Seminar/Workshop on Profiling For Biodiversity Conservation and Wildlife Law Enforcement</p>		<p>Personnel of this Office travelled to Tumauni, Isabela to conduct preparation and facilitation activities while at the same time attend the conduct of the Seminar/Workshop on Profiling for Biodiversity Conservation and Wildlife Law Enforcement.</p> <p>Initiated and organized by the Provincial Government of Isabela thru the Environment and Natural Resources Office on May 25-26, 2023 at Camp Samal, Arcon, Tumauni, Isabela, this seminar aims to provide participants the knowledge and skills necessary to conduct profiling activities on biodiversity conservation and enhancement programs and wildlife law enforcement within the jurisdiction of their respective cities/municipalities in the province of Isabela.</p> <p>A total of thirty-three (33) City/Municipal ENR Officers and three (3) representatives coming from the different cities/municipalities of Isabela participated in the said seminar.</p>

Subject Matter Experts (SMEs) from DENR-PENRO Isabela, For. Nestor S. Lorenzo, Park Operations Superintendent (POSu) of the Northern Sierra Madre Natural Park (NSMNP) and Ms. Luzviminda U. Rosario, Environmental Management Specialist (EMS) II were invited to share their knowledge and expertise on Biodiversity Conservation and Wildlife Law Enforcement together with Mr. Mario Sotto, the Volunteer Bantay Sanktwaryo of Mabuwaya Foundation, Inc.

The SMEs presented and discussed Republic Act No. 9147 also known as Wildlife Resources Conservation and Protection Act; Inland Wetland Orientation & Information Sheet; Orientation on Urban Biodiversity & Assessment Methods; and Establishment and Habitat Assessment Including Fauna.

After the lectures, an open forum was conducted and the following issues and concerns were raised and addressed as follows:

- CLUP and Zoning Ordinances can form part of the LGU documents for wetlands/inlands and green spaces indicators since the rivers, creeks and green spaces are already included in the CLUP;
- Rapid Assessment of the Biophysical Characteristics of wetlands or green spaces is needed prior to passing of an ordinance declaring an area as conservation area and full-site assessment shall follow;
- Sample forms for wetland and green spaces assessment shall be emailed to each of the participants;
- Some LGUs have already prepared supporting documents for the new SGLG indicators on wetlands, biodiversity and green spaces such as ordinances, PPAs, maps and others and they were willing to share sample documents as basis of other LGUs in preparing their respective documents; and
- A copy of outputs of LGUs in the inventory of wetlands and green spaces shall be submitted to PGI on for consolidation. These are also needed/required for the SGLG assessment and evaluation.

The participants especially the newly designated MENROs were very grateful for this timely and relevant seminar/workshop as venue for new learnings and capacitation for more exciting challenges the LGUs are facing in implementing ENR devolved functions and enforcement of corresponding laws, policies, rules and regulations.

### A. Activities under Provincial Ecology Center

**B. Monitoring of waste disposal facilities (SLF and RCA)**

Pursuant to the provisions of the Local Government Code (RA No. 7160) and Ecological Solid Waste Management (ESWM) Act of 2000 (RA 9003), LGUs are mandated as the primary responsible bodies for the implementation and enforcement of ecological solid waste management system within their respective jurisdiction.

One of the programs as devolved functions of the Provincial Government of Isabela thru the Environment and Natural Resources Office is the monitoring of waste disposal and solid waste management system of Municipal and City LGUs as well as the Provincial-operated hospitals as mandated under RA 9003.

The following sites were monitored, to wit:

**Roxas Sanitary Landfill Facility-May 10, 2023**  
The SLF was located at Barangay San Placido, Roxas with an area of 11 hectares and approximately 11 kilometers from the Municipal hall.  
**Findings:**  
1. There were 3 cells of SLF: the first Cell was vegetated with tall grasses; second Cell was covered with approximately 0.3 meter thick soil; and the third Cell was ready to be utilized;  
2. They have rotary composter for biodegradable; three (3) shredder machines for residual wastes; a plastic pulverizer; and a densifier machine for the production of bricks out of plastic but still un-operational;  
3. Four (4) garbage trucks were utilized for the collection of wastes;  
4. Out of twenty six (26) barangays, thirteen (13) were active in the collection and segregation of solid wastes;  
5. The schedule of collection of wastes at Poblacion were conducted twice a day and approximately 6,000 kilograms of wastes were collected per day. On the other hand, every Friday, Saturday and Sunday is the schedule of collection of wastes for the thirteen barangays. About 750 kilograms of wastes were collected per day;  
6. They don't have records for recyclable and residual with potential received and biodegradable for composting.

