

Health for all by 2020 through UNIVERSAL HEALTH CARE(UHC)

Date: January 28-29, 2019 Venue: Xenia Hotel, Clark Pampanga

The UHC act seeks to address health system fragmentation and reorient the system towards primary health care, primarily through **network-based contracting of health care providers** and reorganization of the public health system into province and city-wide systems. It further lays down the roles and reform tools of key government agencies. The Department of Health , as steward of health sector, is directed to finance population-based services, provide technical assistance and matching grants to local health systems, and institute a regulatory framework for primary care facilities.

The highlight of this activity is the conceptualization of the design of the Service Delivery Networks as prescribed by the latest version of the UHC Bill; and, training of participants to conduct a "self-diagnosis" of the chosen demo sites (as submitted by the CHD directors to FICT). It is also important to note that while the UHC Act proposed changes in the governance of local health systems, it continues to uphold devolution of health services, albeit at a level more proximal to central government. As such, the provincial and city health systems play the lead role while DOH and PHIC play the supporting but catalytic role.

Service Delivery Network, as defined by the Department of Health, refers to the network of health facilities and providers within the province- or city-wide health system, offering core packages of health care services in an integrated and coordinated manner. It is one of the four (4) Strategic Thrusts to attain the government's vision for "Health for all by 2020" through a transition approach from Race Car to the High-Speed Train of FouMula 1 (Governance, Service Delivery, Financing and Regulation) Plus for Health and Performance Accountability. It is also one of the salient features embodied in the Universal Health Care (UHC)Bill which is currently in the pipeline of the Duterte Administration to uplift the health status of every Filipino family.

In the Province of Isabela, health workers from different local government units composed of municipal health officers, public health nurses, chiefs of hospitals from public and private hospitals, public health workers, DOH personnel and consultant from World Health Organization convened to work and discuss relevant issues on the establishment of Service Delivery Network (SDN).

With "Better Health for all Isabelenos" as the guiding light, SDN is expected to soar high and shall reach greater heights to make every Isabeleno family achieve optimal health and thereby contributing to a more progressive Isabela!
