Production/Propagation and Disposition of seedlings	Production, propagation and procurement of seedling stock and disposition of seedlings	<p>Number of seedlings produced: A total of 125 forest trees seedlings were produced.</p> <p>Number of seedlings released: A total 891 assorted seedlings were disposed to various requesting constituents composed of 275 forest tree seedlings, 611 fruit-bearing tree seedlings, and 5 propagules;</p> <p>On the other hand, 1.32% mortality was incurred.</p> <p>Stock balance: 42,205 seedlings as of October 31, 2022.</p>

Climate Change Mitigation/Adaptation and DRRM Initiaves	Implementation of forest rehabilitation and other greening efforts such as but not limited to watershed rehabilitation, agro-forestry, riparian rehabilitation & development, mangrove & beach forests rehabilitation and urban greening with the aim to reduce the causes of global warming and its effect to biodiversity; and protect communities from risks of hazards caused by natural calamities.	<p><b>Mangrove and Beach Forests Rehabilitation Project:</b></p> <p>On October 3-7, 2022, personnel of this Office together with PGSO personnel conducted on-site inspection of the Beach and Mangrove Forest Rehabilitation projects located at Brgys. Maligaya, Culasi and San Isidro, Palanan and Brgys. Bicobian and Dimasalansan, Divilacan, Isabela. The inspection affirmed the following:</p> <p><b>Palanan, Isabela</b> - Beach forest rehabilitation were conducted at Brgys. Culasi; Sitio Sabang, Brgy Maligaya; and Brgy. San Isidro. Seedlings of Botong, Talisay and Agoho were planted with 3m x 3m spacing. Specifically at Brgys. Culasi and San Isidro, planting areas were along 5-kilometer stretch of the sea shore of each barangay; while the area planted at Brgy. Maligaya was the continuation of the same project implemented since 2018. As observed, the seedlings showed high survival rate, particularly Agoho which means it is the most suitable species in the sites. On the other hand, the mangrove forest rehabilitation project was implemented at Brgy. Maligaya. Enrichment planting was done using rattan and bakawan propagules. During the inspection, the planting was not yet fully implemented, awaiting for the propagules at the nursery to be hardened and appropriate for outplanting.</p>

		<p><b>Divilacan, Isabela</b> - Beach forest rehabilitation project was implemented at Brgy. Bicobian in continuation of the development of project established in 2021. As planned, seedlings of agoho, botong and talisay were planted. The previous areas were also monitored and most of the planted seedlings area already 2-3 feet. Replanting was also visibly observed, considering the height of some planted seedlings.</p> <p><b>Watershed Rehabilitation Project:</b>  <b>Delfin Albano, Isabela</b> - On October 12, 2022, personnel of this office supervised the implementation of Watershed Rehabilitation Project at Brgy. Carmencita, Delfin Albano. Under this project, the Provincial Government provided a total of 4,000 seedlings of indigenous forest and fruit trees to be planted within Gumiran SWIP watershed; a continuation of the same project established in 2021. The area is an LGU-declared protected area for bird sanctuary, hence tree seedlings provided were more of bird-attracting species. The LGU conducted the site preparation and planting utilizing their Cash-for-Work beneficiaries. Maintenance and protection shall be the counterpart of the LGU thru their MENRO.</p> <p><b>Riparian Rehabilitation Project:</b>  Personnel of this Office together with DSWD-FO Isabela representative, conducted monitoring and inspection of Riparian Rehabilitation projects at the following:  <b>San Guillermo, Isabela</b> - On October 11, 2022, project areas at the Municipality of San Guillermo were inspected. As observed, assorted bamboo propagules and Mahogany seedlings were planted with individual tree guards. Accordingly, monthly maintenance and protection activities particularly ring-weeding and brushing shall be conducted and led by the MDRRM-Office together with the barangay officials.  <b>Echague, Isabela</b> - On October 13, 2022, project areas at Brgys. Malitao and Pangal Sur were inspected. As observed, the bamboos were properly planted are expected to have high survival rate. The team further recommended to the barangay officials to complete individual tree guards in addition to the maintenance activities conducted.</p>

