CREATION & MANDATE

CREATION

The Provincial Youth Development Office of the Province of Isabela is a separate division under the Office of the Governor.

It was created in 2016 by virtue of Executive Order No. 37 issued by then Governor Faustino G. Dy III, and through a Budget Ordinance passed by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan, in compliance with Republic Act 10742 or the Sangguniang Kabataan Reform Law of 2015.

MANDATE

As provided for by the provision of Republic Act 107472 or the SK Reform Law of 2015 and its Implementing Rules and Regulations, the Provincial Youth Development Office shall have the following functions:

- a. Register and verify youth and youth-serving organizations (subject to the revitalized YORP guidelines);
- b. Provide Technical Assistance to the PYDC;
- c. Facilitate the election of the PYDC representatives;
- d. Serve as the secretariat to the PYDC and as such, shall provide the necessary administrative, operational, staff, and technical support;
- e. Conduct the mandatory and continuing training of PYDC members in accordance with the programs jointly designed and implemented by the Commission and DILG;
- f. Provide technical, logistical, and other support in the conduct of the mandatory and continuing training programs, and to such other programs of the Commission and DILG;
- g. Coordinate with the Commission in terms of policy and PPA guidance;
- h. Assist the M/CYDO in the training of the SK Officers; and,
- i. Perform such other functions as may be prescribed by law, ordinance, or as the LCE, the DILG, or the Commission may require.



BRO-Ed Provincial Scholarship Program is a program for the sons and daughters of small farmers under which every farming family is guaranteed a college scholarship slot as a special assistance to farmers who dream of having at least one college graduate in the family. This aims at reducing financial burdens of farmers in the education of their children, motivating them towards greater productivity. This is integrated with the Provincial Scholarship Program as a policy of the provincial government.

YOUTH ORGANIZATION REGISTRATION PROGRAM (YORP)


YORP is a program of the National Youth Commission that facilitates the registration of the Youth and Youth-Serving Organizations to ensure access and participation to NYC-initiated programs nationwide, and recognize the contributions of these organizations to nation-building.

As a registration incentive, the PGI awards a 10,000 project grant to the Youth and Youth-Serving Organization after successful accreditation and registration under the Development Incentives for Thriving Organizations of Youth in Isabela (DITOY Isabela) program.

PROVINCIAL YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PLAN & ISABELA YOUTH CODE IMPLEMENTATION

The PYDO, along with the Office of the SK Provincial Federation President and the Council NAGKAISA – PYDC, is also tasked to craft, implement, and monitor the implementation of the different programs, projects, and activities (PPAs) under the three-year Provincial Youth Development Plan (PYDP) of the province as well as the provisions of Sangguniang Panlalawigan Ordinance No. 2020-03-02 also known as the Isabela Youth Welfare and Development Code.

The Office serving as the secretariat to the PYDC is also tasked to provide mandatory and continuing training through any form of technical or logistical assistance and capacity-building of its members, SK Officials, youth leaders, and organizations which is also a part of the Provincial Youth Development Plan.



With the goal to standardize the application process, the BRO for Education Coordinators and Focal Persons from among the five extension and satellite offices, led by the Provincial Youth Development Office, devised a system maximizing the online platform to ease the encoding process of scholars' information into the scholarship database while re-establishing the customary in-person interview and orientation during the submission of documentary requirements.

Under the newly-implemented application process, the growing number of scholars was considered and as a mechanism to ensure the sustainability of the program, a predetermined number of slots per city/municipality was

allocated depending on the number of scholars in each local government unit for the previous semester. With this, a first come first serve system was implemented and an online pre-registration was established to verify if a City/Municipality has reached its assigned number of slots already.

All applicants who have pre-registered online submitted their requirements to the Provincial Youth Development Office and to any of the extension offices. Upon submission, documentary requirements were reviewed and applicants are interviewed. Upon the verification of the completeness and authenticity of the documents, applications are accepted by the coordinators and applicants are given an Orientation on the scholarship program.

After the scheduled submission of applications, extension offices then started submitting forms to the PYDO for sorting and evaluation. Forms were further assessed and sorted per City/Municipality. The Office recorded a total of **29,231 applications** for the 2nd Semester of AY 2022-2023.

