EDITOR'S NOTE

Isabela Beyond Borders

In an era shaped by globalization and a growing web of connections, "Isabela Beyond Borders" carries profound meaning. Under the visionary leadership of Governor Rodito T. Isabela's global presence is further exemplified by three distinguished envoys from Isabela underscoring the far-reaching impact of the province in the international landscape. They are Ambassador Mylene Garcia Albano, spouse of Governor Rodito who represents the Philippines in Japan; Ambassador Bernard F. Dy, former City Mayor of Cauayan, now Philippine representative to the Swiss Confederation and Principality of Liechtenstein in Switzerland; and Silvestre Bello III, former Secretary of the Department of Labor and Employment, and now Chairman of the Manila Economic and Cultural Office (MECO) and Resident Representative to Taiwan

Governor Rodito's second term as Chairman of the Regional Development Council for Cagayan Valley and new Chairman of Luzon Regional Development Committee (Luzon RDCom) elevates him to a position to push for the holistic development not just of the Cagayan Valley Region but the entire Luzon Island.

GOV. RODITO JOINS PRES. MARCOS JR. TO BOLSTER PH-VIETNAM STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIP IN AGRICULTURE

Gov. Rodito T. Albano III, accompanied by former Mayor Kervin Francis Uy of Burgos, Isabela, joined President Ferdinand "Bongbong" Marcos Jr.'s delegation during his official state visit to Vietnam on January 29 to 30, 2024.

Among the objectives of the visit was to strengthen bilateral relations and collaboration across various sectors, including maritime cooperation, defense, trade, agriculture, and culture.

As the Philippines' second-largest riceproducing province, Isabela stands at the forefront of the nation's agricultural landscape.

Agriculture Secretary Francisco T. Laurel Jr. highlighted the significance of partnerships between the Provincial Government of Isabela and the Department of Agriculture in enhancing rice production.

He emphasized the importance of integrating technology and implementing benchmark interventions, drawing inspiration from Vietnam's successful agricultural strategies.

RICE TRADE COOPERATION AGREEMENT

A significant milestone in the visit was the signing of the Rice Trade Cooperation Agreement between the Philippines and Vietnam.

Through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signed on January 30, 2024, both nations affirmed their commitment to ensuring a sustainable food supply amidst

global challenges such as climate change and pandemics.

Under the MOU, Vietnam committed to supply 1.5 to 2 million metric tons of white rice annually to the Philippines, fostering stability in prices and availability.

Furthermore, the agreement facilitates the exchange of crucial information on policies, regulations, and other aspects of rice trade.

MOU ON AGRICULTURE COOPERATION

The MOU on Agriculture Cooperation marks a significant stride in deepening collaboration between the Philippines and Vietnam in various agricultural domains.

Encompassing 19 areas of cooperation, including high-value crops, livestock, aquaculture, and smart agriculture, the agreement sets the stage for comprehensive engagement in agricultural development and sustainability.

Through knowledge sharing, research, training, and expert exchanges, both

nations aim to harness each other's strengths to address common challenges and enhance agricultural productivity.

For the Province of Isabela, the bilateral relations on agriculture with Vietnam open avenues for technology exchange and transfer.

Isabela can learn from Vietnam's successful agricultural practices, particularly in rice production, and adopt relevant strategies to enhance its agricultural productivity.

Delegates from the Japan Water Agency (JWA), the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism (MLIT), Nippon Koei Co., and Philkoei International, Inc. met with Governor Rodito T. Albano III on November 29 to present the concept of the "Magat Dam Sedimentation Countermeasure Project," which aims to reduce the concentration of sediments at the reservoir.

The delegates provided Gov. Albano with an overview of the project, highlighting the necessity of conducting a feasibility study.

They underscored the critical sedimentation-related issues affecting water storage capacity and power generation intake in Magat Dam, such as decreased water storage capacity and clogging of power generation intake. They also emphasized the urgency of

implementing effective sedimentation countermeasures.

Gov. Albano pledged to dedicate all the necessary resources to help the team finish the project.

"We will put up all resources to help you. Don't worry, I told the President already. If any agency will give you a hard time, tell me. We will report to the President. Please inform us of any developments in your coordination with other agencies. I don't want any delay here," he said.

