ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT 2017

The San Mariano Community Hospital since its transfer to the new (present) 2-storey building, adjacent to the San Mariano Municipal Hall and beside the Rural Health Unit has remarkably increased as to performance or accomplishments.

- Average Length of stay per in patient – 3 days

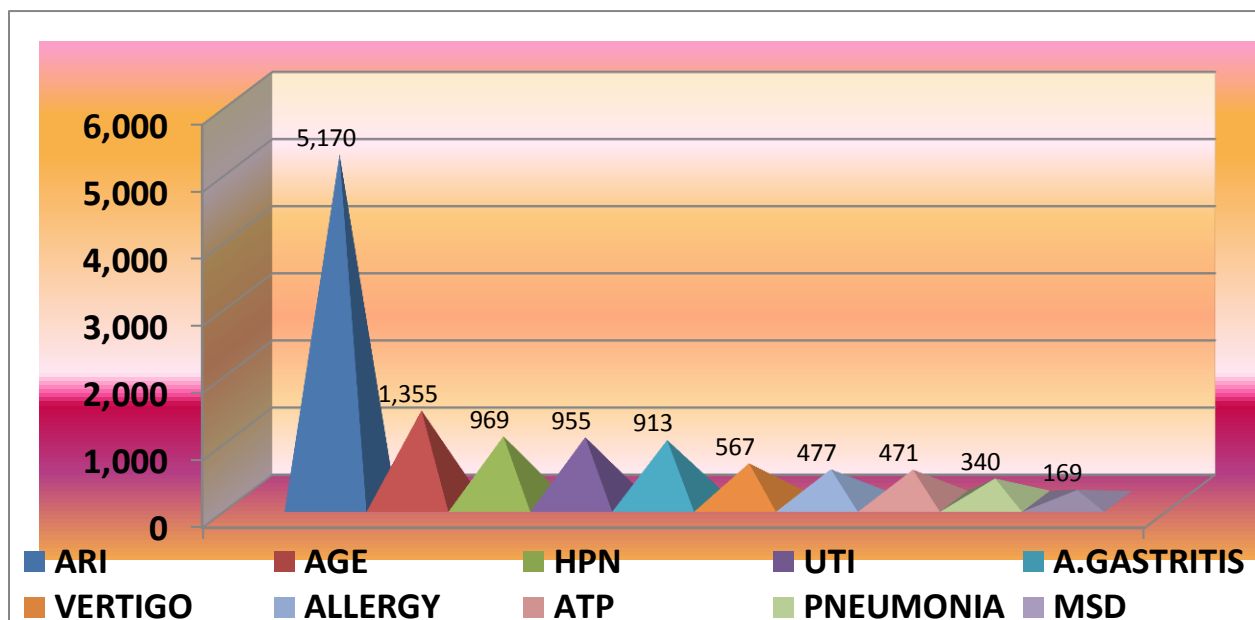

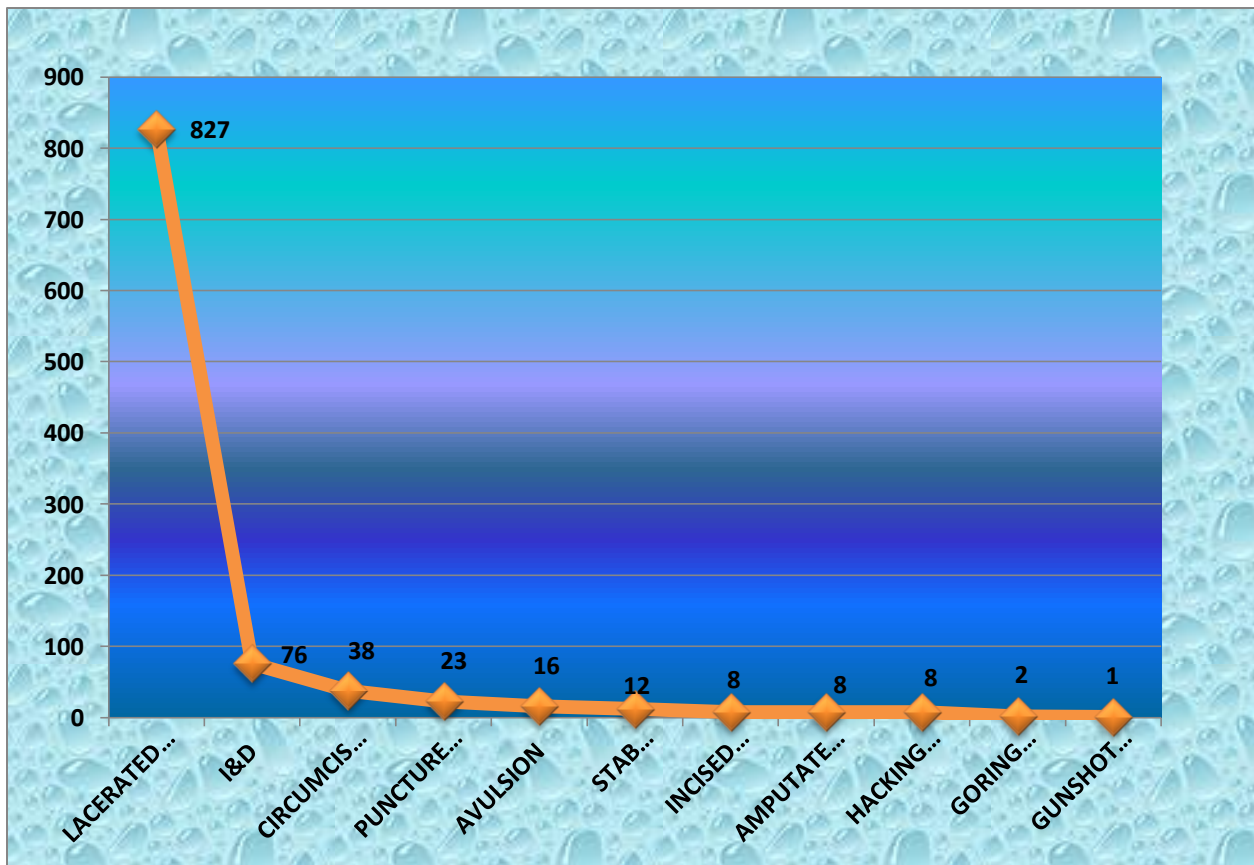

This shows that in the Out-Patient Department, patients now prefer to come for consultation and treatment rather than to go for self-medication which is the common practice. The data also shows the increase in number of patients seen is due to the thorough medical care provided by its personnel. Other reasons are the free and quality consultation services along with the presence of the Laboratory service that would aid the Physicians/ Medical officers in the diagnosis of diseases as well as availability of medicines at the Hospital Pharmacy. Aside from these, there is no private clinic in the vicinity.

A total of 1,019 minor surgery cases were performed at the Emergency Room which shows that patients needing immediate care has been attended, given the necessary treatment and prompt care.