PROGRAM (YORP) OF ISABELA

DATE/S: Year-round

VENUE: Provincial Youth Development Office

DESCRIPTION:

Youth and Youth-Serving Organizations whose members and operations are under the Provincial Level are encouraged to register to the Youth Organization Registration Program – Isabela (YORPi) with the same list of requirements necessary to the registration to the National Youth Commission Youth Organization Registration Program (YORP).

Once registered under the YORPi, the Provincial Youth Development Office, through the PYDO Focal Person on YORP, uploads the required documents of the Youth and Youth-Serving Organization to the NYC YORP Hub for Verification.

After which, verified Organizations are given a Unique Registration Number as their identification to the NYC's database of YOs and YSOs. Organizations need to renew their registration every three years and shall submit an annual accomplishment report.

Registered Youth and Youth-Serving Organizations are awarded a Certificate of Accreditation from the provincial government through the PYDO and a Certificate of Registration from the National Youth Commission.

OBJECTIVES:

The YORPi aims to:

 Encourage Kabataang Isabeleños' participation in all of the Isabela Provincial Youth Development Office's plans, programs, projects, and activities as well as other opportunities by registering and verifying youth and youth-serving organizations.



- 2. Establish communication network among Kabataang Isabeleños and other youth development stakeholders.
- 3. Establish a youth and youth-serving organizations directory in Isabela that would disseminate updates on youth-related programs, projects, and activities and would provide a structure that links youth and youth-serving organizations together.

ACTUAL ACCOMPLISHMENT

As of December 2023, there are Sixty-five (65) Youth and Youth-Serving Organizations registered under the YORP – Isabela and the National Youth Commission.







ACTUAL ACCOMPLISHMENT

A. INTERNATIONAL YOUTH DAY CELEBRATION THANKSGIVING MASS AND BUWAN NG KABATAAN KICK-OFF ACTIVITY

August 12, 2023

Provided under RA 10742, or the Sangguniang Kabataan Reform Act of 2015, that there must be, in every Municipality, City, and Province, a celebration of the Linggo ng Kabataan where the International Youth Day – August 12 – lies.

In celebration of the International Youth Day, the provincial government, through the Provincial Youth Development Office and the Office of the SK Provincial Federation President, sponsored a Thanksgiving Mass held at the GFNDy Sr. Hall, Isabela Provincial Capitol.

Right after the mass, the 2023 Buwan ng Kabataan Celebration was officially launched through the unveiling of the BNK Logo and a discussion of the theme, "Green Skills for Youth: Towards a Sustainable World" by Ms. Racquel M. Caldez of DENR-PENRO Isabela. She brought along with her the brand ambassadors of DENR Isabela, Pawi and Isa.

A representative from the National Youth Commisssion Pampanga Area Office, Mr. Wilfredo N. Carba discussed the programs of the National Youth Commission as well as the different opportunities offered to the Filipino Youth by the Commission.



PROJECT RATIONALE



Rivero, the Assistant Provincial Social Welfare and Development Officer.

After the tabulation of points given by paper evaluators during the Bid Book Judging, Gawad Ulirang Kabataan winners and outstanding awardees for every category were posted online through the PYDO Isabela facebook page. Those who are qualified for the panel interview were notified through email and text message.

Five entries which got the highest ranking for every category went through the panel interview to determine who among them shall receive the most outstanding recognition.



II. PROJECT RATIONALE

Sangguniang Panlalawigan Ordinance No. 2020-03-02 also known as the Isabela Youth Welfare and Development Code provides that in order to recognize and highlight the exemplary performance, role, contributions, accomplishments, and dedication to service of Isabeleño youth and youth organizations in helping people and communities towards meaningful participation in local governance and nation-building, there shall be a yearly search for the most outstanding youth and/or youth organization tagged as Gov. Rodolfo T. Albano III GAWAD ULIRANG KABATAAN: Pagkilala sa mga Natatanging Organisasyon ng Kabataang Isabeleño.

Now on its third year, the Search takes inspiration from the Department of the Interior and Local Government's Seal of Good Local Governance (SGLG), the National Youth Commission (NYC)'s Philippine Youth Development Plan Ten Centers of Participation, the Philippines Sangguniang Kabataan Awards of the Philippines Youth Development Network (PYDN) and Galing Pook Foundation, and the Ten Accomplished Youth Organization (TAYO) Foundation in recognizing the valuable efforts and contributions in nation-building of Sangguniang Kabataan, Local Youth Development Councils and Offices, and Youth Organizations in the province while also supporting and preparing them to take the national stage, participate, and be the province's entry to these youth development recognition platforms.

