<b>VALIDATION OF SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS FOR 1<sup>ST</sup> SEMESTER OF AY 2021-2022</b>	<p>BRO for Education closed the scholarship application for the 1<sup>st</sup> Semester of Academic Year 2021-2022 on September 30 and started with the validation process on the month of October.</p> <p>With the two-way process, applications submitted to the respective Local Youth Development Officers were also collected by BRO-Ed staff while some were directly submitted to the BRO-Ed Office to undergo validation.</p>	<p>By the end of the application period, a total of <b>28,286 online applications</b> were received by the BRO for Education.</p> <p>The validation process is still ongoing and an estimate of <b>20,000 applications is already validated</b> by the BRO-Ed team.</p>