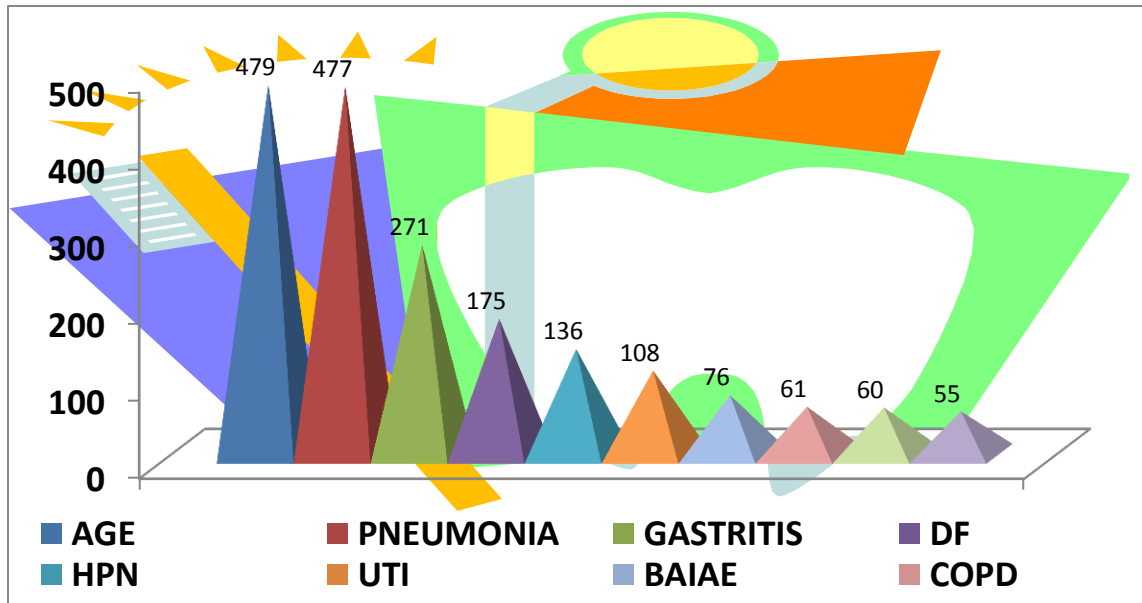

Total number of In-patient = 3,621

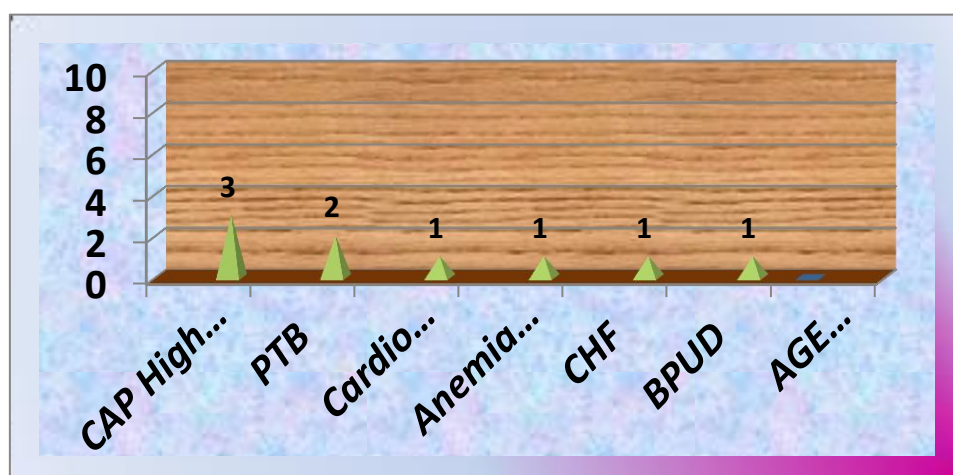
TABLE 4- 10 LEADING CAUSES OF MORBIDITY (DISCHARGES)



In the Discharges, two most common diseases were identified. First is Acute Gastroenteritis with 479 cases, and the other one is Pneumonia with a total number of 477 patients suffering from this disease.

Some interventions are suggested to help in lowering the number of admitted patients who suffer from the two diseases stated earlier. The conduct of health teachings by the HEPO nurse in the wards at least 2x a week on the importance of well-balanced diet including eating Vitamin C rich foods, enough Rest and Sleep, and Proper Exercise, all of which equate to healthy living practices proved to be the most effective strategy. Along with this, the Anti-Smoking Campaign and proper covering of the mouth during episodes of coughing have always been emphasized to prevent Respiratory Infections. The universal precaution or Proper Hand washing technique and drinking of clean water were always instilled before and after eating to avoid spread of bacteria and Gastrointestinal Diseases such as Acute Gastroenteritis.

From the graph above, a total of 12 deaths during the entire year was recorded which is less than the total mortality last year with 17 deaths. The good “clinical eye” of the Doctors in assessing and managing patient’s condition contributed to the decrease number of deaths admitted in this institution.

The Newborn Screening Test, did not meet the Standard Target, having only 65%. This is because we still have a problem regarding NBS kits. There are times that it is not available, to the extent that the patient has already went home and was not able to go back especially those who are living in the far-flung areas. Due to this concern, not a single NBS test was performed, since September to November 2017.

In order to reach the Target, NBS kit supplies should be always available in the hospital to readily catch all the newly delivered babies for presence of the 6 diseases. For any findings detected, early intervention will be provided as to proper management and treatment.

It is worth mentioning that an outstanding award was given last October 6, 2017 given by DOH-Region -02 to San Mariano Community Hospital in recognition of screening 90-100% live births in 2016.