The project feasibility study will identify measures to reduce the annual sedimentation volume of the Magat Dam reservoir, preserve its water storage capacity, extend its service life, and mitigate the risks of natural disasters and economic losses.

Magat Dam is the water source for the irrigation of 86,887 hectares of farmlands in Isabela province and a source of hydroelectric power generation.

Approximately 400 million m³ of sediment has been deposited over the past 40 years since the start of the dam management.



The Province of Isabela welcomed a distinguished delegation from the British Embassy in Manila, led by Political Counsellor Iain Cox.

WARM WELCOME AND PROFOUND SIGNIFICANCE

Gov. Rodito Albano III and Vice Gov. Faustino "Bojie" Dy III showed hospitality to Cox and his team, acknowledging the profound importance of their visit to the province.

Cox acknowledged the energy and tourism prospects associated with Isabela's Magat Dam and pledged to facilitate connections between Isabela's Mabuwaya Foundation and The Darwin Initiative, a UK government grants scheme to conserve biodiversity and the natural environment through local projects worldwide.

FOSTERING EDUCATIONAL EXCHANGES

Cox also introduced the prestigious Chevening program—an initiative by the UK government offering international scholarships and fellowships.

This program provides outstanding Filipino students and professionals with a unique opportunity to pursue one-year academic programs in the United Kingdom, enhancing educational exchanges between the two nations.

The two-day fair was a showcase of government programs and a lifeline for over 100,000 beneficiaries of government services providing 195 major government services to Isabeleños.



36 Agencies, One Mission

A total of 36 government agencies, including DOH, SSS, PHILPOST, DICT, GSIS, PhilHealth, BIR, LTFRB, DOT, OCD, OWWA, NTC, DOLE, DHSUD, DMW, DTI, DENR, FDA, DOST, DepEd, DA, DAR, PCA, BFAR, PNP, and NFA, among others, converged at the fair.

The Serbisyo Fair aimed to streamline government services, eliminating the need for citizens to travel to Manila to access various needs and services from government offices.

The fair featured government programs, that include the Kadiwa ng Pangulo, Passport on Wheels, Rice and Food Packs Distribution, Tulong Panghanapbuhay sa Ating Disadvantaged/Displaced Workers (TUPAD), Assistance to Individual In Crisis Situation (AICS) Program, Government Internship Program (GIP) payouts, land title distribution and laboratory/medical services.

The DSWD orchestrated a province-wide payout, reaching over

42,000 beneficiaries with a total amount of P140 million. Various scholarship programs from TESDA and CHED and livelihood assistance for different sectors were also made available to pre-identified eligible clients.

The Provincial Government of Isabela (PGI) also distributed free wheelchairs to senior citizens and persons with disabilities.

House Speaker Ferdinand Martin G. Romualdez stressed the significance of the BPSF in expediting government services. He said that the fair aims to be the country's largest service caravan, dedicated to bringing essential services to underserved communities.

The reorganizational meeting of the Luzon Regional Development Committee (RDCom) on April 19, 2023, held at NEDA Region IV-A in Calamba City, Laguna, set a defining moment in regional collaboration.

Often referred to as RDCom, this committee is entrusted with formulating and monitoring policies that reduce regional growth disparities and promote the rational allocation of resources among regions.

During this reorganizational meeting, Gov. Rodito T. Albano III, RDC2 Chair, was endorsed as the principal representative, with Gov. Hermilando I. Mandanas, Chairperson of RDC IV-A, assuming the role of alternate representative of Luzon RDCom to the NEDA Board-RDCom.

This endorsement inaugurated a period marked by strategic agreements and collaborative efforts.

BUILDING UPON FOUNDATIONS: THE INAUGURAL MEETING

Under Gov. Albano's chairmanship, the inaugural Luzon RDCom meeting occurred on July 4, 2023, at the Pasig City Metropolitan Manila Development Authority (MMDA) office.

At this gathering, a spirit of enthusiasm and determination pervaded the room as Gov. Rodito welcomed the members, expressing confidence in the committee's ability to stimulate economic growth and development across Luzon.

The committee also adopted proposed amendments to EO 325, enhancing regional development strategies, and endorsed Ma. Virginia Castillejos-Liquigan as the regional development expert representative for the Luzon area to NB-RDCom.

