# ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT NOVEMBER 2024

#### I. REFERRAL AND PLACEMENT

# A. LOCAL RECRUITMENT ACTIVITY (LRA)

The Provincial Government of Isabela (PGI), through the Provincial Public Employment Service Office (PESO) organized Local Recruitment Activities at the lobby of the PSWDO Bldg, Provincial Capitol Compound, Alibagu, City of Ilagan, on November 22 and 26. The LRAs were led by the following employers:

1. Medical City Clinic-ProSer Health Services, Inc.

On November 22, 33 out of 133 pre-registered applicants for "The Medical City" passed the screening process and attended face-to-face interviews, along with four walk-in applicants, resulting in four individuals being "Hired-On-The-Spot" (HOTS).

2. Sta. Clara International, Inc.

On November 26, 40 out of 166 pre-registered applicants participated in face-to-face interviews with Sta. Clara International, where four more applicants were also hired on the spot.

### III. COMMUNITY-BASED TRAINING (CBT) PROGRAM

Launching of the CBT Program in the various LGUs in the Province of Isabela

The Provincial Government of Isabela (PGI), through the Provincial Public Employment Service Office (PESO), in partnership with the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), launched Community-Based Training Programs in the different municipalities in Isabela to provide Isabeleños with skills necessary for income generation and employment, to wit:

# 4-Day Intensive Skills Training on Rattan Basket Weaving

The Provincial Government of Isabela, through the Environment and Natural Resources Office (ENRO), in partnership with local agencies, kicked off a 4-Day Intensive Skills Training on Rattan Basket Weaving on November 26, 2024, at the Isabela Rattan Processing Shared Service Facility (IRPSSF) in Cabisera 10, City of llagan, Isabela.

The training aims to equip participants with sustainable livelihood skills to help them generate income, while also promoting environmental and cultural preservation. Some of the participants had also participated in PESO's previous TESDA carpentry and dressmaking training programs.

The Provincial Public Employment Service Office (PPESO) sent Jonas A. Hapinat, Administrative Assistant I, as the representative of Cecilia Claire N. Reyes, PESO Manager of Isabela, during the event. Hapinat shared with the participants the importance of enhancing their skills and believing in their own talents.

# IV. CAREER DEVELOPMENT SUPPORT PROGRAM (CDSP)

### Career Guidance Advocates' Symposium

The Provincial Government of Isabela (PGI) through the Provincial Public Employment Service Office (PPES0) in partnership with DepEd - Schools Division Office (SDO) Isabela and Isabela State University (ISU) Ilagan- Psychology Department, facilitated the Career Guidance Advocates' Symposium, an initiative under the Career Development Support Program (CDSP), last November 13, 2024 at the Amphitheatre, Capitol Building, Alibagu, City of Ilagan Isabela.

This aims to train and allow the advocates to be more perceptive and receptive to the learners' needs in terms of career guidance, use tools such as the John Holland's Theory of Career Choice to help learners determine their career interests, accomplish a Career Guidance Advocacy Plan, and provide students with an understanding of the job market, in-demand skills, and qualifications needed to succeed in their careers.

## **Preparation Proper:**

 Prior to the Career Guidance Advocates' Symposium, a meeting was conducted at the PPESO office, participated by the concerned agencies including PPESO, ISU Ilagan- Psychology Department, and DepEd - Schools Division Office (SDO) Isabela to identify speakers and topics relevant to the advocates.  PPESO also conducted Needs Assessment Survey for the School Heads and Career Guidance Advocates/Counselors to determine the challenges they faced and how to possibly address the issues.

