III. COMMUNITY-BASED TRAINING (CBT) PROGRAM

 Community-Based Training (CBT) Orientations in the various LGUs in the Province of Isabela

The Provincial Government of Isabela (PGI), through the Provincial Public Employment Service Office (PESO), in partnership with the Technical Education and Skills Development Authority (TESDA), conducted the programmes for the Community-Based Trainings in the different municipalities in Isabela to provide Isabeleños with skills necessary for income generation and employment, to wit:

The municipalities, through their respective Municipal PESOs, identified training courses and qualifications based on the specific needs of their localities.

A total of 25 trainees from each municipality participated in the orientation session. Cecilia Claire N. Reyes, PPESO Manager, addressed the trainees, emphasizing that the goal of the training is to equip them with skills that will enable them to earn a livelihood and sustain their needs.

During the session, representatives from the Isabela School of Arts and Trades (ISAT) provided an overview of the training programs:

- Hairdressing Training: Kriszza Munsayac, Hairdressing trainee from ISAT, introduced the participants in Burgos and Ramon, Isabela, to the scope of the training. She explained that the course covers three fundamental hairdressing skills: basic haircutting, basic hair coloring, and hair care and scalp treatment.
- Basic House Wiring Training: Engr. Christian Cardenas, Basic House Wiring trainee from ISAT, discussed the training program with participants in Echague, Isabela. He outlined key topics, including the use of a tester, basic house troubleshooting, and the installation of both standard and special switches.
- Coffee and Beverage Preparation Training: Femia Calacsan, Coffee and Beverage trainee from ISAT, presented the details of the training to participants in San Mateo, Isabela. She covered essential skills such as preparing espresso, texturing milk, and making and serving coffee beverages.