Preparation Workshop of the 2024 Project Proposal for Risk Resiliency Program thru Cash for Work		<p><b>October 4, 2022</b> - The Provincial Government of Isabela thru its Technical Working Group conducted 2024 Project Proposal Preparation Workshop at Amphitheater, Provincial Capitol, City of Ilagan, Isabela. Said workshop aimed at consolidating and incorporating all proposed plans of all City/Municipal LGUs of the Province in the final 2024 RRP-CCAM-CFW Project Proposal of the Provincial Government. A total of thirty-two (32) participants composed of various Municipal Social Welfare Development and Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Officers/Representatives.</p> <p><b>October 26-28, 2022</b> - Attended the Program Review and Evaluation of CCAM-CFW implementation held at Diocitas Hotel, Santiago City. The workshop was aimed to review and evaluate the CCAM-CFW Project implementation in the province.</p>

3. One Million Trees One Day Tree Planting Project Stakeholders' Meeting		<p><b>October 6 and 13, 2022</b> - Another round of Stakeholders' Meetings was conducted by the PGI for the second and third batch of prospective donors and volunteers from the different government offices and private organizations/entities within the province to take part in the Reforestation Target Action dubbed as "One Million Bamboos in One Day Planting Activity". Led by Atty. Noel Manuel R. Lopez, Provincial Administrator; Atty. Elizabeth C. Binag, Provincial Information Officer; and For. Geronimo P. Cabaccan, Jr, ENR Officer of the PGI, the meeting aimed to seek pledges of support and commitment from all stakeholders present and be together as one in attaining this immense Reforestation Target Action "One Million Trees in One Day Tree Planting Project for this year 2022". As a result, the two meetings were able to attain commitment of more or less 250,000 bamboo propagules.</p>

<b>D. Monitoring of Sanitary Landfill Facility</b>	<p>Pursuant to the provisions of the Local Government Code (RA No. 7160) and Ecological Solid Waste Management (ESWM) Act of 2000 (RA 9003), LGUs are mandated as the primary responsible bodies for the implementation and enforcement of ecological solid waste management system within their respective jurisdiction.</p>	<p>Conducted monitoring and inspection of waste disposal facilities of different municipalities and the following were the observations, to wit:</p> <p><b>1. SLF located at So. Namnama Brgy. Santos, Quezon, Isabela-</b> The SLF is operational since 2012. One-fourth portion of the 1st cell was backfilled with soil and was planted with various trees as Ecopark. There are 2 scavengers present in the area and according to them, their collected recyclable waste per month reaches up to 300-400 kgs. It was likewise observed that the waste disposed in the area is not 100% residual waste but the area is not odorous. There are tree plantations established around the SLF compound and the collected biodegradable wastes coming from the market were piled near the forested area located at the back of the vermicomposting building.</p> <p><b>2. SLF located at So. Sta. Catalina Brgy. Manano, Mallig, Isabela-</b> There are personnel assigned in the area. The facility has MRF for final sorting, drainage canal, leachate pond although empty, monitoring well, vaults for hazardous waste, fence, and vegetation. It was observed that the cell is too deep and it has not yet been covered with soil since its operation in 2018. But according to MENRO Florence Estigoy, a second cell will be opened in the last quarter of 2023. The SLF is odorless and no flies were observed.</p>

		<p><b>3. RCA and proposed SLF Site at San Agustin, Isabela-</b> The RCA caters only 4 urban barangays in the municipality. All collected plastic residual wastes with potential were shredded and placed in the MRF to minimize the space of the RCA. Although the MRF doors were broken and the recyclable and special waste accumulated in the MRF were scattered and not properly organized. The LGU has a plan to enter into a MOA with a certain contractor for the production of bricks. While the proposed SLF is located at Brgy. Santos, San Agustin, Isabela and has a total land area of 7 hectares with a 7 million budget for implementation next year.</p>
<p><b>E. Search for the Most Environment-Friendly Barangays in the Province of Isabela</b></p>	<p>The Provincial Government of Isabela-Provincial Solid Waste Management Board thru the Environment and Natural Resources Office as its implementing arm paved way again for the conduct of Search for the Most Environment-Friendly Barangays to give due recognition and initiatives in the institutionalization of the solid waste management system within their respective jurisdictions as mandated under RA No. 9003 and its implementing rules and regulations.</p>	<p>Conducted evaluation on the Search for the Most Environment-Friendly Barangays in the province of Isabela. The Board of Evaluators includes representatives from the Department of Interior and Local Government (DILG) Provincial Office, DENR-EMB-PEMU, ENR Office representing the Isabela Local League of Environment and Natural Resources Federation and the PAYOGA/KAPATAGAN Multipurpose Cooperative Inc., an NGO, all of whom are members of the Provincial Solid Waste Management Board (PSWMB). The validation team is now in the 3rd and 4th week of the conduct of evaluation of entry to the following barangays; to wit:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Brgy. 