# **Event Proper:**

- The event started at 8:30 a.m. The participants, consisting of Career Guidance Advocates and PESO Managers, participated in the registration, where they received training kits containing writing materials, worksheets, and other resources.
- Cecilia Claire N. Reyes, Provincial PESO Manager, welcomed the participants with a speech, emphasizing the need to train advocates in career counseling. She was followed by Jesus D. Antonio, Chief Education Supervisor (SGOD) of DepEd-SDO Isabela, who, in his inspirational message, highlighted the role of advocates in helping students achieve their dreams.
- Froctoso C. Agustin, Provincial Director of the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), also delivered an inspirational message, emphasizing indemand jobs related to the digital age.
- The symposium consisted of six sessions led by six speakers. Questions from the participants were entertained after each session:
- The first session, titled "John Holland's Theory of Career Choice," was discussed by Ana Riza P. Maguigad, Registered Guidance Counselor at Tumauini Stand Alone High School. The session highlighted the varied interests of students and the importance of using proper assessment tools to guide students in choosing careers based on their interests.
- The second session, titled "Labor Market Information," was discussed by Cecilia Claire N. Reyes, PPESO Manager. She discussed the need for students to acquire skills aligned with labor market demands and shared information on the most indemand jobs in the country and abroad.
- The third session, titled "Parents' Psychoeducation on Career Choice," was discussed by Dominick B. Agoot, Chairperson of the Bachelor of Science in Psychology Program at ISU Ilagan. He explained various theories on child development and how parents can support their children without compromising their career interests.
- The fourth session, titled "Curriculum Exit Tracking System," was discussed by Jamie Cloudine A. Tubiera, Registered Guidance Counselor at San Agustin National High School. She addressed the importance of administering the Curriculum Exit Tracking Survey to students to determine what they learned in school, challenges encountered, and their planned curriculum exit, whether through college, employment, business, or TESDA courses.
- The fifth session, titled "Career Guidance Learning Activity Plan," was discussed by Kathleen Mae A. Haban, Registered Guidance Counselor at Quezon National High School. She outlined effective methods for writing plans that include activities, exercises, and discussions to help participants better understand their interests, strengths, and career paths.
- The sixth session, titled "Results of the Needs Assessment from School Heads and its Analysis," was discussed by Dr. Kathreen C. Joson, Head of the Guidance and Counseling Center and Associate Professor V at ISU Ilagan. She presented the results of the needs assessment survey completed by advocates and school heads prior to the symposium.
- The participants asked if what assistance the PPESO could provide to the Career Guidance Advocates. PPESO Manager Cecilia Claire N. Reyes responded that

- training programs would be implemented to support the advocates in gaining the proper skills and competencies necessary for providing guidance to students.
- The closing remarks was delivered by Manalo Bagunu, SDO Isabela Education Program Supervisor (EPS). The symposium ended at 3:30 p.m. The participants also submitted the evaluation and satisfaction surveys, which will be used to improve future activities.

### V. SEMINARS/TRAININGS ATTENDED

### Values Development Program

The Provincial Government of Isabela (PGI) through its Provincial Human Resource Management Office (PHRMO) and Provincial Administrator's Office, in partnership with the Civil Service Commission (CSC) Isabela, hosted a 2-day Values Development Seminar for the newly hired employees of PGI last November 19-20 at the Amphitheater, Capitol Bldg., Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Isabela.

The seminar aims to empower the employees to apply the core values of being a public servant and strengthen their skills and commitment to shaping a culture of values-driven public service in order to serve the Isabeleños with honesty, integrity, and excellence.

Five staff of the Provincial Public Employment Service Office (PPESO) participated in the seminar namely: Cynthia B. Cacabelos, Giovanni C. Lumabao, Carmina P. Mamuri, Kaili Kim G. Soriano, and Jonas A. Hapinat.

The first day of the seminar featured a session by CSC Isabela Field Office Acting Director II, Valnizan HC. Calubaquib, who expounded on the norms of conduct for public officials and employees under Republic Act 6713, or the Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards for Public Officials and Employees. On the second day of the seminar, Provincial Administrator Atty. Noel Manuel R. Lopez lectured on the five

core values of public servants: Pagka-Makatao (Humanitarianism), Pagka-Makakalikasan (Environmental Stewardship), Pagka-Makabayan (Patriotism), Pagka-Makatagapaglingkod (Service Orientation), and Pagka-MakaDiyos (Godliness).

The seminar concluded with the Question-and-Answer Forum and training impression of the participants. The five PESO employees also received their certificates of participation in the 2-day seminar.
