III. NETWORKING WITH STAKEHOLDERS

<u>Overseas Workers Welfare Administration Information Caravan on</u> <u>Reintegration cum Entrepreneurial Development Training</u>

The Overseas Workers Welfare Administration (OWWA) Region 2 organized an Information Caravan on Reintegration cum Enterprise Development Training (EDT) for Balik Pinas, Balik Hanapbuhay applicants in the Province of Isabela on May 9, 2025 held at the VIP Room, Food Court of the Provincial Capitol, Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Isabela.

Cecilia Claire N. Reyes, Provincial PESO Manager, representing Hon. Rodolfo T. Albano III, Provincial Governor, joined the event and delivered her welcome message to the participants.

She also discussed Labor Market Information (LMI), which included in-demand jobs, trends in the labor market, the supply and demand for labor and skills, job vacancies, emerging and in-demand occupations, as well as future employment scenarios and projections.

She further highlighted the Governor's thrust of investing in the people.



• Department of Migrant Workers LIKHAng Kababaihan Online Deliberation

The Department of Migrant Workers Regional Office 02 conducted the LIKHAng Kababaihan: Business Plan Competition for select Overseas Filipino Workers (OFWs) in the Province of Isabela on May 16, 2025, at the Blue Room, Provincial Capitol, Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Isabela.

The DMW sought the support of the Provincial Government of Isabela, through the Provincial Public Employment Service Office (PPESO), for a room-type venue with a stable internet connection where the OFW nominees could participate and present their business plans online.

The platform aims to showcase the entrepreneurial and business ideas of returning OFWs and to select the region's representative for the upcoming national Business Plan Competition

Four participants were interviewed online by a panel of members, where they presented their business plans along with estimated financial projections.



• <u>Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) Special</u> <u>Training for Employment Program (STEP) for Persons Deprived of Liberty</u> (PDLS)

Fifty-one persons deprived of liberty (PDLs) at the Isabela Provincial Jail completed the Special Training for Employment Program (STEP) of the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA) on May 13, 2025.

The graduation ceremony and distribution of toolkits were conducted by TESDA and the Provincial Government of Isabela through its Public Employment Service Office (PESO) and the Isabela Provincial Jail.

Of the 51 graduates, 35 completed the Carpentry program and passed the National Certificate II (NC II) assessment, while 16 finished the Shielded Metal Arc Welding (SMAW) training program.

Present during the ceremony were TESDA Provincial Director Vilma Cabrera; TESDA Supervising Specialist and UTPRAS Focal Ma. Elena Narcisso; PESO Isabela Manager Cecilia Claire Reyes; and Assistant Provincial Warden Arnulfo Sabio.



IV. SEMINARS/ TRAININGS CONDUCTED

The Provincial Government of Isabela (PGI), through the Provincial Public Employment Service Office (PPESO), in partnership with the Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT), hosted a four-day series of free webinars for Isabeleños from May 27 to 30, 2025, from 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM, via Google Meet. The activity was spearheaded by Ms. Cecilia Claire N. Reyes, Provincial PESO Manager, and Mr. Cirilo N. Gazzingan, DICT Isabela Provincial Officer.

The said webinars aimed to equip Isabeleños with essential knowledge and skills in various technology-related fields, enabling them to thrive in both personal and professional digital careers.

Day 1. Introduction to Modern Al

Date: May 27, 2025 Resource Speaker: Mr. Deejay Anapi

Summary:

The first webinar was attended by 66 participants. It provided a foundational introduction to modern Artificial Intelligence (AI), covering its history and current capabilities. The speaker demonstrated various AI tools and gave participants the opportunity to explore how AI works through hands-on activities. Platforms used included Teachable Machine, Google Lens, ChatHub, and ChatGPT.

Day 2: Mindful Art in Pixels: A Creative Journey with Canva

Date: May 28, 2025 Resource Speaker: Ms. Maria Kristine Valdez

Summary:

The second webinar was attended by 58 participants. It focused on digital creativity and mindfulness through design using Canva. Participants were introduced to the interface and features of Canva, including:

- Creating Interactive Map, presentation and posters
- Using templates and custom graphic designs
- Exploring Canva Pro: Background Remover, Grabtext, Generate background, Video background remover, Magic translate, Magic Morph, Al Voice, and Al presenter.

Day 3: Leveraging AI and ChatGPT to Enhance Work Efficiency

Summary:

The third webinar was attended by 54 participants. It discussed the practical applications of AI tools, particularly ChatGPT, to boost productivity and streamline workflows. It focused on:

Provincial Committee on Anti-Red Tape (P-CART) convened the Ease of Doing Business (EODB) focal persons of the province for a briefing on May 26, 2025, at the Balai Building, Capitol Compound, Alibagu, City of Ilagan, Isabela.

The briefing aimed to orient the focal persons on the guidelines and requirements under Republic Act No. 11032, also known as the Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery Act of 2018, as well as the proper compliance with and submission of the Client Satisfaction Survey form.

Ms. Cynthia B. Cacabelos, PPESO EODB Focal Person, attended the briefing to gain practical knowledge about the law and adopt the practice in the office.

Ms. Ma. Gloria L. Daluddung, P-CART Focal Person from the Provincial Economic Development and Investment Promotion Office (PEDIPO), discussed the provisions of RA 11032, while Ms. Janette A. Castillejo, Provincial Human Resource Management Officer (PHRMO), explained the importance of Client Satisfaction Measurement.

Castillejo emphasized that timely service delivery reflects the provincial government's commitment to good governance.
