Also included in the program are the barangay frontliners – Barangay Health Workers, Barangay Nutrition Scholars, and Barangay Day Care Workers. Acknowledging the role of national line agencies as partners in the development and progress of the province, the program is extended to national line agencies with offices in the province.
