

Provincial Cooperative, Livelihood, and Enterprise Development Office

The Provincial Cooperative, Livelihood and Enterprise Development Office (PCLEDO) has been the premier technical and social services support arm of the Provincial Government of Isabela in the delivery of services to cooperatives and other multi-sectors, such as groups of professionals, farmers, fisher folks and the like and micro and small entrepreneurs in the province, to help them develop into becoming viable and responsive economic enterprises.

THE PCLEDO

In July 1992, Governor Benjamin G. Dy's priority thrust was the creation of the Provincial Cooperative Office (PCO) which eventually resulted in the creation of the Provincial Cooperative Officer. There were only three (3) regular personnel of the said office, namely: Provincial Cooperatives Officer, Cooperative Development Specialist (CDS) IV and CDS III. On the same year, the province organized a cooperative development council, the Isabela Provincial Cooperatives Development Council (then known as the Provincial Cooperative Advisory Council), prior to the issuance of Executive Order No. 95 & 96 of former president, Hon. Fidel V. Ramos.

The PCO is mandated to oversee the cooperative programs with emphasis on the promotion, organization, education, and development of cooperatives in the province, as per Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of the Philippines. Since its creation, the PCO has constantly accommodated numerous requests from multi-sectors, group of professionals, farmers, fisher folks, women, irrigators association and the like, to conduct cooperative orientations in the different municipalities, to include remote barangays.

With the provincial government's declared policy to support and strengthen the cooperatives development program and enhance cooperatives as institutions to promote savings consciousness and as vehicles that will provide entrepreneurs with capital, technology, and market, on 20 April 2001, through SP Resolution No. 0036 approving Ordinance No. 002, Series of 2001, the Provincial Cooperative Office was renamed as the Provincial Cooperatives Development Office.

Two decades after, on February 16, 2021, in Ordinance No, 2021-07-01, the PCDO was renamed to Provincial Cooperative, Livelihood & Enterprise Development Office (PCLEDO) reflecting the incorporation in its annual work plan the integration of cooperative concept in livelihood and community-based activities, the promotion, growth, and development of enterprises and opportunities for self-employment of individuals or their engagement in any preferred income-generating activities.

A. COOPERATIVE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Mandated to oversee the cooperative programs with emphasis on the promotion, organization, education, and development of cooperatives in the province, the Office received and processed requests relating to the following cooperative development programs: assistance in registration of various groups, and the provision of technical assistance and the conduct of mandatory trainings and seminars to existing cooperatives.

1. REGULATORY ASSISTANCE TO ASPIRING COOPERATIVES

For the year 2022, the Office **assisted a total of 63 groups** in their registration with the Cooperative Development Authority (CDA) bringing the total number of registered cooperatives in the province to 812. Assistance provided to newly registered cooperatives includes the conduct of cooperative orientation and the preparation of their registration documents. The Office also assisted the CDA Regional Office 02 in the conduct of Pre-Registration Seminars, a pre-requirement for an aspiring cooperative. 


Chart No. 1: Comparison of number of registered cooperatives by year.

(As of December 31, 2022)




Chart No. 2: Status of Cooperatives by Type.

As of December 31, 2022, Credit type of cooperative has the most number of registered cooperatives in Isabela with a combined number of 239 for 29%. It is followed by Agriculture with 177, or 22%, and Multipurpose with 158, or 20%.




Chart No. 3: Status of Cooperatives by compliance.

Of the 812 registered cooperatives in Isabela, 53%, or 429, are compliant and has been issued by the Cooperative Development Authority with Certificate of Compliance. 9%, or 71 registered cooperatives has been cancelled and or delisted by the CDA.

2. COOPERATIVE TRAININGS AND SEMINARS

An accredited training provider (CDA CTPRO 113, pursuant to CDA Memorandum Circular No. 2015-10), the Office provided technical assistance to various existing and prospect cooperatives to enhance the organizational and operational skills of officers and members for them to develop into viable socioeconomic enterprises through the provision of cooperative trainings and seminars.