REACHING NEW HEIGHTS: THE THIRD QUARTER MEETING

The transformative journey reached its height during the 3rd Quarter RDCom Meeting on October 10, 2023, at the BCDA Corporate Center in Mabalacat City, Pampanga where the Luzon RDCom Manual of Operations was approved.

The unanimous endorsement of a groundbreaking port development and interconnectivity proposal under the Strong Republic Nautical Highway underscored the committee's focus on

comprehensive implementation and active LGU participation.

Furthermore, the RDCom approved prioritizing Geographically Isolated and Disadvantaged Areas (GIDAs) in Human Resources for Health (HRH) services allocation, ensuring equitable healthcare access.



Memorial Tribute and Strategic Deliberations:

Rooted in the Visayan term "Pasidungog," which translates to "to give honor," the award celebrated the remarkable synergy



unity, has made a significant impact on humanitarian efforts that stretch far beyond its borders. From the aftermath of typhoons to the threats of volcanic eruptions, Isabela's rescuers stood undeterred, extending a lifeline of support that knows no bounds.

Crisis Response in Cagayan

The Province of Isabela once again demonstrated its commitment to support its neighboring Province of Cagayan. Isabela's Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRRMO) sprang into action when disaster struck in Cabuluan, Alcala, Cagayan, after a Super Typhoon Goring-induced landslide on August 30, 2023.

A dedicated group of DART Rescue 831 personnel and volunteers, armed with determination and portable water purifiers, delivered an essential lifeline, ensuring clean drinking water for evacuees and residents affected by the catastrophe.

Aid in Albay amidst Volcanic Threat

When Mayon Volcano in Albay surged to Alert Level 3, placing local residents in grave danger, Isabela swiftly stepped in to lend a helping hand. Pulling together its resources and manpower from the PDRRMO, PSWDO, and OPE on August 25, 2023, they delivered a substantial donation of 5,749 bags (5 kgs/bag) of Isabela Rice to the people of Albay, providing immediate sustenance to communities amidst the looming threat posed by Mayon Volcano.

Bridging Borders since 2013

On November 11, 2013, Team Isabela Humanitarian and Relief Mission embarked on a journey in the aftermath of the catastrophic Typhoon Yolanda in 2013 to the storm-ravaged Province of Leyte. Comprising 120 diverse professionals, the resolute mission embodied Isabela's unwavering commitment to extend aid, undeterred by the formidable challenges faced. Over the course of five days, various sub-teams carried out medical missions, clearing and retrieval operations, and water sanitation efforts in the affected municipalities.

Isabela has consistently extended humanitarian services to provinces including Cagayan, Albay, Leyte, Bulacan, Tarlac, and Davao Oriental. These efforts have included rice donations, water sanitation operations, relief pack distributions, medical missions, and more.

The PDRRMC's DART 831 Rescue Team also provided essential physical and medical assistance to the residents of Itbayat, Batanes in the wake of the magnitude 5.7 earthquake and subsequent strong aftershocks that struck the province on July 27, 2019.

The team provided support by supplying clean and potable water to ensure residents' health and sanitation at the evacuation site.

In their longest mission to date, Isabela sent out two teams for "Project Isabela Loves Visayas and Mindanao," a 28-day humanitarian effort spanning from January 27 to February 15, 2022, providing crucial relief and support to communities ravaged by Typhoon Odette in Visayas and Mindanao.

The team distributed a total of 20,000 packs of 2-kg Isabela Rice to Region 6; 30,000 packs to Region 7; 15,000 packs to Leyte; 18,750 packs to Surigao; and 10,000 packs to Puerto Princesa City, Palawan.

Isabela's rescuers beyond borders stand as a testament to the province's boundless compassion and unwavering commitment to assist those in need, transcending geographical boundaries.

The province's tireless efforts inspires communities to unite, support one another, and believe in a future where compassion and assistance prevail, knowing no limits or borders.

Ordinance No. 2020-04-1 Series of 2020 expanded the scholarship program to include post-graduate studies, such as Master's Degrees, Law, Medicine, and Theology. The program extends support even to licensure examination takers.

The BRO-Ed for Education is more than a scholarship program; it catalyzes change. It is a transformative force that empowers Isabela's youth to break barriers and build a future that betters their lives and contributes to the province's progress. With Gov. Albano

and Vice Gov. Dy's unwavering commitment, Isabela's youth are not just students but pioneers of a brighter, more prosperous tomorrow.

