1. Nursery Operations & Maintenance Works		
a. Production/Propagation and Disposition of seedlings	Production, propagation and procurement of seedling stock and disposition of seedlings	<p>For this month, seeds of Kamagong, Molave, Ipil and Guyabano were sowed for production.</p> <p>Number of seedlings released: A total of 415 assorted seedlings were disposed to various requesting constituents composed of 60 forest tree seedlings, 305 fruit-bearing tree seedlings and 50 bamboo propagules;</p> <p>Mortality rate at 5.5% was incurred caused by waterlogging of some seedling beds induced by continuous rainfall.</p> <p>Stock balance: 44,468 seedlings as of January 31, 2022</p>
b. Maintenance works	Maintenance of Provincial Nursery; Operation of Clonal Nursery; Brushing, ring weeding and greening of two nurseries; arrangement, and sorting of seedlings for hardening; seed and collection and propagation; and other activities that may be assigned to be accomplished during the period	Supervised and led by ENRO personnel assigned, 4 contractual laborers ensures the conduct of regular maintenance and operations of the nursery. Activities include improvement of seedling beds, soil potting for the seeds, seeds and wildlings collection, transplanting and sorting of seedlings.

Also , regular monitoring of extraction of sand and gravel and other quarry resources is conducted which shall serve as basis for the collection of taxes and other related fees by the Provincial Treasurer's Office.</p>	<p>As of January 31, 2022, a total of One Hundred Eighty Six (186) haulers/dealers/traders and retailers in trading mineral products and by-products were accredited with corresponding fees collected by the PTO amounting to Four Hundred Sixty Eight Thousand Seven Hundred Twenty (Php468,720.00) pesos and One Hundred Fifteen Thousand Five Hundred (Php115,500.00) pesos for Accreditation Sticker of 1,155 equipment.</p>