This year's Gawad Ulirang Kabataan centers on recognizing organizations, i.e., Sangguniang Kabataan Councils, Local Youth Development Councils, and Youth Organizations, which have maximized and amplified youth participation within their communities through their efforts and accomplishments for the past years, particularly with the strengthened implementation of youth development legislations, primarily that of Republic Act 10742 or the Sangguniang Kabataan Reform Act of 2015.

III. PROJECT OBJECTIVES

3rd GRTA Gawad Ulirang Kabataan, in its resolute pursuit of excellence among the Isabeleño youth, and in recognition of the vital contributions of youth organizations in positively affecting the lives of those within their communities, is again in search for outstanding youth through youth organizations and initiatives.

Specifically, it aims to achieve the following:

- Recognize the exemplary accomplishments and efforts of youth organizations to promote youth development and inspire youth participation in communities.
- Encourage more Kabataang Isabeleños to engage in youth organizations to which they can identify their talents and advocacies with, hence, promoting the power of achieving one's goals through a collective.





3. Foster a supportive environment for the Isabeleño youth where their initiatives to influence and mobilize other Kabataans are recognized and acknowledged by the local government.

IV. PROJECT DESIGN

A. PROJECT COMPONENTS

This year's 3rd GRTA Gawad Ulirang Kabataan shall have six separate categories in search for outstanding organizations of youth in Isabela, these categories are:

1. Outstanding Sangguniang Kabataan Council

Sangguniang Kabataan members and Officials, after being in service for five years now, shall be ending their terms this year with the upcoming Barangay and SK Elections in October. In recognition of their tireless service to the Kabataang Isabeleños, despite holding office for longer than they have expected, the Gawad Ulirang Kabataan 2023 shall be in search of an outstanding Sangguniang Kabataan Council in the province of Isabela according to the criteria set to assess them.

2. Outstanding Local Youth Development Council

Upon having a new set of Sangguniana Kabataan members and Officials, the Local Youth Development Council of every City, Municipality, and Province shall have to reorganize its membership as well. Through the Local Youth Development Office, election for LYDC new members shall be done shortly after the SK Elections. With this, Gawad Ulirang Kabataan also intends to recognize those Local Youth Development Council which remained committed to the fulfillment of their duties and went beyond what their mandates provide.

3. Outstanding Local Youth Development Office

As the Secretariat of the Local Youth Development Council, and the primary partner of the Office of the Sangguniang Kabataan Federation in the planning and implementation of youth development plans, Local Youth Development Offices are considered as one at the forefronts of youth development in local situation. It is therefore but appropriate to also acknowledge their works through the Gawad Ulirang Kabataan as they thrive in their duties as youth development workers creating endless platforms and opportunities for the youth to engage themselves in the community.

4. Outstanding Youth Organization

Mobilizing the youth can be one of the many challenges faced by different youth development workers and advocates, and one most effective way to connect to them and encourage their participation is through their



organizations. It is also through organizations that the youth can express and share his goals and advocacies to the bigger community. With the provincial government's most dependable volunteers predominantly coming from youth organizations, Gawad Ulirang Kabataan aims to recognize these organizations as appreciation of their commitment to their advocacies and to the empowerment of the Kabataang Isabeleños.

5. Outstanding Sangguniang Kabataan Project

Acknowledging that Kabataang Isabeleños are innovative and productive individuals, Gawad Ulirang Kabataan shall also be searching for outstanding and sustainable SK Project in the barangay where SK Councils can also be recognized for.

6. Outstanding Youth Organization Project

Youth and youth-serving organizations registered under the Youth Organization Registration Program of the provincial government and the National Youth Commission can submit entries for the outstanding youth organization project.

7. Special Recognitions shall also be awarded to the following:

- i. SGLG Awardee LGUs
- ii. Council NAGKAISA Provincial Youth Development Council Members and their organizations as end-term recognition
- iii. Licensure Examination Topnotchers from Isabela
- iv. Lider ni BRO Graduating Officers

B. SEARCH PROCESS AND AWARDS

Finalists shall be chosen in each category. Among the finalists, ten outstanding entries shall be selected through sets of criteria. From the ten outstanding entries per category, the five with the highest rating shall undergo a panel interview for the determination of the most outstanding awardee.

