Monitoring of Temporary Treatment and Monitoring Facilities (TTMFs) and Health Facility Capacity Report (HFCR)

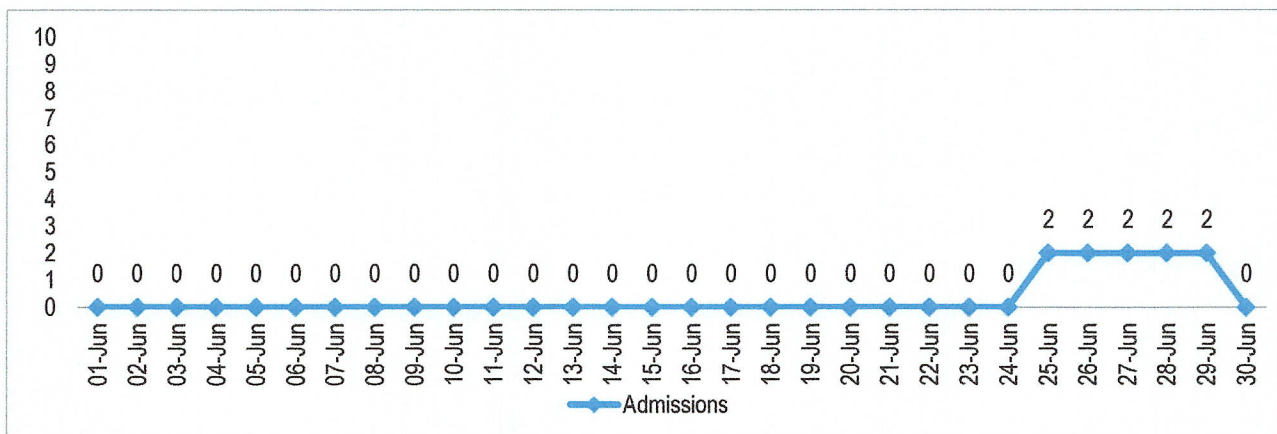


Figure 2. Admissions in the different TTMF in the municipalities of Isabela in June 2022

National Tuberculosis Program

Conduct of TB Mass Screening cum Free Voluntary HIV Screening (TB-HIV) Caravan

In support to AO no. 2008-0022 or the Policies and Guidelines in the Collaborative Approach of TB and HIV Prevention and Control which aims to identify Presumptive TB cases through Chest X-ray and are encouraged to undergo HIV counselling and screening.

The following facilities were visited by NTP and STI-HIV/AIDS Provincial Program Coordinators during the conduct of the TB-HIV Caravan:

June 15 - Isabela Provincial Jail

- 12 out of 279 clients (PDLs) with xray findings; sputum specimen were collected for Gene Xpert
- 42 PDLs counselled and screened, 32 PDLs counselled only

June 21 – CHO Ilagan I

- 15 TB patients counselled and screened for HIV

June 22 – RHU Cordon

- 44 out of 179 clients with xray findings; sputum specimen were collected for Gene Xpert
- 15 TB patients counselled and screened for HIV; 25 presumptive TB patients counselled and screened for HIV

June 23 – RHU Ramon

- 20 out of 137 clients with xray findings; sputum specimen were collected for Gene Xpert
- 8 presumptive TB patients counselled and screened for HIV

June 24 – RHU Luna

- 201 clients awaiting official chest Xray results
- 9 TB patients counselled and screened for HIV

Program Monitoring at RHU San Manuel, and RHU Ramon (June 7, 2022)

An on-site monitoring and assessment together with Senior Health Program Officer from CVCHD to assess the capacity of RHUs of becoming a Social Hygiene Clinic.

Based on the Social Hygiene Clinic Monitoring Tool, the following indicators were highlighted:

- Lack of trainings for Medical Technologists (HIV Proficiency) and Nurses (HIV Counselling and Testing);
- RHU Ramon needs to set up an enclosed counselling and examination rooms;
- There is a spacious waiting area, blood collection area, laboratory, and separate records section for screened patients, supplies and commodities were properly stored.
- Both RHUs were recommended and can become a Social Hygiene Clinic after complying and completing the needed technical requirements especially the required trainings.

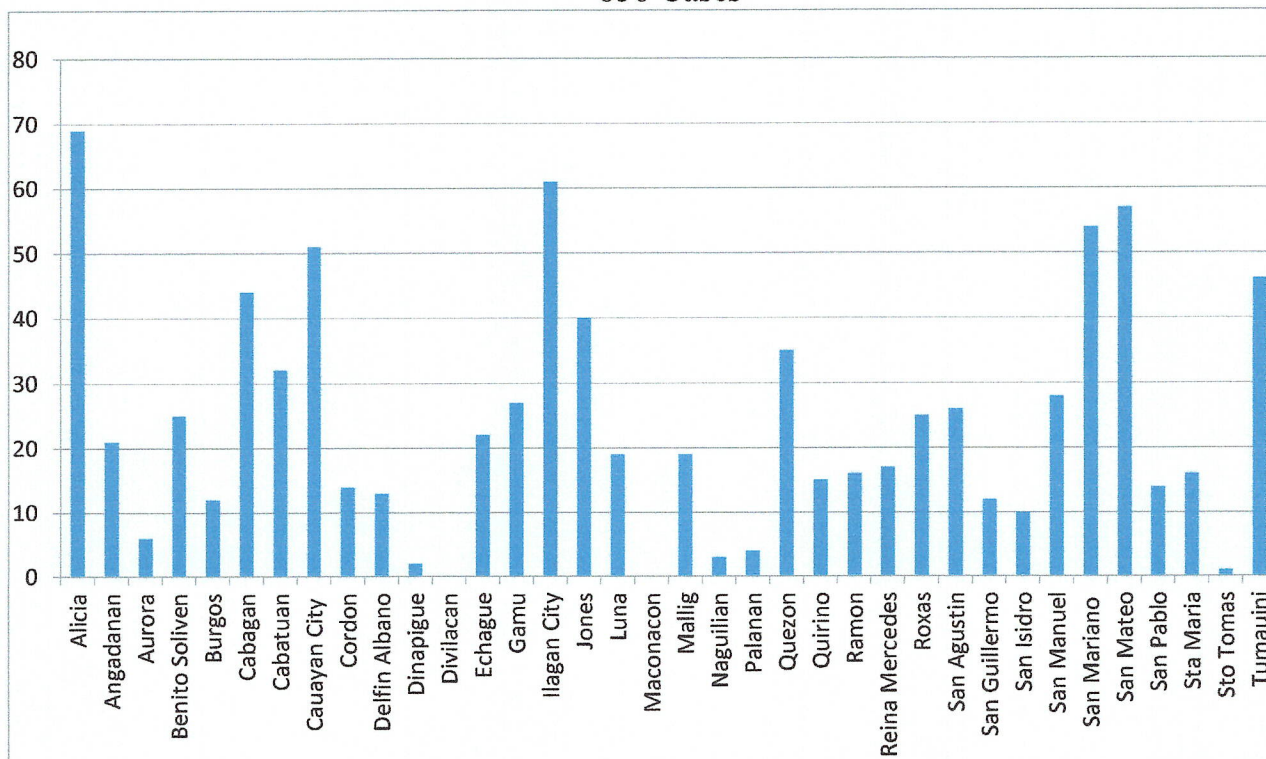


Figure 4. Source: Philippine Integrated Disease Surveillance and Response (PIDS)