CATALYZING EMPLOYMENT IN ISABELA

To address unemployment and connect job seekers with potential employers, the Provincial Government of Isabela, through the Public Employment Service Office (PESO) headed by Ms. Cecilia Claire N. Reyes, organized three job fairs in 2023.

The Bambanti Job Fair held during the provincial Bambanti Festival attracted 385 participants and showcased 2,012 job vacancies from 40 local employers, with 11% hired on the spot and 66% identified as near hires.

Similarly, the Isabela Day Job Fair and 3rd Quarter Job Fair continued the trend of connecting job seekers with employers, with the former featuring 249 participants with 18.47% hired, and the latter boasting 470 participants with 21.9% securing immediate employment, demonstrating the province's

dynamic employment landscape and its alignment with evolving job market needs.

EMPOWERING LOCAL BUSINESSES

In a showcase of unity and agricultural ingenuity, the Province of Isabela hosted the grand launch of Kadiwa ng Pangulo in Region 02 on October 17, 2023.

The event brought together farmers, fisherfolks, micro-enterprises, and consumers, marking the initiation of a program designed to provide affordable access to goods and commodities while creating invaluable market opportunities.

The occasion was graced by Regional Executive Director Narciso Edillo of the Department of Agriculture 02, who emphasized the significance of Kadiwa ng Pangulo as a vital link between farmers and consumers.

III, were lauded for their responsiveness and contributions to food security initiatives, setting the stage for a collaborative approach to agricultural challenges.

The initiative received support from partner agencies such as the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), and the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), with the Department of Agriculture leading the way.

CONNECTING FARMERS AND CONSUMERS

Farmers, fisherfolks, and micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs) offered various reasonably priced fresh agricultural produce, including rice, fish, fruits, and vegetables.

Among the participants were the National Food Authority (NFA), offering rice at an affordable price of P25.00 per priced at P38.00 per kilo.

The event featured a diverse range of products, from peanut products presented by the Gonzaga Center of Agronomy to fresh pineapples and bananas offered by Caviteño Isabelino Agriculture Cooperative. Sagittarian Agricultural Phils, Inc. of Santa Victoria, llagan also showcased a selection of canned goods such as pork and chicken.

Moreover, the Epiphany Multi-Purpose Cooperative of Abut, Quezon, presented black rice and pink rice options for consumers, while Puregold Ilagan (Alibagu) displayed a variety of affordable grocery items.

The DA-CVRC Multi-Purpose Cooperative also participated by selling eggs, vegetables, and fruits, while the Star Chime Enterprises of Cabatuan offered assorted groceries and even distributed free coffee packs.

The Flow of Pariir Agriculture Cooperative of Cabatuan showcased munggo beans and other agricultural products.

At the same time, the Isabela Aqua Agriculture Cooperative brought their range of tilapia-based products from the Magat Dam in Ramon.

The Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) featured a stall highlighting assorted food products from Isabela's MSMEs. Agar Wood of San Mateo, Isabela presented their wooden products for non-food items, adding a unique touch to the event.





The Philippine Center for Postharvest Development and Mechanization (PhilMech) distributed state-of-the-art farm machinery under the Rice Competitiveness and Enhancement Program (RCEF) to 75 Farmers Cooperatives and Associations (FCAs), including PGI, LGU Alicia, and Cauayan City at the Isabela Sports Complex, Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Isabela on February 21, 2023.

With a total value of P240.18 million, these advanced farm equipment are poised to revolutionize Isabela's agricultural landscape, paving the way for a prosperous future for its farmers.

Under the RCEF, PhilMech distributed a range of cutting-edge farm machinery designed to enhance crop establishment, harvesting, and palay drying processes. These grants, funded by RCEF sources from 2021 and 2022, included rice combine harvesters, recirculating dryers, multistage rice mills, hand tractors, walk-behind transplanters, and riding-type transplanters.

A VISION FOR TOMORROW

PhilMech Interim Director for Operations Joel V. Dator reaffirmed the institution's commitment to sustaining the distribution of farm equipment to qualified FCAs/LGUs through the RCEF until 2024.

"Nais namin ang mga pinakabago, pinakamaganda, branded, at tunay na mapakikinabangan lamang na makinarya ang umabot sa inyong mga samahan," he emphasized, underscoring PhilMech's dedication to providing the best possible machinery to the farming communities.