Each awardee shall be given a GRTA Gawad Ulirang Kabataan **trophy** and a **project grant** which the organization shall use for a program or activity where the PGI shall be invited for the organization's transparent utilization of the grant.

C. PROJECT BENEFICIARIES

The Search shall be open to all Sangguniang Kabataan Councils, Local Youth Development Councils, Local Youth Development Officers, Local Youth Development Officers, and YORP-Registered Youth and Youth-Serving Organizations in the province of Isabela.

- Deadline of submission for the document screening shall be announced through the PYDO Facebook page on a later date.
- Criteria for the paper screening shall be based on the youth development criteria and scorecard.
- Submitted portfolio will undergo document verification. A call from our screening committee to interview and further validate documents may be conducted.
- Entries that will garner an average score of 80% (with 100% being the highest score) will be included in the roster of finalists. From among the finalists, the ten (10) outstanding entries per category shall be determined by a panel of paper evaluators.
- The ten (10) outstanding entries shall undergo a panel interview composed of select expert evaluators. From the ranks of the ten outstanding entries, the most outstanding entry shall be determined based from the result of the panel interview.
- 10. The GRTA-GUK Selection Committee will select the awardees across the province, which will be announced through PYDO Isabela facebook page.
- 11. Winners shall receive project cash grants, trophies and plaque of recognition.
- 12. The awardees shall be recognized during an Awarding Ceremony as part of the celebration of the 2023 Buwan ng Kabataan and International Youth Day.
- 13. The decision of the screening and judging committee as to the identification of winners is final and irrevocable.







RATIONALE

Republic Act 11935 signed last October 2022 moved the conduct of the Barangay and Sangguniang Kabataan Elections from December 2022 to the first Monday of October 2023. OBJECTIVES:

An annual gathering of Isabeleño Youth leaders, the 6th Provincial Youth Summit aims to further strengthen the foundation of youth participation in local governance particularly in the provincial level. Specifically, it aims to:

 Reorganize the Council NAGKAISA – Provincial Youth Development Council (PYDC) by convening all registered youth and youth-serving organizations in the province and facilitate the election of the new Council NAGKAISA members among them;

- 2. Conduct the mandatory training program of newly-elected PYDC members and their oath-taking ceremony thereafter;
- 3. Facilitate the mandatory training of the new SK Pederasyon Presidents through a more in-depth discussion of their duties and responsibilities, particularly that of the Panlalawigang Pederasyon Officers; and,
- 4. Foster an effective working relationship among and between SK Officials and PYDC Members through team-building activities.

ACTUAL ACCOMPLISHMENT

Pursuant to Section 24(j) of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act 10742, which states that "the Local Youth Development Officer (LYDO)... shall notify all the presidents or authorized representatives of the registered youth organizations or youth-serving organizations in the locality, assemble them in a public venue, and by consensus or secret balloting... shall choose at least eight (8) but not more than nineteen (19) representatives [who] shall serve for a term of three years in the LYDC," the

provincial government, through the Provincial Youth Development Office, conducted the 6th Provincial Youth Summit where the new set of PYDC members were elected and have undergone Mandatory Training.

As an annual gathering of youth in the province of Isabela, the 6th PYS aimed to ensure that members of the Sangguniang Kabataan and the Provincial Youth Development Council shall be competent and equipped with sufficient knowledge and skills to perform their duties and responsibilities.

In attendance were Sangguniang Kabataan Federation Presidents and representatives of YORP-registered youth and youth-serving organizations in the province.

II. RATIONALE

Republic Act 10742, otherwise known as the Sangguniang Kabataan Reform Act of 2015, as amended by Republic Act 11786, instituted key reforms in the Sangguniang Kabataan, further strengthening youth development and participation in local governance.

One of the salient features of the said reform was the creation of a Local Youth Development Council (LYDC) in all levels of local governance which shall be composed of representatives of youth and youth-serving organizations and whose core members shall be the President and Vice President of the respective Sangguniang Kabataan Pederasyon. As its primary function, the LYDC shall assist in the planning, execution, and monitoring of the implementation of the programs and activities of the SK and the Pederasyon in all levels.