Pursuant to Art. 44, Republic Act No. 9520, as further defined and implemented by Rule 7 of the Revised Rules and Regulation Implementing Certain and Special Provisions of Republic Act No. 9520 and the CDA Memorandum Circular No. 2015-09, officers of cooperatives are required to undergo the mandatory trainings and other additional appropriate trainings. Failure to comply shall be a ground of non-issuance of their Certificates of Compliance. For 2022, this Office conducted 28 trainings and seminars with 2,700 cumulative number of attendees from various cooperatives. (Annex B: List of seminars/trainings conducted)

3. OTHER COOPERATIVE ENHANCEMENT ACTIVITIES

3.1. 2022 Cooperative Month Celebration

As in the previous years, the Office led the provincial government in the conduct of the month-long celebration of the October Cooperative Month with the national theme "KOOPINAS: Nagkakaisang Lakas Para Sa Makabuluhan at Sama-samang Pag-unlad". Aside from the simultaneous hanging of streamers and the conduct of a series of seminars, the following activities were conducted:

- 3.1.1. Cooperative Bloodletting out of 330 donor-attendees, 168 qualified in the assessment. 168 bags @ 450cc for a total of 75,600cc were collected by the following partners:
 - 3.1.1.1. Gov. Faustino N. Dy Memorial Hospital 45 bags for a total of 20,250cc
 - 3.1.1.2. Cagayan Valley Medical Center 123 bags for a total of 55,350cc

- 3.1.2. **23**rd **Gov. Faustino N. Dy Sr. (GFNDy) Awards** Now on its 23rd year, the GFNDy Awards for Best Performing Cooperatives and Cooperative Leaders is the brainchild of Ms. Corazon C. Calderon, the 5th Chairperson of the Isabela Provincial Cooperative Development Council. The Awards aims to recognize the valuable contributions of cooperatives as delivery system for government programs and projects as well as to further boost NGO-GO partnerships in all frontiers of development and growth of the province of Isabela. - 3.1.3. **Product Collaboration** in partnership with the Isabela Provincial Employees Multi-Purpose Cooperative (IPEMPC) and various cooperatives, a product collaboration was held at the Tienda Isabela, Capitol Compound, Alibagu, City of Isabela. In this activity, products of various cooperatives were marketed at the Tienda Isabela.
- 3.1.4. Participation in the Regional Cooperative Month Celebration

3.2. Other Speaking Engagements

3.2.1. This Office's Department Head, Mr. Ric-Justice E. Angobung (otherwise represented by a senior employee of the Office in some cases) was also invited as Keynote Speaker in the General Assemblies of the following cooperatives: Ana na Isabela Credit Cooperative, Roxas Hybrid Multi-Purpose Cooperative, Bannawig Multi-Purpose Cooperative, Jones Producers Cooperative, various Cooperatives in the municipalities of San Pablo and Sta. Maria, and various cooperatives and associations in Cabagan, Isabela.

3.3. Other Activities

3.3.1. Massive Campaign for the Implementation of Republic Act No. 11535, or the An Act Making The Position Of A Cooperatives Development Officer Mandatory In The Municipal, City And Provincial Levels, Amending For The Purpose Republic Act. No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, As Amended — this Office has awarded recognitions to local government units who have implemented the law.

B. LIVELIHOOD and ENTERPRISE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

With the Office mandated to create livelihood and entrepreneurial opportunities for all Isabeleños but more particularly benefiting the marginalized sectors, and to utilize to the fullest all available socio-economic resources to accelerate and sustain the economic development of the province, this Office incorporated in its annual work plan the integration of cooperative concept in livelihood and community-based activities, the promotion, growth, and development of enterprises and opportunities for self-employment of individuals or their engagement in any preferred income-generating activities.

Isabela Recovery Initiatives to Support Enterprises (I-RISE) Program
In response to the continuing threat of the persisting COVID-19 pandemic, the
provincial government, through this Office, has continuously implemented the IRISE program that aims to support cooperatives, associations, the informal
sectors, transport groups, and the micro and small entrepreneurs whose
livelihood undertakings were affected by the pandemic particularly on the
temporary suspensions of production activities for both goods and services.