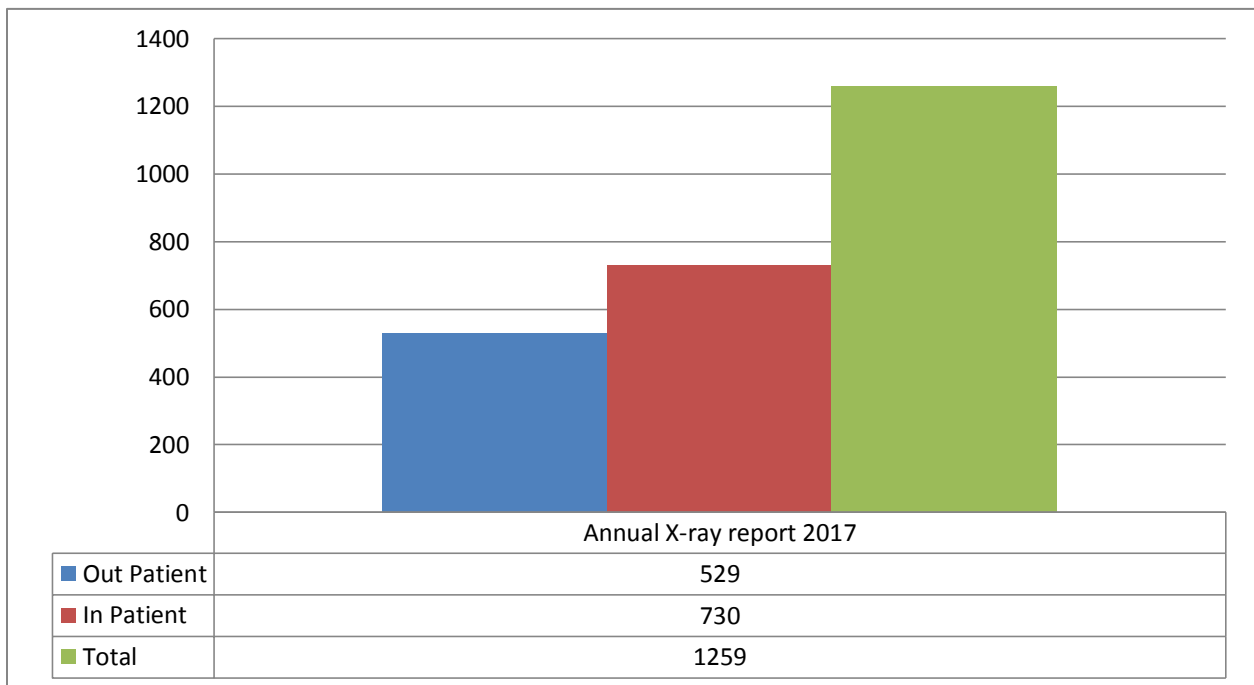

All in all, there were 11,642 patients served. 5,142 came from OPD and the rest are from admitted patients.

X-RAY Utilization



A total of 1,259 patients underwent medical imaging x-ray as requested, from which 529 came from out-patient and 730 in-patients.

As shown in the Table above, the total income generated by the Hospital was 17,906,464.60.

The collections come from three categories. First category is under **CASH** which is from the sales of medicines, laboratory procedures, and surgical supplies paid by the patients during OPD. And also, from admitted patients who availed Pay Rooms who have no PHIC membership, and who is not an Isabela Provincial Health Card holder and no indigent certification as well. A total income of 3,243,081.60 was produced which is about **18%** from the overall Hospital generated income.

Another category is the **PHILHEALTH** collection. Several types of PHIC members are being catered in this Hospital. To mention all, these are as follows: (a) **Sponsored Members**, who are the indigent recipients, entitled to enjoy the so called “**No Balance Billing**” scheme wherein all their expenses will be shouldered by the Philhealth. (b) **Individually Paying Members**, who independently pay their monthly premiums. (c) **Formal Sectors**, which includes OWWA, Government Employees and Private sector. And lastly, (d) **Non Paying Members**, who are considered as lifetime members, and those are the Senior Citizen population. The Philhealth contribution to the income of SMCH is indeed remarkable. In fact, we come up with an accumulated total income of **14,277,817**. From these results, it can be deduced that **80%** of the total income produced by the Hospital comes from the Philhealth collection.