Dator urged young farmers in Isabela to rally behind the Youth for Mechanization (Y4M) campaign, an initiative aimed at rebranding agriculture among the youth through the use of advanced farm machinery.

Meanwhile, DA Regional Executive Director Narciso Edillo encouraged farmers to adopt hybrid rice varieties to bolster production and shift from transplanting to direct seeding, a method proven to reduce labor costs in rice farming.

CHAMPIONING AGRICULTURE'S TRANSFORMATION

Senator Cynthia A. Villar, chair of the Senate Committee on Food and Agriculture and the main author of the Rice Tariffication Law (Republic Act 11203), wholeheartedly supported PhilMech during the machinery turnover event.

In her video message, she underscored the significance of the RCEF, a component of the Rice Tariffication Law that allocates P10 billion annually from rice import tariffs for six years.

Villar highlighted the importance of mechanization, which receives 50 percent of

the RCEF allocation, in empowering farmers. "Para sa machineries, ang Farmers' Cooperative and Associations ang bibigyan ng benepisyo ayon sa pangangailangan," she stressed. The senator urged farmers to unite and establish cooperatives, safeguarding their interests amidst agricultural liberalization.

Mechanization, according to Villar, stands as a cornerstone in empowering farmers.

"Mahalagang magawa natin mula sa ating binalangkas na batas ang para sa kapakanan ng ating mga maliliit na mga magsasaka upang makatulong tayo na umunlad ang kanilang buhay at ang kanilang kanayunan," she concluded, emphasizing the importance of legislation in ensuring the prosperity of small-scale farmers.

With these advanced farm machines and the unwavering support of dedicated officials, Isabela's agricultural sector is poised for a transformative journey, ensuring a brighter, more prosperous future for its farmers and the entire community.

The allocation of P240.18 million worth of farm machinery marks a significant step towards a more efficient, productive, and sustainable agricultural landscape in the province.

PGI ramps up palay procurement program to stabilize rice prices



In a proactive step aimed at stabilizing palay prices, enhancing buffer stocks, and meeting rice distribution requirements, the Provincial Government of Isabela (PGI) embarked on its palay procurement program.

The program seeks to provide local farmers with a reliable market for their palay, ensuring a stable income and boosting their investment return.

The PGI acquired clean and dry palay with a moisture content of 14 percent at a competitive rate from P26.00 to P28.00 per kilo, using the Northern Philippines Grains Complex in Sinabbaran, Echague, which was lent by the NFA, as the buying center.

This strategic move not only shields local farmers from market price fluctuations but also significantly

DA-R02, PGI award P10.3M delivery vehicles to Isabeleño farmers

The Department of Agriculture-Regional Field Office 02, in collaboration with the Provincial Government of Isabela, awarded seven delivery vehicles worth P10.3 million to seven farmer cooperatives and associations on May 25, 2023.

The recipients were San Pablo, Isabela Farmers Dairy Cooperative, Browngold Isabela Organic Farmers Association, Flow of Pariir Agricultural Cooperative, Indigenous People Agricultural Cooperative, Southwestern San Agustin Farmers' Association, Aurora Vegetable Growers Association, and Queen Isabela Mango Producers Cooperative.

In addition to the palay procurement program, Gov. Rodito has extended his support to tobacco farmers. For the crop year 2019-2020, a significant number of tobacco farmers, totaling 7,925, received financial assistance amounting to P25,000.00 each.

This initiative underscores the governor's holistic approach to agriculture, addressing the diverse needs of Isabela's farming community.

The ceremony occurred at the Governor's Mini Conference held at the Provincial Capitol, coinciding with the celebration of Cooperative Month 2023.

Governor Albano and Vice Governor Dy's forward-thinking approach aims to create a robust support system, ensuring a flourishing market for local produce and, consequently, providing these enterprising entities with a sustainable source of income.

Under the MOA, the provincial government will purchase products at premium prices, actively participating in the promotion and marketing of items such as local dairy products, dried tilapia, cornick, bottled fruit



juice, bamboo creations, banana chips, woven rattan bags, vegetable and fruit tree seedlings, including rice.

This strategic collaboration not only injects economic vitality into the local market but also showcases the products of Isabeleños to a broader audience.

Furthermore, the provincial government

will act as a bridge, connecting Isabeleño farmers with cooperatives and associations, facilitating the sale of agricultural produce, such as vegetables, turmeric, and calamansi.

