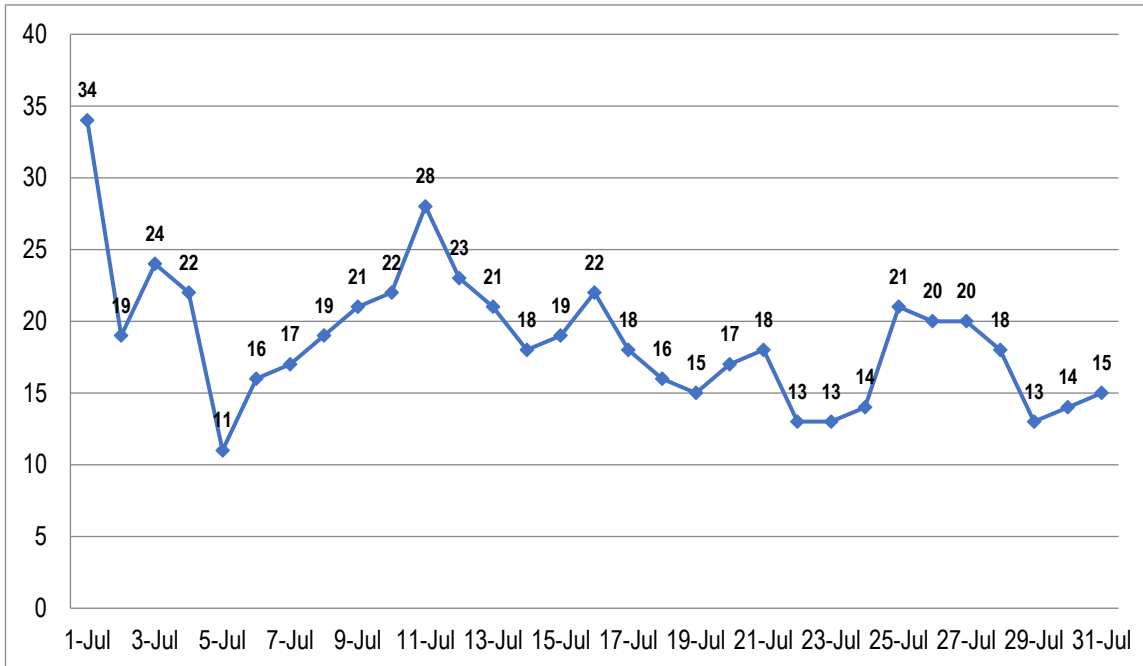


Figure 1. Trend of the total daily COVID 19-related admissions in the seven (7) PGI hospitals for the month of July 2023
