

In addition, ensuring the prioritization of decking and admission among COVID-19 confirmed, suspect, and probable cases. <p><u>Non-Communicable Diseases Cluster</u></p> <p>National Immunization Program</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Conduct of COVID-19 Mass Vaccination (<i>Isabela Evacuation Center, October 5-7, 2021</i>)</li> <li>• Augmentation of personnel for the COVID-19 vaccination roll-out (<i>Delfin Albano, October 11-22, 2021</i>)</li> </ul>	<p>A 3-day mass vaccination which aims to increase the total number of Isabeleños inoculated with COVID-19 vaccines. Primary clients of the activity include employees of the Provincial Government of Isabela whom waited months before being fully vaccinated.</p> <p>As a response to the surge of COVID-19 cases in the municipality of Delfin Albano for the past few weeks, IPHO’s members of vaccination team was sent to be augmented for the continuity of the hampered COVID-19 vaccination roll-out.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• IPHO’s vaccination team devised a 3-day vaccination plan with adherence to standard health protocols required by the IATF against COVID-19. The mass immunization of COVID-19 vaccines through the birth of the RESBAKUNA on Wheels was an innovation in vaccination which aims to deliver the services among our adult and pediatric populations nearer to their homes. Furthermore, this innovation also speaks as the province’s response for having recorded an alarming 4,995 active cases for the months of August, September, and October specifically.</p>	<p>whole duration of the augmentation.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A cumulative total of <b>2,094</b> individuals were vaccinated during the whole duration of the augmentation.</li> <li>• The <i>RESBAKUNA on Wheels</i> was manned by the members of the vaccination team from the Integrated Provincial Health Office – Field Health Services.</li> <li>• IPHO formulated vaccination teams whom rendered daily immunization in the whole province.
