# <u>Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) Walang Gutom</u> <u>Programs</u>

The Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) brought its Walang Gutom programs to the Province of Isabela on March 27, 2025. The event, held in partnership with the Provincial Government of Isabela and the Local Government Unit of Alicia, was hosted at the Alicia Community Center.

The Kusinero Cook-Off Challenge was conducted as part of the Walang Gutom Program, aiming to alleviate hunger by teaching participants to prepare affordable, nutritious meals with ingredients from the program's food redemption initiative. Undersecretary Edu Punay of the DSWD's Innovations and Program Development Group, who delivered the message of DSWD Secretary Rex Gatchalian, emphasized the importance of the Kusinero Challenge as a social and behavioral change initiative that promotes sustainable and nutritious eating habits among Walang Gutom beneficiaries.

A Walang Gutom Productivity Fair was also conducted to provide beneficiaries with job opportunities, skills training, and access to essential government services. The program also featured the official launching of Pamilya sa Bagong Pilipinas, a new rightsbased, family-oriented, and inclusive development model which supports Filipino families across different life stages. As part of this, the "Tahanan Hub: Physical and Digital One-Stop Shop" was also launched, providing beneficiaries with access to government programs such as a social registry, protective services, e-learning, parenting webinars, and virtual counseling.

Cecilia Claire N. Reyes, Public Employment Service Office (PESO) Isabela Manager, delivered Gov. Rodito T. Albano's welcome speech, expressing support for the program and highlighting the province's Rice Assistance Program, benefiting 118,841 marginalized individuals and barangay frontline workers.

The Walang Gutom Program, aligned with the Marcos administration's commitment to family resilience, aims to support 750,000 food-poor families by 2027 through integrated economic, social, and cultural support.
