

Recommend policies through resolutions based on their identified youth issues and concerns during the National Youth Parliament – Cluster Level; 2. Increase the level of awareness of young people on youth issues and concerns anchored on the PYDP, government interventions in addressing these issues and identification of gaps that will serve as basis in crafting resolutions. 3. Learn and appreciate the parliamentary process being used in the Philippine Legislative System. <p>Locally, the 13th NYP Region II Assembly in Isabela aims to highlight the support of the provincial government to youth development and exhibit the culture and warmth of the people of Isabela while at the same time</p>	<p>The 13th NYP Regional Assembly for Region II was participated in by 150 Youth Leaders from Region II. Participants arrived at the Hotel Sophia on the morning of July 28 for their accommodation and went straight to the Isabela Convention Center for the program proper.</p> <p>The Opening Ceremonies was attended by the NYC Commissioner-at-Large Asec.