Swine artificial insemination project to rise in Cabagan, Isabela



The Provincial Government of Isabela will construct the region's first Swine Artificial Insemination sa Barangay (SWAIB) Project worth P3.9 million at the Cabagan Breeding Station.

The SWAIB Project is under the Integrated National Swine Production Initiatives for Recovery and Expansion (INSPIRE) Program of the Department of Agriculture-National Livestock Program (NLP) through the

Agricultural Training Institute-International Training Center on Pig Husbandry. The climate controlled facility will have a biogas system, Al laboratory equipment, and breeder boars, producing high-quality, genetically superior processed semen.

Provincial Veterinarian Dr. Belina N. Barboza thanked the Agricultural Training Institute R02 and DA Regional Field Offices for their trust in the provincial government.

"The PVET really desired to get the SWAIB project dahil gusto naming makatulong sa mga hog raiser na nawalan ng baboy dahil sa ASF. On behalf of Governor Rodito T. The Province of Isabela has significantly protected children aged 0 to 59 months against vaccine-preventable diseases with the provincial launching of the Measles-Rubella and Oral Polio Vaccine Supplemental Immunization Activity (MR-OPV SIA).

In a video message during the event at the Capitol Amphitheater in Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Gov. Rodito Albano III stressed the importance of this immunization campaign.

"Pabakunahan natin ang ating mga anak na may edad 0-59 months old kontra polio at tigdas. Protektahan natin sila laban sa nakamamatay na sakit na ito. Ang mga bakuna ay libre, epektibo at ligtas," he said.

Gov. Rodito appealed for the cooperation and support of different line agencies, NGO/CSO volunteers, mayors, and barangay officials.

"Bakuna ang pinakamabisang panlaban sa polio, rubella at tigdas. Ipakita natin ang ating pagkakaisa para maabot ang ating layunin na ang Batang Isabeleño, sa bakuna ay protektado. Magpabakuna para sa Healthy Isabela," he said. Provincial Health Officer Dr. Nelson Paguirigan emphasized the lifesaving impact of vaccines, especially in the face of health challenges.

"Immunization is proven to be the most effective intervention for saving lives. Ito ay ating napatunayan noong tayo'y nasa gitna ng peligro dulot ng COVID-19. Ang bakuna ang ating naging pag-asa para sa ating ganap na proteksiyon," he said.

Dr. Elsie Pintucan, Provincial Department of Health (DOH) representative, disclosed the partnership between DOH and local government units (LGUs) to carry out a nationwide measles, rubella, and polio supplemental immunization throughout May 2023.

"Para sa lalawigan ng Isabela mayroon po tayong target na 103,000 plus para sa 9 to 59 months na mga sanggol at bata para sa bakuna kontra tigdas. At may 129,000 plus para sa 0 to 59 months para sa mga sanggol at bata para sa bakuna kontra polio," she said.

Dr. Pintucan highlighted DOH's goal of immunizing 98% of the eligible population aged 0 to 59 months during the first two

weeks of May, with the commitment to sustain the initiative until every eligible child is protected.

Chamille Jayne Claravall, the Provincial National Immunization Program Coordinator, concluded the event with a resounding call to action.

"Itaguyod natin ang kalusugan at kinabukasan ng ating mga anak. Each of us has a role to play so that every children has a shot for their future. Makialam, makiisa para sa lahat ng batang Isabeleño, sa bakuna ay protektado," she said.


Provincial Veterinarian Dr. Belina Barboza and Provincial Agriculturist Marites Frogoso accepted the award on behalf of the governor.

and lactating mothers in the province. On December 19, 2023, Nickel Asia Corporation generously donated 1,217 boxes of milk. Each box contains 6 packs of 150g Ensure Gold Vanilla, totaling 7,306 packs.

Beyond addressing malnutrition, the Busog-Lusog Milk Feeding Program has become a catalyst for economic growth within local communities.

Beyond Compliant LGUs are those that generally exceed the standards for the establishment and functionality of the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils and Offices (LDRRMCOs). This is the highest compliance rating from the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC).


According to the guidelines, Beyond Compliant LGUs receive an assessment rating of 2.5 to 3.0, while Fully Compliant LGUs receive a rating of 1.5 to 2.49.

