Orientation on Mandatory TB Notification

A virtual orientation on Republic Act 11332 or the Mandatory Reporting of Notifiable Diseases and Health Events of Public Health Concern Act. The activity was conducted by the CVCHD through the National Tuberculosis Prevention and Control Program for both Government and Private Physicians managing TB cases. Participants were as follows:

- Provincial NTP Coordinators
- City/Municipal NTP Coordinators
- Provincial/Rural/City TB Mandatory Notification Officers
- > TB DOTS Providing Facilities
- Provincial DOH Officers and DMOs

Testing (PICT) and HIV Screening that is offered to TB patients since HIV screening is not mandatory;

- No allotted supply of INH (Isoniazid) as Tuberculosis Preventive Treatment (TPT) for children from the central office;
- Some X-Ray providers refused to accommodate patients despite the existence of signed agreements due to unsettled accounts from the previous year amounting to P448, 800.00
- NTP Coordinators are assigned in quarantine facilities compromising the delivery of NTP services.

Concerns raised were as follows:

- Both government and private facilities that are providing part or all TB services such as diagnosis, treatment and prevention shall accomplish a Service Provider Information Sheet and submit to Knowledge Management and Information Technology Service (KMITS) through channels;
- Every case of TB, whether bacteriologically confirmed or clinically diagnosed shall be reported to DOH;
- The registered health care provider and/or designated facility encoder shall notify all diagnosed and/or treated TB cases by the end of each month using a TB case
