Report on Monitoring of Temporary Treatment and Monitoring Facilities (TTMF) for the Month of November 2022




Figure 1. Admissions in the different TTMF in the municipalities of Isabela in November 2022

Admissions in City / Municipal Local Government Units' TTMFs were only ranging from 0-7 COVID-related patients for the month. The few number of admissions is consistent with the low cases of COVID-19 reported in the province. Most admitted cases were confirmed cases, followed by suspect cases and then few probable cases. Aside from TTMF admissions, most COVID related cases reported this month were still isolated or quarantined at home or in the hospitals. Dengue Suspect Cases as of November 2022




Figure 2. Number of reported suspected dengue cases per municipality/city.
