The activity was conducted at IPHO-FHS ground and was supervised by PHOs and NIP coordinators.</p> <p>The Province of Isabela along its "Isabela BIDA, Handa sa Bakuna" campaign has recently kick started the Bakuna on Wheels. This aims to deliver the services among eligible Isabeleños nearer to their homes. This also includes government offices and institutions who could hardly reach their designated vaccination sites due to geographic challenges, epidemic risk, stricter health protocols, and surge of COVID-19 cases.</p> <p>As a way to recognize our Barangay Nutrition Scholars as local nutrition workers, the National Nutrition Commission provided Identification Cards that can be used for transacting business with various government agencies and other institutions.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> IPHO's vaccination team inoculated 630 individuals of their 1st dose of COVID-19 vaccine. The <i>Bakuna on Wheels</i> was manned by the members of the vaccination team from the Integrated Provincial Health Office. 



Pursuant to Administrative Order No. 2014-0005 otherwise known as the Revised Policies and Guidelines on the Collaborative Approach of TB and HIV Prevention Control stipulates the provision of Provider-Initiated Counseling and Testing (PICT) among registered TB patients which shall be implemented in TB DOTS and all Programmatic Management of Drug Resistant Tuberculosis (PMDT) treatment facilities.

As a result of the TB-HIV collaboration, IPHO's NTP Coordinator attended the 5-day face-to-face training with the following outcome:

- Discussion of the basic information about HIV, HIV prevention, treatment, and care initiatives
- Responded to common ethical challenges in HIV counseling;
- Demonstrated step-by-step Pre and Post-HIV test counseling;
- Facilitated client disclosure of HIV status to partner(s) and family
- Discussed the national TB and HIV policies and guidelines, RA 11166 "Philippine HIV and AIDS Policy Act" and proper

		HIV referral mechanism.

Discussed the HIV policies and guidelines under the RA 11166, the Philippine HIV and AIDS Policy Act. Developed effective skills used for counselling, evidence-based strategies, appropriate attitude and values consideration for providing HIV counselling and testing to TB patients.
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
