Report on Monitoring of Temporary Treatment and Monitoring Facilities for the Month of July 2022

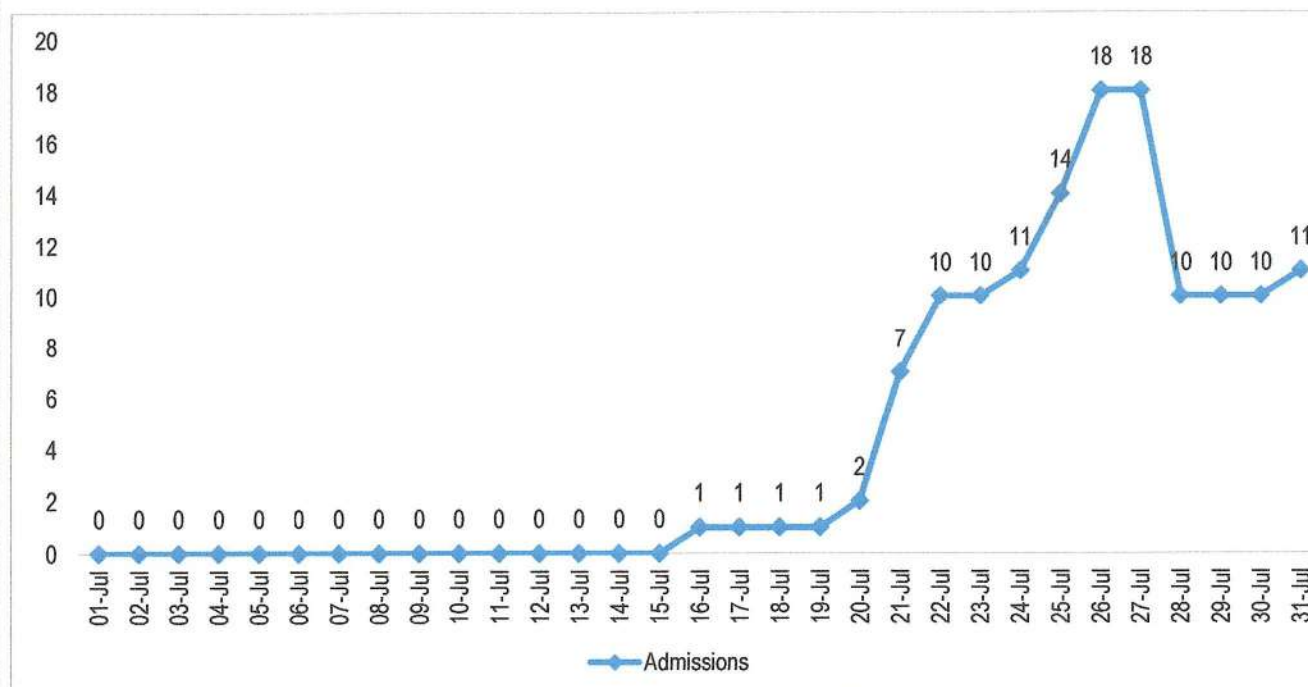


Figure 2. Admissions in the different TTMF in the municipalities of Isabela in July 2022

Unlike previous months, the month of July recorded admissions in the LGU Temporary Treatment and Monitoring Facilities in various municipalities in the province congruent with the rising active COVID cases in the locality. This started with one (1) admission in July 16 which continued to increase until 18 admissions on July 27 and eventually decreased to 10-11 admissions in recent days. Despite the sudden use of LGU TTMFs, most COVID related cases reported this month were still isolated or quarantined at home or in the hospitals.

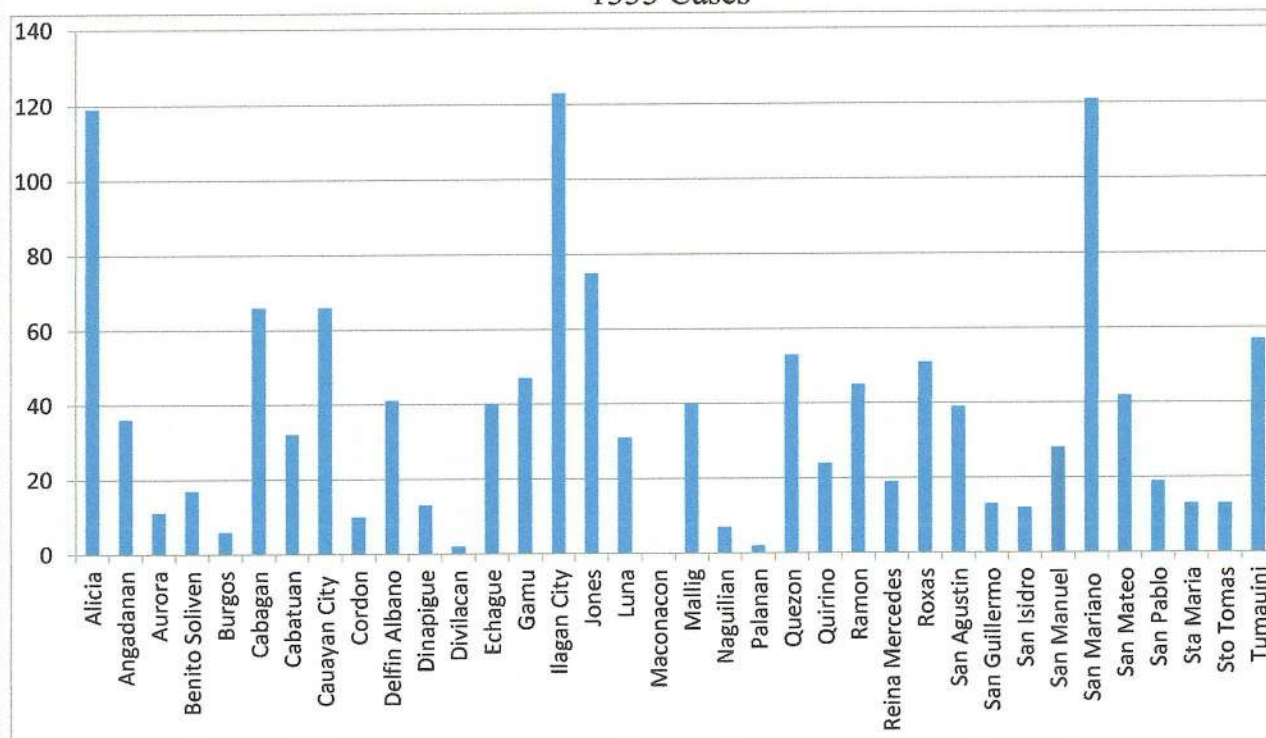


Figure 4. Number of reported suspected dengue cases per municipality/city