Relative to this, Section 24 (j) of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of RA 10742 mandates that "within forty-five (45) days after SK elections, the Local Youth Development Officer (LYDO)... shall notify all the presidents or authorized representatives of the registered youth organizations or youth-serving organizations in the locality, assemble them in a public venue, and by consensus or secret balloting, they shall choose at least eight (8) but not more than nineteen (19) representatives [who] shall serve for a term of three years in the LYDC."

To ensure that members of the SK and the LYDC shall be competent and equipped with sufficient knowledge and skill to perform their duties and responsibilities, Section 30 of the IRR of RA 10742 further mandates the conduct of a mandatory training for all newly-elected SK officials and LYDC members before they can assume office and attend continuing training programs during their incumbency.

With the recent election of the SK Panlalawigang Pederasyon Officers of the province of Isabela, which took place 30 days after the SK elections, the provincial government, in its commitment to go beyond compliance to the mandates of the law, and as a consistent ally of the Kabataang Isabeleños in championing youth development, shall be conducting the 6TH PROVINCIAL YOUTH SUMMIT with the purpose of electing new members and reorganizing the Council NAGKAISA -Provincial Youth Development Council, conduct its mandatory training simultaneous with the first continuing training of the newly-elected SK Pederasyon Presidents in Isabela, and nurture a team spirit within and between the new generation and breed of Isabeleño youth leaders.





III. OBJECTIVES

An annual gathering of Isabeleño Youth leaders, this year's Provincial Youth Summit aims to further strengthen the foundation of youth participation in local governance particularly in the provincial level.

Specifically, PYS 6.0 aims to:

- Reorganize the Council NAGKAISA Provincial Youth Development Council (PYDC) by convening all registered youth and youth-serving organizations in the province and facilitate the election of the new Council members among them.
- 2. Conduct the mandatory training program of newly-elected PYDC members and their oath-taking ceremony thereafter.
- Facilitate the mandatory training of the new SK Pederasyon Presidents through a more in-depth discussion of their duties and responsibilities, particularly that of the Panlalawigang Pederasyon Officers.
- 4. Foster an effective working relationship among and between SK Officials and PYDC Members through team-building activities.
- Conduct the SK-PYDC Joint Regular Quarterly Meeting for the fourth quarter - its first meeting as a newly reorganized group.

IV. PROJECT DESIGN

A. COMPONENTS

The two-day Provincial Youth Summit 6.0 is specifically designed to guarantee that the youth are not just represented in the local government, but are also more than capable of performing their responsibilities as youth leaders and as stakeholders of nation-building.

1. Election and Reorganization of the Council NAGKAISA – Provincial Youth Development Council

All registered Youth and Youth-Serving Organizations in the province of Isabela, through the database managed and kept by the Provincial Youth Development Office, shall be notified of the upcoming elections with each organization allowed to have their primary representative to participate.







Organizations shall be classified according to their advocacies and through secret balloting, all participating organizations shall elect among themselves two representatives for the following centers of participation/advocacies – except for Global Mobility which shall have one representative only – to maximize the nineteen (19) allowable PYDC members:

- a) Education (2 slots)
- b) Health (2 slots)
- c) Environment (2 slots)
- d) Active Citizenship (2 slots)
- e) Governance (2 slots)
- f) Economic Empowerment (2 slots)
- g) Social Inclusion and Equity (2 slots)
- h) Peace-building and Security (2 slots)
- i) Agriculture (2 slots)
- j) Global Mobility (1 slot)

The election shall be presided over by the newly-elected SK Panlalawigang Pederasyon President in accordance with Section 4 (C) of the NYC Guidelines on the Convening and Election of LYDC Members duly reiterated and supported by DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2018-124.

2. Mandatory Training Program and Oath-taking of newly-elected PYDC Members

Immediately after the election, new member-representatives of the Council NAGKAISA - PYDC shall undergo the mandatory training to be facilitated by the accredited Training Managers from the Provincial Youth Development Office. The components of the training shall be the same from that undertaken by SK Officials before they took their oath.

Lectures will include (a) Decentralization and Local Government; (b) History and Salient Features; (c) Meetings and Resolutions; (d) Planning and Budgeting; and (e) Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards.

