TYPHOON ULYSSES AND THE WIDESPREAD FLOODING	Flooding brought by Typhoon Ulysses (November 12-15, 2020)	On the 12 th day of November 2020, parts of the province started to get flood due to the torrential rain brought by Typhoon Ulysses. In anticipation of the flooding, the PDRRM Office evaluated the spill level which was continuously monitored by the Monitoring Team in the Emergency Operations Center and by the Water Search and Rescue (WASAR) Teams composed of the DART 831 together with PAF TOG 2, Philippine Army, BFP, PNP and NIA-MARIIS Rescue that were already pre-positioned in their respective area of responsibility prior to the flooding and subsequently conducted force evacuation. As the flood continuously expanding more barangays have been isolated and numbers of families and individuals were caught flat-footed and needed help making the WASAR Teams constantly conducting rescue operations for three (3) days straight. The said flooding was considered one of the worst flooding happened in the history of the province with over One hundred sixteen thousand and two hundred thirty-one (116, 231) affected families; One hundred and two (102) totally damaged houses and Twenty- seven (27) partially damage; Seven hundred eighty-seven million, seven hundred fifty- four thousand, two hundred sixty-two and 20 pesos (P 787,754,262,20) cost of damage to agriculture; Nineteen million, two hundred twenty-three thousand, one hundred sixty-six, and eight pesos (P 19,223,166.08) livestock damages; and a total of Eight hundred thirteen million, eight hundred ninety-nine thousand and eight hundred twenty-five pesos (P 813, 899, 825) cost of damage in roads and bridges.

Rivera Sr. (Ret) briefly presented to the Vice President the aftermath situation of the province caused by the flood and the recommendations to mitigate or avoid such circumstances form happening again.
PDRRMC, PDC, PPOC AND LMP JOINT MEETING	Joint Disaster Assessment and Rehabilitation Planning	The PDRRMC, PDC, PPOC and LMP convened in a Joint Disaster Assessment and Rehabilitation Planning last November 17, 2020 to oversee and tackle about the massive flooding and the concerns of the different LGUs and as well to assess their situation. The PDRRM Officer presented the extent of damage the province has cost. The National Irrigation Administration - Magat River Integrated Irrigation System (NIA-MARIIS) was also asked during the meeting and took the opportunity to explain and justify their actions and decisions as the citizens complains about the releasing of water on the Magat Dam during the onslaught of Typhoon Ulysses.

CONSULTATIVE MEETING	The Weather Disturbances that affected Region 2	In relation to the meeting of the Committee on Agriculture and Food and with the Special Committee conducted last November 24, 2020, that deliberated on the resolutions that directing the appropriate committee of the House of Representative to conduct investigation in relation to the opening of floodgates during the onslaught of Typhoon Ulysses and to the conduct of an inquiry regarding the flooding in the provinces of Cagayan and Isabela, the Cagayan Valley Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (CVDRRMC) convened in Consultation Meeting to discuss the weather disturbances that affected the region 2.The PDRRM Officer attended the said meeting last November 23, 2020 via video teleconference.
FLOODING	Northeast Monsoon and Tail-end of frontal system affecting the Northern Luzon	Last 28 th to 29 th day of November 2020, just two weeks after the widespread flooding, the low lying areas of the province were once again flooded due to the rain of the northeast monsoon and tail-end of a frontal system. As the office was monitoring the areas of concern particularly, the WASAR Teams conducted pre-emptive evacuation in anticipation to recurrence of the recent event. Subsequently, the water gradually ceded back to its normal level. However, the evacuees still were not allowed to go back to their homes for safety until the unfavorable weather condition subsides and the flood was completely depleted.

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Medical Incident happened at Calamagui 1st, City of Ilagan, Isabela responded by the DART 831 last November 8, 2020. After assessment, the patient was vomiting and suffering from severe headache and elevated blood pressure. After the patient's needs were attended, the patient was brought to GFNDy Sr. Memorial Hospital.



Team responded to a Medical Incident at Baliagatan, of Ilagan, Isabela last November 23, 2020. Upon the aider's assessments, the patient known to be unconscious and has negative pulse and negative breathing. Upon interventions, the patient was brought to Dr.Villa Roman Memorial Hospital.



Team responded to a Trauma Incident (Vehicular Incident) at San Juan, City of Ilagan, Isabela. The patient suffered abrasion on the right part of the head and suddenly loss consciousness. After the Aiders interventions the patient was brought to GFNDySr. Memorial Hospital.



Team responded to a Trauma Incident (Vehicular Incident) at Guibang, Gamu, Isabela involving a Single Motor. Patient was suffered with abrasions in both upper and lower extremities, the patient happened to be driving under the influence of alcohol. After immediate interventions the patients was brought to GFNDySr. Memorial Hospital.



Team provided an Inter-facility Transfer to a patient with multiple close fracture on both upper and lower extremities and subject for operation. The patient was transferred from Mabini, Gamu, Isabela to Mandaluyong City, Metro Manila last November 22, 2020.



Team provided an Inter-facility Transfer to a patient who was undergone chemotherapy. The patient was transferred from Dagupan City, Pangasinan to City of Ilagan, last November 23, 2020.
