### Temporary Treatment and Monitoring Facilities (TTMF): October 2022

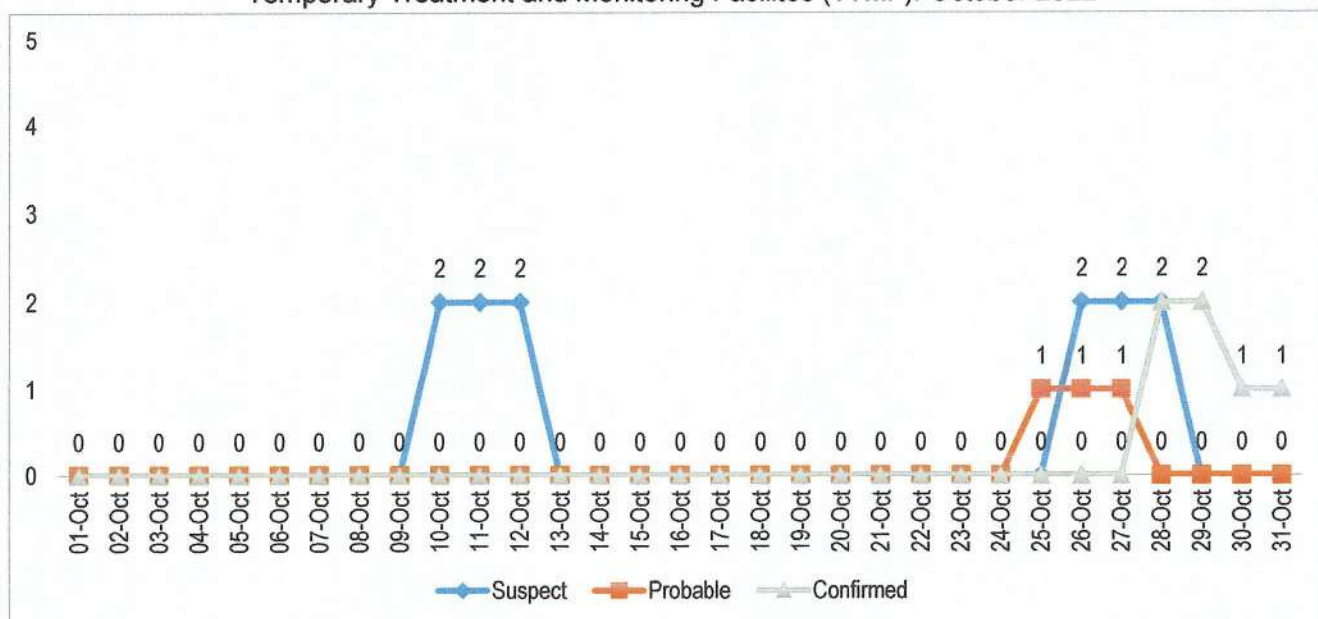


Figure 2. Admissions in the different TTMF in the municipalities of Isabela in October 2022



Admissions in City / Municipal Local Government Units' TTMs were only ranging from 0-2 COVID-related patients for the month. The few number of admissions is consistent with the low cases of COVID-19 reported in the province. Most admitted cases were suspect cases, with few confirmed and probable cases as well. Aside from TTMF admissions, most COVID related cases reported this month were still isolated or quarantined at home or in the hospitals. 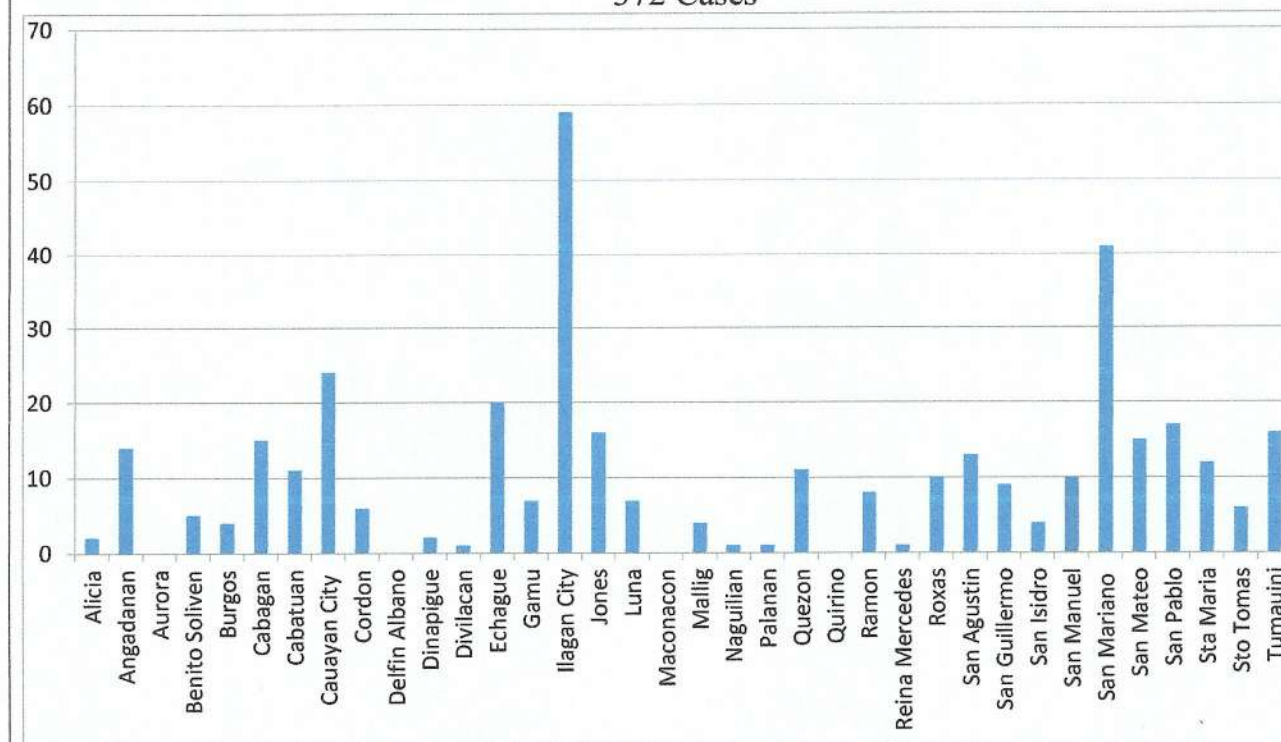


Figure 2. Number of reported suspected dengue cases per municipality/city.

Top Ten (10) Cities/Municipalities with most number of cases in the province namely, **City of Ilagan – 183, San Mariano – 151, Alicia – 81, Cauayan City – 65, Jones-50, Cabagan – 40, Tumauni – 38, Echague – 36, Quezon – 34, Ramon - 33**. Consistently, the coastal municipalities of Divilacan and Maconacon remain to record zero (0) suspected cases of dengue.

Conduct of Initial Investigation on Suspected Rabies Death at San Guillermo, Isabela (*October 13, 2022*)





IPHO's PESU and Rabies Program Coordinator conducted an investigation together with staff from the RHU. As a response to the event, RHU personnel enlisted forty-three (43) close contacts of the case.