The last category is the **Health Assistance Program for Indigents (HAPI)**. This is sponsored by the Local Government Unit of San Mariano inclusive only for San Mariano people. The recipients under this program are those identified by their respective Barangay Chairman as indigent, and were given Certification as a proof, countersigned by them and final reviewed by the Head of DSWD. HAPI accounts the remaining **2%** of the total income of SMCH amounting to **385,566**.

We can notice that majority of the money produced from the Philhealth collections are from the Sponsored category, thereby decreasing the out-of-pocket expenses by the patients since we are implementing the NBB program from the Indigent recipients who has meager income mandated by the Philhealth Insurance Company.

From the above-mentioned sources of funds of SMCH generated income, we can conclude that most of the patients admitted are now enjoying their benefits as PHIC members, especially the indigent category that does not pay any amount from their pocket. We can also surmise that the patients are now secured for hospitalization because of the financial assistance being given by Philhealth and other programs such as the Isabela Provincial Health Care sponsored by the Provincial Government of Isabela and Health Assistance Program for Indigents by the LGU San Mariano. These results imply improved health services offered from under this present administration. Thus, it is imperative to continue supporting the programs that is very beneficial to everyone.

HOSPITAL ACTIVITIES

- **BLOOD LETTING ACTIVITY**

In order to maintain a Level I hospital duly certified by the Department of Health, Blood Station should be operational and one of the major requirements mandated by the Department of Health (DOH) in issuing Certificate of Inclusion of Blood Station is the “Blood Letting Activity”.



The first bloodletting activity was conducted last March 24, 2017 together with the GFNDY staff in cooperation with the Rural Health Unit San Mariano. Thirty-nine (39) volunteers were able to donate blood and deposited at GFNDY Memorial Hospital Blood Bank. Another bloodletting activity was done last August 31, with the GFNDY staff again and RHU San Mariano Staff. All in all, seventy six (76) bloods were extracted and deposited at GFNDY Memorial Hospital Blood Bank.



Aside from complying to meet the standards of the Department of Health, this activity is indeed an act of generosity and charity inspired by the idea: “Donating Blood To Save Lives”. It aims to help the people of San Mariano to have easy access to blood banks in huge hospitals particularly in GFNDY Memorial Hospital located at Ilagan, Isabela.

Furthermore, to ensure availability of blood, all Barangays, with the initiative of the Barangay Captains, were encouraged to bring volunteers to undergo blood donation after thorough screening and examination conducted by the medical team to ensure that the blood extracted is safe for blood transfusion. As observed during the said bloodletting activities, the community members were all cooperative knowing that with this alone, they will be able to partake in the noble deed of saving lives.

Together as one community with the initiative of the proper authorities go hand in hand in helping out others who are in need of blood through this “Bloodletting Activity”. And as

children of God willing to give every single drop of blood and with a deep concern for others unified and enjoined to be able to make this activity successful.



- **BRIGADA ESKWELA**

Last May, the Department of Education prepares for an orderly and safe class opening through its annual “Brigada Eskwela” activity with the theme “ Isang DepEd, Isang Pamayanan, Isang Bayanihan para sa Handa at Ligtas na Paaralan”. It is one way of making the environment conducive for learning. It is simply done by general cleaning of the school campus including painting and repairing of school buildings. All were tired but enjoyed knowing that this activity will greatly contribute to a safer place for the school children, thus helping them to be healthy as they learn the rigors of schooling.



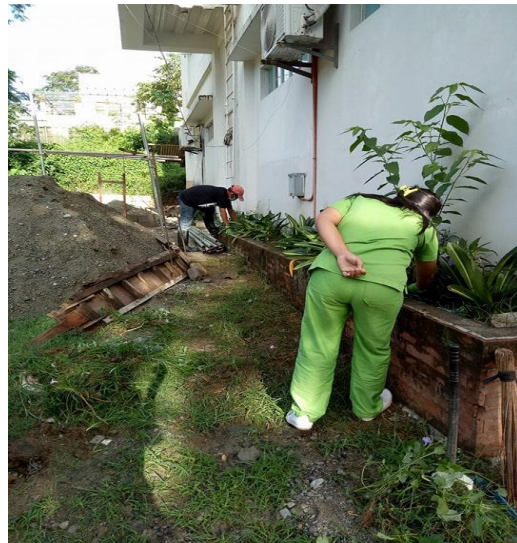
