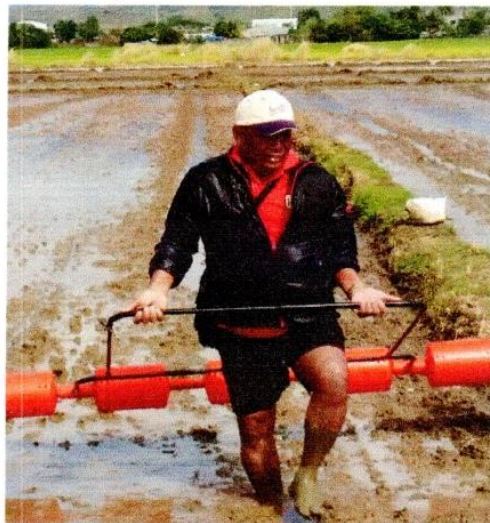

Majority of the standing crops are on its reproductive phase.

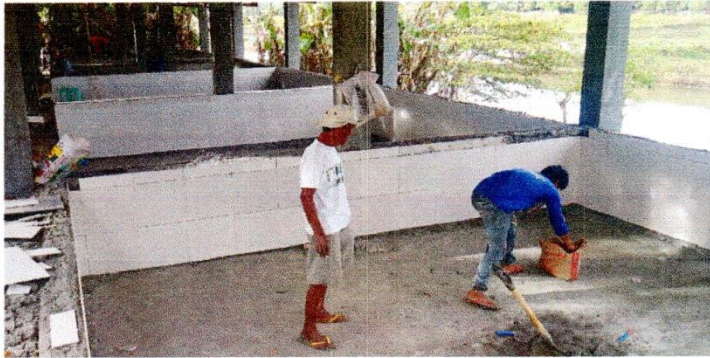
