I. REFERRAL AND PLACEMENT

A. JOB FAIR

The Provincial Government of Isabela (PGI) through its Public Employment Service Office (PESO) conducted a Job Fair Activity last March 1, 2024 at the Ground Floor, Queen Isabela Park, Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Isabela, in lieu of March 2 – the birthday of the province' beloved Governor Rodolfo T. Albano III.

The said activity was participated by 37 private employers, 6 National Government Agencies (NGAs) who rendered their services, and 257 jobseekers. 42 applicants were hired-on-the-spot (HOTS) and 21 were near hires (for further assessment).

This aims to strengthen student curriculum and adapt to industry standards; request the employers for possible immersion or On-the-Job Training of the students; identify the skills needed for immediate employability; and provide job opportunities for the Isabeleños by networking with different industry-employers for them to recruit suitable employees for their job openings.

- The PESO through PESO Staff Ms. Carmina P. Mamuri represented the PESO Manager and attended in the Isabela Community-Based Monitoring System (CBMS) Provincial Coordinating Board convening last March 20, 2024 at the Piazza Zicarelli Hotel, Restaurant and Bakeshop, Upi Gamu, Isabela.

The 2024 CBMS seeks to update the social registers of national government organizations, primarily the Department of Social Welfare and Development. Aside from data collection, the CBMS aims to capture several factors that can be used for multidimensional poverty analysis, policy formulation, poverty alleviation, and economic development in cities and municipalities across the country.



- PESO Manager Ms. Jeng Reyes represented the Governor and attended in the Launching and Signing of the Declaration of Support to Pilipinas Bayang Banal Movement (PBBM) in Isabela which was held at Isabela State University – Cauayan Campus, Brgy. San Fermin, Cauayan City, Isabela; last March 22, 2024.

The PBBM aims to pursue One God, One Nation, and One Mission Towards Pilipinas Bayang Banal and to promote spirituality and morality as main drivers towards the country's progress.

The event was facilitated by the National Intelligence Coordinating Agency (NICA) R02 and was attended by various organizations from the religious media, and youth sectors, as well as other non-government and cause-oriented organizations.



- The Provincial PESO Staff participated in the PGI's 1st Quarter National Simultaneous Earthquake Drill last March 9, 2023 at the Provincial Capitol Compound in Alibagu, City of Ilagan.



- The PESO through PESO Manager Ms. Jeng Reyes attended in the Exit Conference with the Department Heads in preparation for the Annual Audit Report of the Provincial Government of Isabela for Calendar Year 2023 to discuss the audit results and obtain management's comments on proposed observations and recommendations.
- The PGI through the PESO in partnership with the TESDA Isabela provided livelihood starter toolkits to the 50 persons deprived of liberty (PDLs) in Isabela Provincial Jail, who graduated last year from Bread and Pastry Production NC II and Electrical Installation and Maintenance NC II courses as part of the Special Training Employment Program (STEP).

The livelihood starter toolkits for the 25 graduates of Dressmaking NC II will also be distributed soon.