		<p><b>San Manuel SLF</b>  Monitored and inspected the three (3) hectares SLF, approximately 8 kilometers away from the National Highway. According to Mr. Jeho Sadac, they will start to procure materials needed for the construction of their SLF and initial construction of road leading to the site. Accordingly, everyday they collect mixed wastes and delivered immediately to the SLF of Cauayan City. Their MOA will expire this coming December, 2023.</p> <p><b>Recommendations:</b>  1. Implement and enforce RA 9003 Sec. 21 and 22, segregation and collection of wastes;  2. Regular IEC regarding RA 9003 shall be conducted to all households in every barangay.</p>
		<p><b>Aurora RCA</b>  The RCA is located at the back of their Municipal Hall. Accordingly, their RCA was not currently functional since they stored sacks of rice seeds. Everyday was the collection of wastes and delivered to the Sanitary Landfill of Cauayan City. According to MENRO Casiano they don't have available area suited for the construction of their SLF.</p>
<p><b>C. Healthcare Waste Management</b></p>	<p>Pursuant to the provisions of the Local Government Code (RA No. 7160) and the Ecological Solid Waste Management (ESWM) Act of 2000 (RA 9003), LGUs are mandated as the primary responsible bodies for the implementation and enforcement of ecological solid waste management system within their respective jurisdictions.</p>	<p><b>Manuel A Roxas District Hospital- May 11, 2023</b>  Results of the monitoring were as follows:  1. The collection of residual wastes were scheduled every Sunday collected by the Barangay;  2. Hazardous wastes were thrown in their compost pit and recyclable wastes were sold to junkshop;  3. Healthcare wastes such as syringes were placed in plastic bottles (galloon) that are stored in their MRF and collected by the private transporter;  4. They have septic vault for pathological wastes such as placenta and blood;  5. The trash bins outside the hospital were color coded but not properly labelled. While the trashbin inside were not color coded and not properly labelled;  6. All of their wastes were mixed.</p> <p><b>Recommendations:</b>  1. The District Hospital needs additional color coded and properly labelled trash bins inside and outside the hospital; and  2. Maintain the cleanliness of the hospital premises.</p>



<p><b>D. Joint Anti-Smoke Belching Camapign</b></p>	<p>The conduct of anti-smoke belching test of motor vehicles using the opacimeter machine in partnership with the DENR-EMB and DOTR-LTO Regional Office which aims to promote public awreness about air pollution.</p>	<p>Conducted anti-smoke belching campaign on May 26, 2023 at National Highway Brgy. San Pedro, Tumauni, Isabela. A total of twenty five (25) diesel engine vehicles were checked and tested. All the vehicles tested met the opacity standard. Among these vehicles, one vehicle was already checked and tested by the DENR-EMB Region 02 personnel, hence, was issued a Certificate of Compliance last April, 2023.</p>

	<p>Through the Provincial Mining Regulatory Board (PMRB), Permit Applications who have passed board deliberation shall be indorsed to the Provincial Governor for his approval</p>	<p>On May 3, 2023, the Provincial Mining Regualtory Board (PMRB) convened where Ten (10) received CSAG Permit Applications were deliberated. After thorough review, Resolution No. 2023-01 Endorsing Ten (10) Commercial Sand and Gravel (CSAG) Permit Renewal in the Province of Isabela was approved.</p>