3. Mandatory Training for newly-elected SK Pederasyon Presidents

One of the most important roles and privileges of being elected as Pederasyon President is having the opportunity to be seated as an exofficio member of the Sanggunian of their respective Local Government Units. As such, more are expected of them specifically in







the fulfilment of their duty as the primary representative of the youth in local governance and in the halls of legislation.

With this, the provincial government of Isabela, in coordination with the Department of the Interior and Local Government – Isabela, desires to ensure that the Pederasyon Presidents, who shall be in a close working relationship with the province, shall assume their posts with an in-depth understanding of their functions and responsibilities.

Among the subjects to be discussed is the (1) Philippine and Provincial Youth Development Plan for alignment in their LYDP, CBYDP, and ABYIP; (2) Pertinent Forms like the Katipunan ng Kabataan (KK) Profiling and the DILG Monitoring and Evaluation Forms; (3) Budgeting, specifically the process and steps in opening an independent SK Account; (4) Resolution Writing; and, (5) Parliamentary Procedures.

4. SK-PYDC Team Building Activities

The SK, particularly the Pederasyon Presidents, and the members of the Council NAGKAISA — PYDC are two of the primary and core representatives of the youth in governance who were granted the ability and influence to propose policies on youth development. In the province, these organizations are the planning, implementing, and monitoring bodies for youth development programs and projects for the Kabataang Isabeleños.

The provincial government, through the PYDO, deemed it necessary for the SK Pederasyon Presidents and PYDC Members to form and establish a bond and camaraderie as early in their incumbency as possible. With this, the provincial government aims to create an efficient working relationship among youth leaders for the benefit of the Isabeleño Youth.

5. SK - PYDC Joint 4th Regular Quarterly Meeting

During the latter part of the Provincial Youth Summit 6.0, the SK Pederasyon Presidents and the Council NAGKAISA — PYDC shall convene for its Joint 4th Regular Quarterly Meeting — their first official meeting as new SK Officials and PYDC Members.

Among the agenda of the meeting shall be the formal and ceremonial turnover of the accomplishments of the previous Council through the out-going SK Panlalawigang Pederasyon President to the new SK Panlalawigang Pederasyon President and presiding officer of the Council NAGKAISA – PYDC.

This year's Provincial Youth Summit shall focus on the new breed of youth leaders in the province who shall take over the direction of youth development in Isabela. With the hashtags #BagongSK and #BagongPYDC, PYS 6.0 shall benefit the following:

1. YORP-Registered Youth and Youth-Serving Organizations

The 70 YORP-registered Youth and Youth-Serving Organizations in the province shall be allowed to send one primary representative to participate in the LYDC election. Before the election, an orientation of the roles and responsibilities of the PYDC members shall be delivered to the YORP members. Among them, representatives to the Council NAGKAISA — PYDC shall be chosen and elected through secret balloting. After which, only the elected members of the PYDC shall stay for their mandatory training.

2. Newly-elected Sangguniang Kabataan Pederasyon Presidents

The 36 newly-elected SK Pederasyon Presidents shall also be part of the 6th Provincial Youth Summit. DILG Memorandum Circular 2018-124 provides that the SK Pederasyon President and Vice President shall attend the election of the LYDC, with the former as the presiding officer and the latter as witness.

Apart from their mandatory training, which they took prior to their oath-taking, SK Officials are also mandated to attend continuing training programs necessary to the fulfilment of their duties both in their barangays and their respective Local Government Units as an exofficio member of their City/Municipal/Provincial Sanggunian.

Simultaneous with the mandatory training of the PYDC members, SK Pederasyon Presidents shall undergo a continuing training program with emphasis on the pertinent forms required by the National Youth Commission and the DILG which SK Officials, especially SK Presidents, should be knowledgeable of.



OBJECTIVES:

The Provincial Government of Isabela (PGI), through the Provincial Youth Development Office (PYDO), has extended technical support to the Sangguniang Kabataan Federation President and Local Youth Development Office of San Mariano, Isabela by serving as trainers and facilitators during the Midyear General Assembly and Continuing Training cum Formulation of the 2024-2026 Comprehensive Barangay Youth Development Plan (CBYDP) of the San Mariano Sangguniang Kabataan Barangay Chairpersons and other officials.

Primarily, the objective of the program was to assess the accomplishments of the San Mariano Sangguniang Kabataan Councils and formulate their respective CBYDP for the years 2024-2026.

