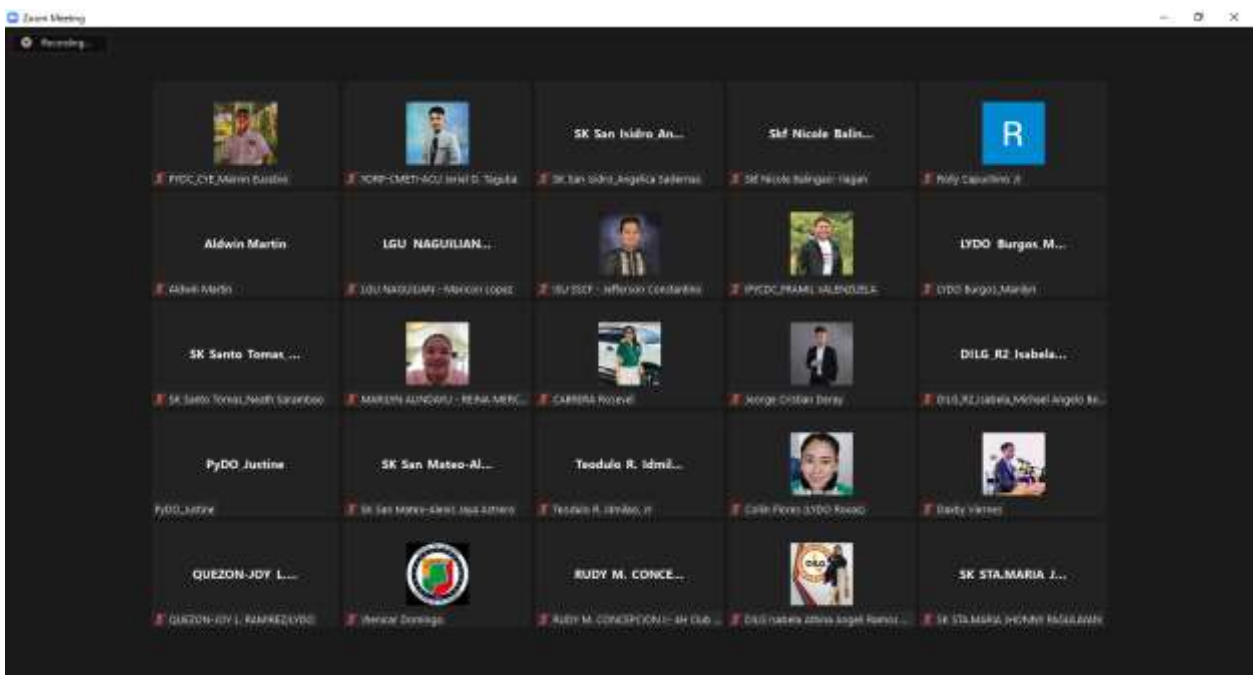
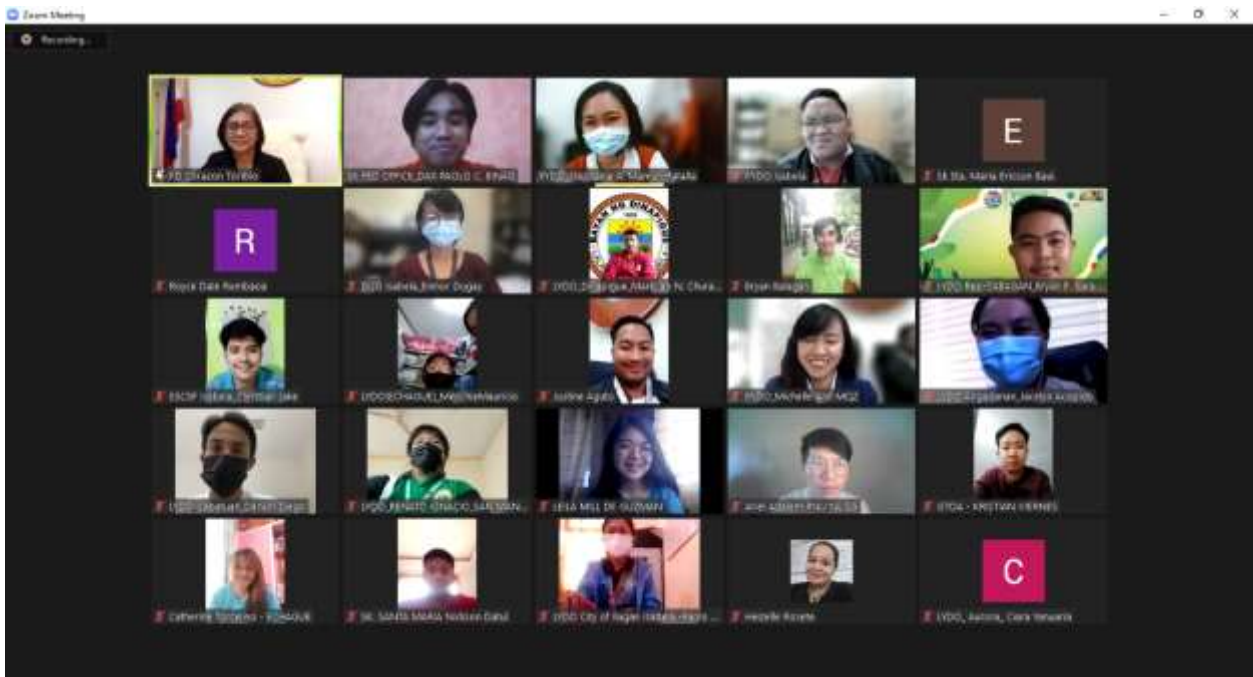