D. Field Monitoring of Quarry Areas		
<p><b>1. Regular field inspection and monitoring</b></p>	<p>This activity is in line with the implementation of Provincial Ordinance No. 5, series of 2014, to effectively regulate the utilization and monitor extraction activities, ensuring all necessary environmental measures are implemented in the quarry areas.</p> <p>Also, monitoring reports on extraction of sand and gravel and other quarry resources shall serve as basis for the collection of taxes and other related fees by the Provincial Treasurer's Office.</p>	<p>For this month, continued site inspection, monitoring of compliances to necessary permits and supervision of personnel assigned to various quarry areas were implemented.</p> <p>Compliance to extraction measures such as extraction in the main river bed, no screening of materials in the main river bed policy and pre-payment of quarry taxes and fees were checked at the Municipalities of Tumauni, Cabagan, Sta. Maria, Delfin Albano, Sta. Maria and San Pablo. At the same time, checking of Accreditation Permit of haulers and transporters of sand and gravel materials through random inspection of vehicles hauling and transporting sand and gravel materials. Inspected vehicles were already accredited. Reports of non-compliance were acted. Operators with monitored extraction without pre-payments were notified for post-payment. All personnel assigned at their respective areas were present, while those with no operation were either assigned to other areas with on-going operations or reported to the Provincial Nursery and conducted nursery activities.</p>
<p><b>2. Monitoring of extraction activities</b></p>		<p>For the month of May, a total of 80,087.00 cu.m. were monitored to have been extracted from the different quarry areas in the province. This represents 6,767.00 Earth, 70,928.00 Mixed, 740.00 G1/S1 and 1,652.00 Boulders; and with gross value amounting to Php 2,809,650.00 fees and taxes.</p> <p>Reports on extractions were accompanied by daily field monitoring reports and delivery receipts.</p> <p>Also, based on record, a total of Php 1,161,005.75 gross value of fees and taxes was remitted to PTO this month as prepayment to 32,464.86 cu.m. of Boulders, Ordinar Earth, G1S1 and Mixed gravel materials.</p> <p>Post-payment was also remitted for the monitored extracted aggregates with volume totalling to 22,959.17 cu.m. corresponding to Php 1,046,615.75 taxes and fees.</p>

<b>E. Other Related Activities</b>		
<b>1. Attendance/ Participation re Invitaitaion to Meetings/Dialogues and Request for Technical Assistance Related to Mineral Resources Management</b>		<p><b>May 10-12, 2023</b> - In response to letter invitation from Mines and Geosciences Bureau (MGB) R-02, personnel of this Office joined in the conduct of inspection, verification, assessment and inventory of illegal small-scale mining activities at the Municipality of Cordon, Isabela. Result of the activity affirms the presence of ball mills at Barangays San Luis, Caquilingan, Anonang, Camarao and Dallao, Cordon. Out of the 24 ball mills actual inventoried, 5 were operating during the inspection which confirms the presence of illegal small-scale mining activity in the area.</p> <p><b>May 24, 2023</b> - As a follow-up to the above activity led by the MGB R02, personnel of this office joined in the conduct issuance of Cease and Desist Order to operators of ball mills. A meeting was conducted together with representatives of LGU prior to the activity, and as a result, the issuance was deferred as the LGU requested to.</p>
<b>IV. OTHER PROGRAM/PROJECT/ACTIVITY</b>		
<b>1. Meetings, Seminars, Trainings and Workshops Attended</b>		<p><b>May 1-4, 2023</b> - Personnel of this office attended and served as one of the Resource Persons to the Divilacan Youth Congress with the theme: “Engaging the Youth in Nation Building and Environmental Conservation” held at Lanai Marine Turtle Sanctuary, Barangay Bicobian, Divilacan, Isabela. The youth congress was also aimed as a part of the celebration of 2023 Month of the Ocean, considering the Divilacan, Isabela is one of the coastal municipalities of Isabela endowed with rich marine biodiversity and resources.</p> <p>This office presented the different environment conservation PPAs of the province, such as the Rehabilitation of Watersheds, Riparian, Mangrove and Beach Forests; highlighting the Reforestation Target Action: One Million Trees in One Day Planting Program, sharing to them the role played by the youth in the implementation, leading to the success of the program. Ending the sharing was the challenge given to the youth of Divilacan of how they shall influence their fellow youth to actively participate in the conservation programs of their LGU.</p>