The province was assessed based on its PDRRMC structure, competency,

management system, enabling policies, knowledge management and advocacy, and partnership and participation.

In 2022, the province was awarded the Gawad KALASAG Seal of Excellence with a rating of Fully Compliant, adhering to the standards for the establishment and functionality of the LDRRMCOs as prescribed in the Philippine Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Act of 2010 or RA 10121.

Gawad KALASAG (KAlamidad at Sakuna LAbanan, SAriling Galing ang Kaligtasan) is an annual recognition that was conceived in 1998 for various stakeholders who promote and implement DRRM, climate change adaptation and humanitarian assistance programs "to protect high-risk communities against extreme hazards and capacitate them to address their vulnerabilities."

SOYA 2023: SK BINAG HIGHLIGHTS YOUTH DEV SECTOR'S SIGNIFICANT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Outgoing Sangguniang Kabataan Provincial Federation President Hon. Dax Paolo C. Binag delivered his State of the Youth Address (SOYA) in Cauayan City, September 26, enumerating the significant accomplishments of the youth sector in the province under his leadership in the last five years

Binag emphasized that the collaborative efforts of youth leaders have paved the way for numerous opportunities to foster the growth and empowerment of Isabela's youth. COUNCIL NAGKAISA

"The Council-NAGKAISA was a pioneering initiative and one of the country's first convened Youth Development Councils. This marked the beginning of our concerted efforts to empower and amplify the voice of the Isabeleño youth," he said.

PROVINCIAL YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Binag also boasted the first-ever Provincial Youth Development Plan (PYDP).

"Matagumpay nating naisulong ang approval ng Provincial Youth Development Plan 2020-2022 ng Council NAGKAISA-PYDC sa Sangguniang Panlalawigan, making Isabela as one of the first LGUs to have an SP-adopted Local Youth Development Plan," he said.

ISABELA YOUTH CODE

Binag underscored that the existing youth code in the province was strengthened through Ordinance No. 2020-03-2 and that the Province of Isabela is among the first in Region 02 to have a comprehensive code for the youth.

"Kasama sa mga probisyon nito ang pagbuo at pagpapalakas ng Isabela Youth Development Council; ang mandatong pagdiriwang ng Buwan ng Kabataan tuwing Agosto; ang Gawad Ulirang Kabataan para sa pagkilala sa mga natatanging kabataan; ang Provincial Youth Summit para mapalakas ang pakikilahok ng kabataan; at ang pagbibigay ng tulong sa youth organizations sa pamamagitan ng Development Incentives for Thriving Organizations of Youth in Isabela (DITOY)," he said.

PERFECT SCORE IN SGLG EVALUATION

Binag also disclosed that the Provincial Youth Development Office achieved a perfect score (4/4) during the regional and national evaluation for the 2022 and 2023 Seal of Good Local Governance.

"Nakamit natin ang perfect score na 4/4 sa regional at national validation. This recognition highlighted the youth development initiatives in the province, underscoring the importance of prioritizing youth welfare and empowerment in governance," he said.

YOUTH ORGANIZATION REGISTRATION PROGRAM (YORP)

Binag said the PYDO successfully developed and strengthened youth organizations through the Youth Organization Registration Program (YORP).

"With zero recorded youth organizations in 2018, we now have 63 registered youth and youth-serving organizations through the YORP. We provided P700,000 worth of assistance to YORP-Registered Youth Organizations through

DITOY, further empowering them to impact their communities positively," he said.

Highlighting the spirit of youth volunteerism, Binag talked at length about the fruits of solid youth participation in the province.

"The fun run 'Takbo para sa E-Lib ni BRO' raised an impressive P1.1 million for the E-Lib ni BRO, which will benefit our Isabeleño learners," he said.

He reiterated that patients in Isabela who need to be transferred to Metro Manila can simply contact his office, and he will do everything possible to assist them, including providing free transportation.

He also announced that there are now 139 Malasakit Centers across the

country, including two in the cities of llagan and Santiago.

Furthermore, he emphasized that it will reduce the number of patients in hospitals by providing a wide range of medical services, including database management, outpatient care, birthing facilities, isolation units, laboratory services such as X-rays and ultrasounds, pharmacies, ambulatory surgical units, eye, ear, nose, and throat (EENT) services, oncology centers, physical therapy and rehabilitation centers, and telemedicine.

Queen Isabela 2024