OBJECTIVES:

As mandated under Republic Act 10742 or the SK Reform Act of 2015, amended by Republic Act 11768, newly-elected Sangguniang Kabataan Officials and Local Youth Development Council Members must undergo a Mandatory Training before they can assume Office. Further, the same law provides that one of the functions of Local Youth Development Officers is to facilitate the conduct of these Trainings.

Pursuant to this, the National Youth Commission issued the guidelines for the conduct of the SKMT and the accreditation of LYDOs and their staff as Training Managers, supported by the Department of the Interior and Local Government through DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2023-156.

In consideration of the SK Federation Election which should take place 15 days after the Barangay and SK Elections, Local Government Units, through their LYDOs and Municipal/City Local Government Operations Officers, were given until November 14 to conduct the SKMT and thereafter proceed to the Election of SK City/Municipal Federation Officers and their Oathtaking.

ACTUAL ACCOMPLISHMENT

The City Government of Cauayan, through its Local Youth Development Officer and SK Federation President, requested the assistance of the Provincial Youth Development Office in the conduct of their two-day Sangguniang Kabataan Mandatory Training.



The newly-elected SK Officials were arranged in five separate classes scheduled in two days – November 7 and 9.

OBJECTIVES:

Consistent with the guidelines issued by the National Youth Commission on the conduct of the Sanguniang Kabataan Mandatory Training, those City/Municipal Local Government Units whose Local Youth Development Officers fail to secure a full accreditation shall be taken over by the provincial government provided that the Provincial Youth Development Officer and/or his/her staff pass the accreditation process set by the NYC. Pursuant to this, LGUs with no accredited LYDOs requested the provincial government, through its Local Youth Development Office, to facilitate the Mandatory Training of the newly elected SK Officials in their Municipalities.

ACTUAL ACCOMPLISHMENT

Following the guidelines of the NYC, the Municipalities of Sto. Tomas, Sta. Maria, San Agustin, and San Mariano, having failed to secure a Training Manager, have requested the provincial government, through the PYDO, to facilitate the conduct of their respective SKMTs.

Through the various in-person and online accreditation process approved and conducted by the National Youth Commission, the provincial government, through the PYDO, was able to have four Training Managers with full accreditation in the persons of Mr. Rey Mel C. Resposo, OIC-PYDO, Ms. Stephanie Joy Mamuri-Fatalla, Ms. Michelle Ann Marquez, and Mr. Darius Mark Zabala, all PYDO staff.

OBJECTIVES:

Section 22 (b) of the Revised Rules and Regulations Implementing Republic Act (RA) No. 10742, otherwise known as the Sangguniang Kabataan Reform Act of 2015, as amended by RA No. 11768, states that "the Pederasyon ng mga SK shall, at all levels, elect from among themselves a president, a vice-president, a treasurer, a secretary, and such other officers as they may deem necessary... within fifteen (15) days from the SK elections in the case of the Pambayan and Panglungsod na Pederasyon, and within thirty (30) days in the case of the Panlalawigang Pederasyon. The same rules also tasked the concerned Local Government Operations Officer (LGOO) in coordination with the Election Officer to facilitate the conduct of the elections.

ACTUAL ACCOMPLISHMENT

Facilitated by the Provincial Pederasyon Management Team, the SK Panlalawigang Pederasyon Orientation and Election was held in accordance with the provisions of RA 10742 or the SK Reform Act of 2015, as amended by RA 11768. Thirty-four (34) Sangguniang Kabataan Federation Presidents from Isabela convened to elect the SK Panlalawigang Pederasyon Officers of the province.

Before the election, an orientation was delivered by Mr. Rey Mel C. Resposo who discussed the roles and responsibilities of the Pederasyon as well as their duties in the Provincial Youth Development Council.

The election was spearheaded by the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) – Isabela through its Provincial Director, Engr. Corazon D. Toribio. As members of the Provincial Management Team, Ms. Maria Theresa Araneta-Flores, Provincial Treasurer, and Atty. Francis James E.




