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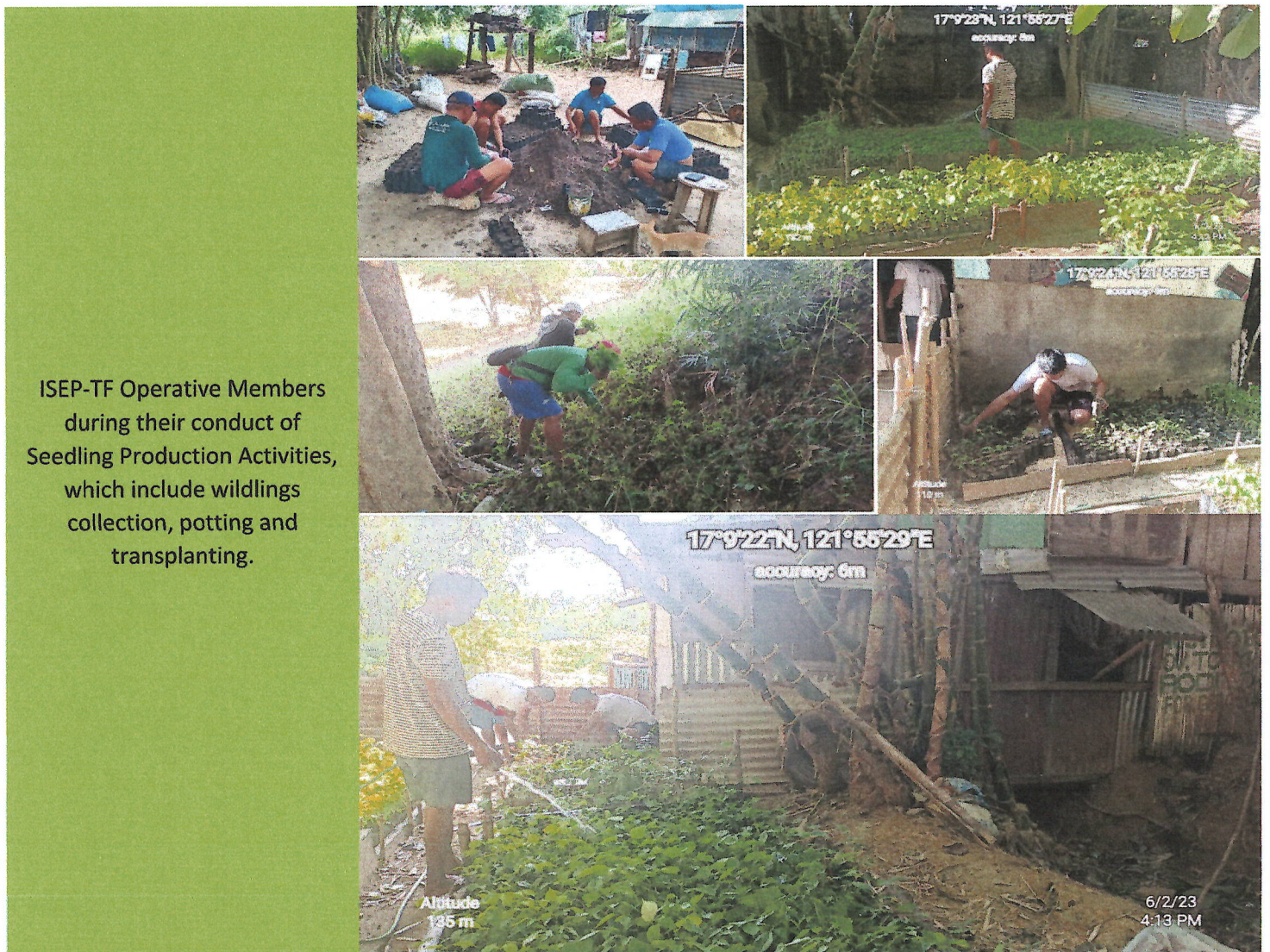

