HOSPITAL PROFILE

The Cauayan District Hospital is a government owned and operated hospital under the leadership of Gov. Rodolfo T. Albano III, Provincial Governor, Isabela. It is a Level I Health facility with an Authorized Bed Capacity (ABC) of 50 beds while it's Actual / Implementing Beds reaches 115 beds.

Cauayan District Hospital is a Philippine Hospital Association member of good standing, PhilHealth (PHIC) and Animal Bite Treatment Center accredited.

The institution has been serving as the core-referral hospital previously of District III municipalities and after Cauayan City was reapportioned to District VI, additional municipalities are now being catered to. This does not prevent however, non-member municipalities from bringing in their patients for various health care services.

VISION

In order to be more responsive and effective to the changes and challenges of times and to the constantly increasing demands for affordable healthcare services from our clientele, the Cauayan District Hospital envisions to be operational as One Hundred (100) bed capacity hospital.

A. SERVICE DELIVERY:

- Hospital Statistics
- As to Bed Occupancy Rate (BOR), it decreased from **75.34%** of 2020 to **72.25%** of this period.
- Average Daily Admitted Patients, it decreased from 10 of last year to 7 this period.
- An average length of stay is **5 days**.
- ➤ The Total Number of Normal Deliveries for this period is 672 which decreased compared to 1,259 last year.
- ➤ The Total Number of Caesarian Operation from **444** for this period decreased a bit compared to **499** last year.

D. HUMAN RESOURCES FOR HEALTH

- ➤ Cauayan District Hospital hired one (1) additional Medical Technologist (Contractual) and one (1) Philhealth Clerk (Contractual) to fill in the lacking personnel in the Laboratory Department and Philhealth Section.
- ➤ The Department of Health also provided three (3) Resident Doctors to serve for a period of one (1) year as additional work force in the Medical Services.



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Our Annual Statistical Report will show a very remarkable decrease in our Bed Occupancy Rate (BOR) for the past 2 years during the Covd-19 pandemic.
