Assessing and knowing the condition and history of a patient was also emphasized particularly in catering Medical Transfers and Mobility Assistance; and 3. The Office is continuously conducting daily disinfection and thorough cleaning of work places, most especially ambulances and other office vehicles as well as the rescuers themselves after an emergency response to prevent the spread of the virus. In compliance with the Memorandum No. 77, the office is conducting daily disinfection to all offices within the Capitol building and compound as preventive measure against COVID-19 and other communicable diseases.

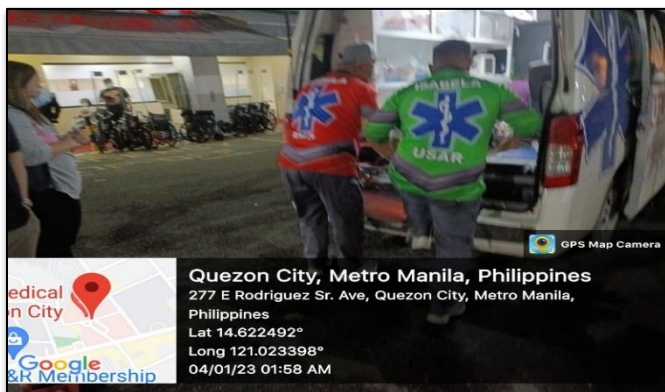


Team responded a *Trauma Incident* at Guibang, Gamu, Isabela (road crash involving 2 motorcycle, Yamaha NMAX vs motorstar125) last **January 17, 2023**. The patients was conscious. They are both suffering abrasion at the elbow. After the Emergency Care Assistants (ECA) interventions, the patient was immediately brought to GFNDy Memorial Hospital for proper disposition.



Team responded a *Trauma Incident* In front of Manuel's Lodge, Guibang, Gamu, Isabela. Involving motorcycle (Yamaha Aerox 155) last **January 30, 2023**. The patient was conscious and coherent. Accordingly, he suffered pain on both elbows and knees, pain on upper right quadrant of stomach. After the Emergency Care Assistants (ECA) interventions, the patient was immediately brought to GFNDy Memorial Hospital for proper disposition.





PDRRMO/DART 831 provided transport of patient to the patient diagnosed with prostate cancer. Accordingly, he suffered lower back pain. The patient transferred from Calamagui 2<sup>nd</sup>, City of Ilagan, Isabela to St, Luke's Medical Center, Quezon City last **January 4, 2023**.

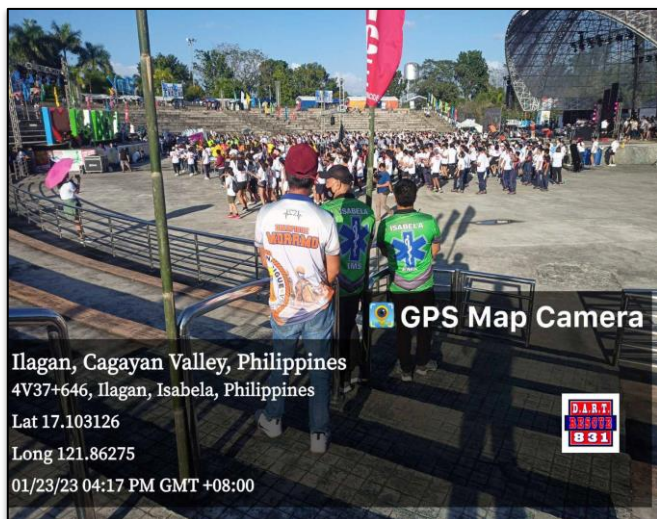