ACTIVITY: 2023 IN-SERVICE TRAINING OF THE DEPARTMENT OF

ACTIVITY: TINIG NG SIERRA MADRE: A FORUM ON ENVIRONMENTAL

CONSERVATION IN COMMEMORATION OF EARTH DAY

DATE/S : April 24, 2023

VENUE: Isabela State University – Echague

OBJECTIVES:

In celebration of this year's Earth Day, the Provincial Government of Isabela, through the Isabela Coastal Development Office, the Provincial Environment and Natural Resources Office, and the Provincial Youth Development Office, in partnership with the Isabela State University, spearheaded the Tinig ng Sierra Madre: A forum on Environmental Protection which aims to raise awareness about the importance of the Northern Sierra Madre Natural Park and the need to exhaust all efforts to protect and preserve the country's last frontier of biodiversity.

The Tinig ng Sierra Madre Forum was participated by 250 stakeholder representatives from the different sectors of society to include local and national government agencies, non-government agencies, youth and student leaders, women, IP, the academe lawyers, barangay officials, and the private and business sector.

ACTUAL ACCOMPLISHMENT

Graced and supported by no less than Isabela 6th Congressional District Representative, Hon. Faustino "Inno" A. Dy V as the Keynote Speaker, Forum participants were able to engage in an open dialogue with the Congressman specifically in relation to House Bill 1214 or the Sierra Madre Conservation and Development Authority Bill, which the Hon. Dy has sponsored before the House of Representatives.

Advocates and experts on the field of Environmental Conservation and Climate Change Adaptation were invited as Resource Persons during the Forum. The Provincial Administrator, Atty. Noel Manuel R. Lopez discussed the Environmental Programs and Projects of the Provincial Government of Isabela. Meanwhile, Regional Director Troy Alexander G. Miano, through

Ms. Kristine A. Wandagan, presented the Overview of Ecotourism Management in the Province of Isabela. For. Nestor S. Lorenzo, DENR Region 2 Park Operations Superintendent, and Ms. Luzviminda U. Rosario DENR Region 2 Ecosystem Management Specialist, presented the Sierra Madre Overview and the Current State of the Coastal Areas in Isabela while Mr. Bondee L. Peñaflor, ISU Cabagan Campus Planning and Development Director of the College of Forestry discussed Climate Change Mitigation and Marine Ecosystems Biodiversity.

As one of the major outputs of the Forum, the Multisectoral Network for Sierra Madre Protection was organized as facilitated by ICDO Head Ms. Gretchen Valdez and PYD Officer-in-Charge Mr. Rey Mel C. Resposo. Another highlight of the Forum was the recitation and signing of the Covenant for the Protection and Conservation of Mother Earth led by Asst. ENRO Rosemarie T. Zabala.



OBJECTIVES:

With RA 11929 or the SGLG Act of 2019, Youth Development is now included as one of the areas for good governance. Since its enactment, this 2023 shall be the second year of its implementation. The four indicators for Youth Development Area include:

- 1. Functional Local Youth Development Council;
- 2. Established Local Youth Development Office;
- 3. Presence of a Local Youth Development Plan; and,
- 4. LGU Support to Youth Development.

ACTUAL ACCOMPLISHMENT

The Provincial Government of Isabela, led by the honorable Vice Governor Faustino G. Dy III, presented its entry to the 2023 Seal of Good Local Governance before the evaluators from the Department of the Interior and Local Government Regional Office 2 during the 2023 SGLG Regional Assessment.

Together with other PGI Offices, the Provincial Youth Development Office and the Office of the SK Provincial Federation President presented the document papers of the provincial government for Youth Development as one of the identified areas of good local governance.

The assessment for Youth Development was facilitated by Ms. Emmalene Kaye Linacero of DILG Region 2, assisted by Mr. Michael Angelo Benigno of DILG-Isabela. As a result, the provincial government successfully passed all four indicators for youth development during the SGLG Regional Assessment.

With the provincial government passing the Regional Assessment, all department heads led by the Provincial Administrator, Atty. Noel Manuel Lopez, welcomed the National Validation Team led by Mr. Paulino C. Lalata, Jr., the Assistant Regional Director of DILG Regional Office I. He was joined by Mr. Victor Bernard S. Ringor, Local Government Operations Officer II of DILG Region I.

The validators were able to visit the Provincial Youth Development Office as one of the youth development facilities for the Isabeleño youth.

PGI's youth development was presented by the Hon. Dax Paolo C. Binag, the SK Provincial Federation President, Mr. Rey Mel C. Resposo, the OIC-PYDO, and Ms. Stephanie Fatalla and Ms. Michelle Marquez, both of whom are PYDO Staff.