For 2022, this Office received a total of **11,781** applications from individual micro and small entrepreneurs and the informal sectors, **47** from various cooperatives and **11** applications from associations. The applications were validated by this Office and **were processed with 123 already released** while the remaining are scheduled for release on the first quarter of 2023. **(Annex D: Summary of received applications)**

2. BROLLA Collections

Institutionalized through Sangguniang Panlalawigan Resolution No. 203-A, Series of 2011, the program aims to provide Isabelenos, either group or individual, access to interest-free livelihood loan assistance as additional capital to further improve their respective businesses. For the year 2022, a total of **P8,001,300.00 payments/repayments were collected.** (Annex E: Summary of collections)

3. Livelihood Trainings and provision of livelihood technical assistance

3.1. Livelihood Trainings - As livelihood trainings require face-to-face assembly for actual workshops, for the year 2022, only **one livelihood training was conducted** by this Office as face-to-face gatherings remained scarce. With the easing of restrictions on face-to-face gatherings by the last quarter of 2022, on December 2022, this Office, and in partnership with the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) Isabela Provincial Office, facilitated the Noodle Making Training for San Antonio Ladies Organization of Cauayan City with a total of 30 member-participants.

3.2. Provision of technical assistance

It is a declared policy of the provincial government to create livelihood and entrepreneurial opportunities for all Isebelenos for them to enjoy a dignified life and to accelerate and sustain the economic development of the province through an integrated approach in the attainment of the following: equip beneficiaries with needed livelihood, managerial, and entrepreneurial skills, values, and knowledge.

A total of **40 groups were profiled and validated** by this Office and were extended technical assistance in the preparation of their respective livelihood proposals.

4. Implementation of Department of Labor and Employment's Programs


The provincial government has been an accredited co-partner of DOLE in the implementation of various DOLE programs, to wit:


4.1. Tulong Panghanapbuhay sa Ating Disadvantaged/Displaced Workers Program (TUPAD) – The TUPAD Program is a community-based package assistance that provides emergency employment for displaced workers, underemployed and seasonal workers, for a specified number of days depending on the nature of work to be performed. The program provided the beneficiaries emergency employment for a minimum of period of 10 days but not exceeding a maximum of 30 days depending on the nature of work to be performed. Mostly, beneficiaries performed tasks such as maintenance or cleaning of public facilities and infrastructures like schools, health centers, de-clogging of canals, and clearing of surroundings.


At the completion of the implementation of TUPAD 2 in 2021 and after successfully complying with the requirements for liquidation, the provincial government sent a letter of intent to DOLE for another implementation of the program. By the last quarter of 2021, the request of the provincial government was approved and a fund of 70,059,500.00 was awarded in December 2021 for implementation in 2022.

For the year 2022, the province registered the highest number of assisted TUPAD beneficiaries in the Region. A total of **18,935** beneficiaries for TUPAD 3 was implemented on the first quarter of 2022 with a total project cost of 74,149,460.00. Still on the same year, a project cost worth 89,758,300.00 was awarded to the provincial government benefiting **24,259 TUPAD** beneficiaries (TUPAD 4, implemented on the second quarter of 2022). On the third quarter of 2022, an amount of 100,000,000.00 project cost (TUPAD 5) was again awarded to the province to benefit 23,395 beneficiaries. The first tranche of the TUPAD 5 amounting to 50,000,000.00 was implemented in December of 2022 for **12,129** beneficiaries. The second tranche is scheduled for implementation on the first quarter of 2023.

With this, for the year 2022, the provincial government, in close coordination with the DOLE – Isabela Field Office and the respective Public Employment Services Office (PESO) Managers of the local government units, was able to assist a total of 55,323 beneficiaries. 4.2. DOLE's Integrated Livelihood Program (KABUHAYAN Program)

The Department of Labor and Employment's (DOLE) Integrated Livelihood Program, otherwise known as the KABUHAYAN Program, is a grant assistance for capacity building on livelihood for the working poor, vulnerable, and marginalized workers, either for individual or group livelihood projects. The program seeks to contribute to poverty reduction and reduce vulnerability to risks of the poor, vulnerable, and marginalized workers by providing them access to livelihood undertakings.

