



Also included in the program are the barangay frontliners – Barangay Health Workers, Barangay Nutrition Scholars, and Barangay Day Care Workers. Acknowledging the role of national line agencies as partners in the development and progress of the province, the program is extended to national line agencies with offices in the province. Equally important, the program also aims to support the marginalized rice farmers of the province by buying the rice requirements directly from the local farmers, a testament of Governor Albano's genuine concern for farmers.
