### **ACCOMPLISHMENT and STATUS REPORT**

For the 1<sup>st</sup> Semester 2022-2023

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## I. PROGRAM OVERVIEW

BRO for Education is the local government unit's Provincial Scholarship Program. With, every farmer family is guaranteed a college scholarship slot as a special assistance to small farmers who dream of having at least one college graduate in the family. This aims at reducing the burdens of farmers in the education of their children, and it helps students in empowering their academic and career goals by motivating them towards greater productivity.

The program has three components, the Academic Scholarship Program for those who graduated from Senior High School with honors (With Highest Honors to With Honors) Non-Academic Scholarship Program for those who are interested to pursue college education even without academic honors, and Expanded Scholarship for those who want to pursue their post-graduate studies

### 1.1 GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

The Provincial Scholarship Program aims to:

1. Provide college scholarship opportunities to Isabeleños, prioritizing the sons and daughters of small farmers in the Province.
2. Help families especially small farming and indigent, marginalized or 4PS families to lessen their financial burden in sending their children to college education.
3. Promote and support the "education for all" by providing Isabeleño youth equal educational opportunities.

### 1.2 POLICIES AND GUIDELINES

- A. The BRO for Education is the Provincial Scholarship Program of the Provincial Government of Isabela pursuant to Ordinance No. 07, s. 2018 also known as **'An Ordinance Further Amending Ordinance No. 09, series of 2015 and Adopt a New Policy-grant in order to adjust to the needs of Isabeleño Youth vis-á – vis the implementation of the Republic Act and Republic Act 10533 or Enhanced Basic Education Act of 2013.'** As part of the amended ordinance adopting the new K to 12 policy-guidelines in giving awards and recognition as a new basis in giving incentives/benefits to students/scholars who graduated with Honors (Academic

- Scholar) With Highest Honors Php 5, 000.00, With High Honors Php 4,000.00 and With Honors Php 3,000.00 during Senior High Scholl, semestral allowance shall be granted while for those who graduated from Senior High School without honors (Non-Academic Scholar) a Book and Lodging Allowance amounting Php 3,000.00 shall be granted for every semester.
- B.** The BRO for Education is the Provincial Scholarship Program of the Provincial Government of Isabela pursuant to Ordinance No. 2020-04-1, s. 2020 also known as '**An Ordinance Further Amending Ordinance No. 04, series of 2008 titled " An Ordinance establishing a Revised Provincial Scholarship Program"**' seeks to further widen the scope of the Scholarship Program to accommodate students of post-graduate studies taking up a degree in Master's, Law, Medicine, and Religion and Theology. Semestral Allowance shall be granted for those who taking up a Doctorate degree, Medicine, Law, Theology, and Religious Course amounting to Php 10,000.00, and for those who taking up a Master's Degree semestral allowance shall be granted amounting Php 5,000.00
- C.** BRO for Education guarantees a scholarship college slot as a special assistance to small farmers who dream of having at least one college graduate in marginalized/indigent families. This aims at reducing the financial burdens of small farmers in the education of their children, motivating them towards greater productivity.
- D.** The "At least One Scholar per Farming and Marginalized Family" shall be adopted as a policy of the BRO-ED Provincial Scholarship Program.

**AN ORDINANCE FURTHER AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 04, SERIES OF 2008 TITLED "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A REVISED PROVINCIAL SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

**WHEREAS**, it is the policy of the Provincial Government of Isabela to accord its youth with access to quality and affordable education;

**WHEREAS**, this policy is realized thru the enactment of Ordinance No. 04, series of 2008 which institutionalized the Scholarship Program of the Province and other various amendatory ordinances which improved and widened the scope of such program;

**WHEREAS**, this legislative measure seeks to further widen the scope of the Scholarship Program to accommodate students of post-graduate studies taking up a degree on: Masters, Law, Medicine, and Religion and Theology;

**SECTION 4. Goal and Objectives:**

To adapt to the new developments in the academic sector and continuously cater the needs of Isabeleño youth through the BRO for Education, Provincial Scholarship Program.

Specifically, It shall have the following objectives:


1. Adopt a new policy-grant of providing book, lodging, and other academic allowances to students/scholars enrolled in any SUC within the province in the amount of Php3,000.00;
2. Adopt the new K to 12 policy-guidelines in giving awards and recognition as a new basis in giving incentives/benefits to students/scholars such as for with highest honors, Php 5,000.00; with high honors, Php 4,000.00; and with honors, Php3,000.00;
3. Continue to grant tuition fee assistance to students/scholars enrolled in any private school within the province with the maximum of Php 3,000.00;
4. Uphold the policy of the scholarship program of granting at least one scholar per family with special focus on the sons and daughters of small farmers and indigents;
5. Request for the amendment of the existing Provincial Scholarship Ordinance.
6. Adopt a policy and implement programs which shall provide assistance to students taking up post-graduate studies.

**SECTION 5.** Any provision/s of any ordinance inconsistent herewith is hereby amended, modified, or repealed accordingly.

**SECTION 6.** This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.



\*Shown in the table is the summary of the BRO-ED scholars and the amount paid by the Provincial Government of Isabela since the program started in 2010. It can be seen in the table that from an average of 15,000 scholars, the Provincial Government of Isabela has now an average of 30,000 scholars per semester.

#### IV. QUALITATIVE PERFORMANCE

1. A total of **34,426** BRO-ED scholars have applied for 1<sup>st</sup> Semester 2022-2023
2. There are **9,445** scholars who are under the Academic Component.
3. **1,070** scholars are under the Expanded Component.
4. There are **23, 639** who are Non- Academic scholars.
5. There are **20,851** who are children of farmers.
6. **13,847** are from non-farming families.
7. The City of Ilagan, the Municipalities of Tumauni, and Cabagan have the highest number of BRO-ED scholars.
8. A total amount of **Php 109,414,000.000** worth of allowances are spent for the 1<sup>st</sup> Semester 2022-2023.
9. A total of **32 LGUs** visited for the release of Allowances in the 1<sup>st</sup> Semester of 2021-2022, except for **Four (4)** Coastal Towns of Isabela (Dinapigue, Divilacan, Maconacon, and Palanan).
10. The payroll of allowances for 1<sup>st</sup> Semester 2022-2023 is already processed, and ready for release.