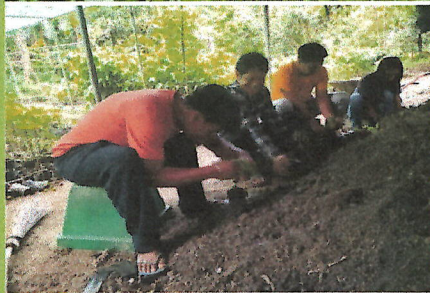
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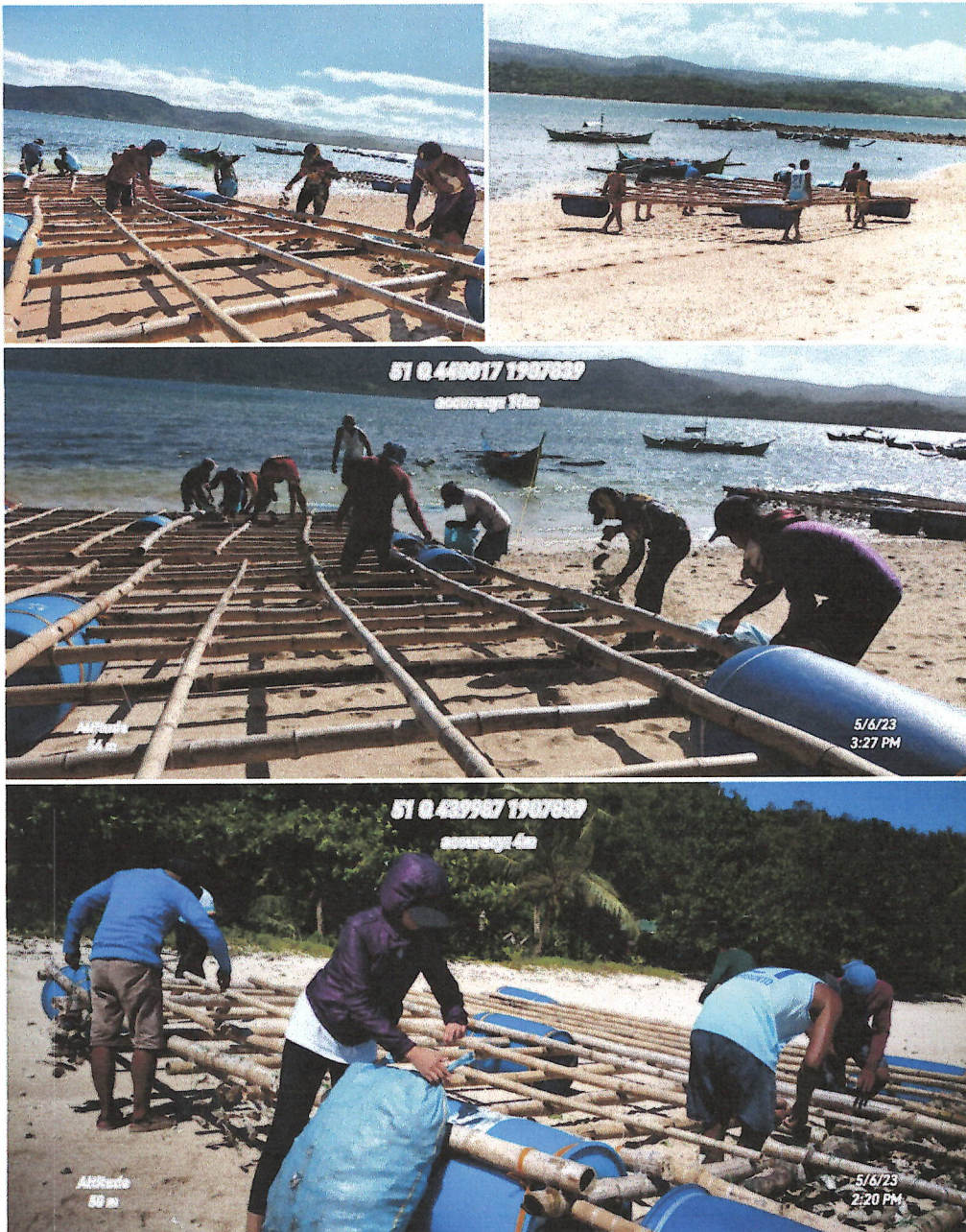
