 Government Records Officers' Association of the Philippines, Inc. (GROAP, Inc.) Standardization of Records Filing Classification and Tracking Systems in Public Office

In its continued pursuit of excellence in government operations, the Government Records Officers' Association of the Philippines, Inc. (GROAP, Inc.) invited the Provincial Government of Isabela (PGI) to the training seminar titled "Standardization of Records Filing Classification and Tracking Systems in Public Office," held on December 11-13, 2024, at Citystate Asturias Hotel, Puerto Princesa City, Palawan.

The seminar aimed to equip participants with the skills and knowledge necessary to implement effective filing, classification, and tracking systems that promote accountability, compliance, and smooth workflow in the public sector.

Among the representatives sent by PGI was Carmina P. Mamuri, Labor and Employment Assistant I, and staff of the Provincial Public Employment Service Office (PPESO), who is also in charge of the office's records filing.

The key topics included in the seminar were:

- Developing standardized filing and classification systems tailored to government operations.
- Implementing records management policies to ensure the security and authenticity of public records.
- Establishing a tracking system for monitoring records across their lifecycle.
- Best practices in retention and disposition of records as part of workflow integration.

Through the training, PGI reinforced its commitment to adapting efficient and modern records management systems that enhance operational excellence.