In partnership with the Provincial Government of Isabela as its accredited co-partner (ACP), the convergence of DOLE's Kabuhayan Program and the provincial government's Livelihood Development Program aimed to aid community groups and individuals in developing them into a sustainable enterprise to enjoy a better and dignified quality of life.

The provincial government of Isabela set the core of its thrust for the people of Isabela. With this, the provincial government has embarked on various programs and activities all aimed at strengthening and elevating the status of life of the Isabeleños. This is in line with the goal of the national government of inclusive growth particularly in contributing to poverty reduction and reduce the vulnerability to risks of the poor, vulnerable, and marginalized workers.

Hence, this convergence of initiatives allowed beneficiaries to take proactive actions that can improve their condition of living with less dependence on government. Moreover, the package of assistance of the program aimed to initiate undertaking that would enhance their income generating capacity amidst the threat of the persisting COVID19 pandemic and other economic challenges.

Annex G provides the list of beneficiaries with **117 associations** and **369 individuals**. The beneficiaries were pre-identified by the respective Local Government Units (LGUs) and were profiled by the DOLE – Isabela Field Office (DOLE-IFO) for validation. To equip beneficiaries with basic livelihood skills and the preparation of their respective project proposals prior the awarding of their livelihood assistance, a series of seminar-workshops were organized by DOLE – IFO in close coordination with the LGUs and the Provincial Cooperative, Livelihood and Enterprise Development Office (PCLEDO).

In compliance to Section 11 of DOLE's Department Order No. 173, Series of 2017, the approved livelihood projects were those that support the needs of workers, and the development needs of the community consistent with the priorities of the Local Development Plan, particularly the following: Agribusiness; Retail trade; Local-based industries; Support to tourism, and; Marketing and production (processed food, other products).

Charts below provides the summary of livelihood projects per category:




Chart 7. Summary of approved group livelihood projects per category.




Chart 8. Summary of approved individual livelihood projects per category.

The awarding of livelihood assistance (in the form of raw materials, tools and jigs, and other support services) were held on various dates at the Isabela Multi-Purpose Evacuation Center, the PCLEDO compound, and in various community centers in the province.

C. **OTHER ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

Rice Subsidy Program

Recognizing the role of every employee of the provincial government in the efficient delivery of services to the Isabeleños, a Rice Subsidy Program for the men and women of the PGI has continuously been implemented, a testament of the strong desire of the Honorable Governor and Hon. Vice Governor to uplift the living conditions of every Isabeleños through the essence of generosity.

The subsidy program aims to intensify support for the PGI employees having important roles to perform in facilitating opportunities to every Isabeleños. As one of the faces closest to the people, the employees are expected to demonstrate the highest standard of professionalism in the realization of the Quality Policy the PGI is committed to. As a reward for exemplifying said commitment, and as a tool to further inspire every employee, Governor Albano institutionalized the Rice Subsidy Program that provides additional non-cash incentives over and above the salary compensation of the employees.

Also included in the subsidy program are the barangay frontliners -Barangay Health Workers, Barangay Nutrition Scholars, and Barangay Day Care Workers. Also acknowledging the role of national line agencies as partners in the development and progress of the province, Governor Albano extended the program to national line agencies with offices in the province, which include the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) and the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE).

Hitting two birds with one stone, the program also aims to support the marginalized rice farmers of the province by buying the rice requirements directly from the local farmers, a testament of Governor Albano's genuine concern for farmers.

In summary, from January to December 2022, 44,102 bags @ 20kgs were distributed to PGI employees and personnel of DOLE - Isabela Field Office and Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) - Isabela Provincial Office; 83,568 bags @ 10kgs for barangay frontliners; and 2,970 bags @ 5kgs for Barangay Population Workers.
